11. SENATOR NEGA:

12. Mr. President, I move that the reading and approval of the

19. Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. So ordered.

24. For what purpose does Senator Donnewald arise?

25. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

26. Yes, Mr. President, to re-refer some bills and ask that...
27. well first, let's go with the sponsorship of House Bill 348,
28. which is presently held by Senator Netsch...Oh, I see...
29. Senator Merlo...and the sponsorship should be changed to
30. Senator Nedza. Do we have Leave?

31. PRESIDENT:

32. Is Leave granted? So ordered. Senator Donnewald.

33. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

As to House Bill 2652, presently held by Senator Nash, to

1. Senator Edward Nedza. Do we have Leave?

2. PRESIDENT:

3. You've heard the request. Is leave granted? Leave
4. is granted. So ordered.

5. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

6. Now as to certain bills, House Bill 662, which reposes
7. in Elementary Education, that should be re-referred to Local
8. Government. As to House Bill 2098, in Approp I, should be
9. in Appropriations II. 1925, from Appropriations II to
10. Appropriations I. House Bill 2579, from Appropriations II
11. to Appropriations I. House Bill 2769, from Executive to
12. Appropriations I. House Bill 1100, from Executive Appointments
13. to Executive.

14. PRESIDENT:

15. All right. You've heard the motions to re-refer. Is
16. leave granted? Leave is granted. It is so ordered. Messages
17. from the House.

18. SECRETARY:

19. A Message from the House by Mr. O'Brien, Clerk.

20. Mr. President- I am directed to inform the Senate that
21. the House of Representatives concurred with the Senate in the
22. passage of the bill with the following title: Senate Bill
23. 668, together with House Amendment No. 1.

24. PRESIDENT:

25. Secretary's Desk. Resolutions.

27. Senate Resolution 55, offered by Senator Donnewald.

29. PRESIDENT:

30. Senator Donnewald.

31. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

32. Yes, Mr. President. Pursuant to that...I move that we
33. adopt the House...Senate Joint Resolution.

PRESIDENT:

1. Yes, this is the Adjournment Resolution, which calls
2. for us, after we leave today, to return on Tuesday, at the
3. hour of noon. Senator Donnewald moves for the suspension
4. of the Rules for the immediate consideration and adoption
5. of this resolution. All in favor signify by saying Aye.
6. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The Rules are suspended.

14. PRESIDENT:

15. Executive. Senator Donnewald, for what purpose do you
16. rise?

17. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

18. Well, I did forget one bill. House Bill 882, which is
19. in Executive. I would ask leave to re-refer that to the
20. Committee on Elections.

21. PRESIDENT:

22. You've heard the motion to re-refer. Is Leave granted?
23. Leave is granted. It is so ordered. Senator Kenneth Hall.

25. Thank you, Mr. President. I'd like to make an announcement,

28. PRESIDENT:

29. If I can have the attention of the membership, there
30. are still remaining on the Order of House Bills, 1st,
31. approximately thirty bills. I would suggest to the proposed
32. Senate sponsor that they make an effort to pick those up, and
33. would call the attention of the Body to the fact that on the
House Calendar, there are a number of bills, Senate Bills, 1st

1. reading. It is the intention of the House that if they're
2. not picked up today, those bills are dead, so I would suggest
3. that anyone who has a Senate Bill on 1st reading in the House,
4. make the proper arrangements to get a sponsor. Senator
5. Nash, for what purpose do you rise?

6. SENATOR NASH:

7. Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. The
8. Committee on Insurance, the meeting has been changed from
9. 10:00 o'clock Tuesday to 3:00 P.M. Tuesday afternoon in Room
10. A-1.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. All right. With leave of the Body, we will go to the
13. Order of Messages from the House. Messages from the House.

14. ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

15. A Message from the House by Mr. O'Brien, Clerk.

16. Mr. President- I am directed to inform the Senate that
17. the House of Representatives has concurred with the Senate
18. in the passage of a bill with the following title: Senate
19. Bill 1266, together with the following amendment in the
20. adoption of which I'm instructed to ask concurrence of the
21. Senate to-wit: House Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 1266.

22. PRESIDENT:

23. Senator Mitchler.

24. SENATOR MITCHLER:

25. Mr. President, members of the Senate. The House placed
26. an amendment on Senate Bill 1266. It is a supplemental
27. appropriation to the Department of Public Health for their
28. FY-79 budget. The House amendment was placed on the bill to
29. provide two hundred thousand dollars to complete a computer
30. system that would provide financial information to women and
31. infant care programs. The House amendment was technically
32. incorrect. Instead of going to the Conference Committee,
33. Senate Bill 769, with a new amendment, was attached as an

1. amendment to Senate Bill 1266. I would ask...the amendment
2. actually adds, in General Revenue, one hundred twenty-seven
3. thousand six hundred dollars; Federal funds', three million
4. three hundred twenty-eight thousand six hundred dollars.
5. I would at this time make a motion to concur with the House
6. amendment to Senate Bill 1266, House Amendment No. 1.

7. PRESIDENT:

8. Is there any discussion? Senator Carroll.

9. SENATOR CARROLL:

10. Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the
11. Senate. I join Senator Mitchler in moving to concur with
12. House Amendment No. 1. As he explained, the House had, in
13. error, drafted an amendment to another bill dealing with
14. the Department of Public Health, and it was felt that it
15. was faster to move this way than to have a Conference
16. Committee on the other. I would urge that we concur in
17. Amendment No...House Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 1266.

18. PRESIDENT:

19. We are awaiting our million dollar baby, here. It
20. seems a little tempermental this morning.

21. SENATOR CARROLL:

22. Mr. President, since you were such an advocate of it,
23. we'd be happy to wait.

24. PRESIDENT:

25. If there's no further discussion...Senator Mitchler,
26. do you wish to close?

27. SENATOR MITCHLER:

28. I'd ask for a favorable roll call.

29. PRESIDENT:

30. All right. The question is shall the Senate concur on
31. House Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 1266. Those in favor
32. will vote Aye. Those opposed will vote Nay. The voting is
33. open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have

1. all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, the
2. Ayes are 52, the Nays are none. None Voting Present. Senate
3. Bill 1266...Senate does concur on House Amendment No. 1 to
4. Senate Bill 1266, and the bill, having received the required
5. constitutional majority, is declared passed. Senator Philip,
6. for what purpose do you rise?

7. SENATOR PHILIP:

8. Thank you, Mr. President. If we have a few minutes that
9. we're at ease, I'd like to make an announcement on the
10. Softball Game next week, if that's...

11. PRESIDENT:

12. You are in order.

13. SENATOR PHILIP:

14. Yeah, and might remind the membership we do have the
15. House-Senate Annual Softball Game next week on the sixth,
16. and everybody bring your equipment down. We had a practice
17. game this week. I'm happy to report that we beat the
18. Staff eleven to six. Two Double Plays, so it looks like
19. we're in pretty good shape, I hope. So everybody bring
20. their equipment. Please don't forget it. Thank you.

21. PRESIDENT:

22. All right. With leave of the Body, there have been
23. a number of requests by the membership to afford them an
24. opportunity to get to the Secretary's Desk on the Order of
25. Resolutions. With leave of the Body, we'll now move to
26. that Order of Business, page nineteen on the Calendar.
27. Senate Resolution 85, Senator Savickas. Senator Savickas.

28. SENATOR SAVICKAS:

29. Yes, Mr. President, members of the Senate. Senate
30. Resolution 85 asks that the Olympic Games at the...United
31. States Olympic Committee take the necessary measures to
32. have their...International Olympic Committee select a site
33. for the 1980 Summer Olympic Games outside the
Soviet Union, and it was put in because the Soviet Union has

1. failed to indicate whether it would bar certain nations
2. and News Organizations from the Olympic Games scheduled
3. to be held in Moscow, and that the government of the
4. Soviet Union has failed to provide assurances to the
5. World Community that the 1980 Olympic Games
6. will reflect the spirit of brotherhood and true competition
7. which characterizes the high Olympic ideals. I would
8. ask your favorable support for Senate Resolution 85.

9. PRESIDENT:

10. Is there any discussion? Senator Berning.

11. SENATOR BERNING:

12. Thank you, Mr. President. Just one observation. I don't
13. have any question about the objective here. However, it occurs
14. to me that if we, as a Body, are going to attempt to offer
15. direction, implementation of which is going to be very costly,
16. we ought to be prepared to make some kind of contribution,
17. either as the State of Illinois, or as individuals. Whether
18. it's the Soviet Union or Canada or Viet Nam, any nation which
19. undertakes to provide the site and facilities for the Olympic
20. Games, is undertaking a huge expense. You may recall that
21. one of our cities in these United States rescinded its
22. earlier action, here a few years ago, in inviting the Olympic
23. Games, simply because they couldn't finance it. Now if we're
24. going to say to one nation which has agreed to finance the
25. and provide the facilities for the Olympic Games, we don't
26. want you to do it, we have a better idea, then we better
27. start finding the money to implement it, I think.

28. PRESIDENT:

29. Is there any further discussion? Senator Savickas may
30. close.

31. SENATOR SAVICKAS:

32. Well, there's some good arguments on whether a nation
33. that bars certain groups from participating, that's willing to
bar the News Media from coverage of these Games, if we

1. should be concerned that just because they want to finance
2. it and do it at their own...their own way, barring people,
3. I could argue with that. I would just ask that Senate
4. Resolution 85 be voted Do Pass, and ask for a roll call.

5. PRESIDENT:

6. Roll call has been requested. The question is shall
7. Senate Resolution...All right. Senator Savickas moves the
8. adoption of Senate Resolution 85. All in favor signify by
9. saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The resolution
10. is adopted. Senate Resolution 137, Senator Coffey.

11. SENATOR COFFEY:

12. Mr. President and members of the Senate. Senate Resolution
13. 137 has to do with the AM Radio...AM Radio Broadcasting Service
14. throughout our community and the State of Illinois. There
15. are several problems we have at this time. There are a
16. hundred and twenty-eight AM radio stations licensed by the
17. Federal Communications...to service the citizens of the
18. State of Illinois. Of that hundred and twenty-eight AM
19. radio stations, eighty-one of those stations are forced by
20. the FCC Regulations to cease all operations at Sunset daily.
21. Of that eighty-one, sixty-two of those affected stations are
22. located in communities which have no other local AM Broadcasting
23. services at night, and we feel that they should have equal
24. opportunity to have...a broadcast in their communities, and
25. I'd ask for a favorable roll call.

26. PRESIDENT:

27. Is there any discussion? If not...Senator Maragos.

28. SENATOR MARAGOS:

29. What will this do to the Clear Channel Stations? Is
30. there going to be some conflict there, and is the FCC going
31. to be able to solve that problem with the Clear Channel
32. Stations?

33. PRESIDENT:

1. Senator Coffey.

2. SENATOR COFFEY:

3. Well, I'm not sure I have the answer to that question,
4. but all we're asking...for them to investigate this problem
5. and see if they can...if it can be solved, and that's
6. all we're asking them to do. We think that they ought
7. to take a look at this problem now.

8. PRESIDENT:

9. Further discussion. Senator Schaffer.

10. SENATOR SCHAFFER:

11. I just request leave to be added as co-sponsor of
12. this...

13. PRESIDENT:

14. You've heard the request. Is leave granted? Leave is
15. granted. Senator Wooten.

16. SENATOR WOOTEN:

17. Just to answer Senator Maragos, yes, it would eliminate
18. Clear Channel Broadcasting. The Sunrise to Sunset system is
19. to enable us to have a series of Clear Channel Broadcast
20. Stations. The FCC is currently looking over all this matter,
21. but if we eliminated the Sunrise to Sunset Stations, we would
22. also have to eliminate Clear Channel Stations. Just a point
23. of information.

24. PRESIDENT:

25. All right. Any further discussion? Senator Coffey moves
26. the adoption of Senate Resolution 137. All in favor signify
27. by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The resolution
28. is adopted. Senator Knuppel. Senator Johns, on HJR 26. House
29. Joint Resolution 26. Oh, Senator Graham, for what purpose
30. do you rise? All right. HJR...House Joint Resolution 26,
31. Senator Johns.

32. SENATOR JOHNS:

33. Thank you, Mr. President. Mr. President, I'll defer here

1. for a moment.

2. PRESIDENT:

3. Senators Philip, Nedza, Nega, Nash.

4. SENATOR JOHNS:

5. I need your votes later on, so I didn't ask for any
6. movement over here. Mr. President and members of the Senate.
7. House Joint Resolution 26, the subject of which is the
8. new Source Performance Standards for Major Electronic
9. Utility Steam Generating Units. It urges the United States
10. Environmental Protection Agency to consider the impact
11. of its new Source Performance Standards on the future
12. use of Illinois Coal, to meet the energy needs of both
13. the State of Illinois and the nation. It resolves that
14. the United States EPA establish standards which are no more
15. stringent than 1.2 pounds of sulfur dioxide
16. per one million BTU's in order to insure the future production
17. of Illinois coal, which protects the health of the citizens
18. of Illinois, and which do not preclude the use of a significant
19. percentage of the Illinois coal reserves. Now, I would answer
20. any questions. I have some information that's been brought
21. to me within the last...since Saturday, by the United States
22. Environmental Protection Agency, but I still feel this is
23. important that we send this message to them to maintain that
24. 1.2.

24. PRESIDENT:

25. Any further discussion? If not, Senator Johns moves the
26. adoption of House Joint Resolution 26. All in favor signify
27. by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The resolution
28. is adopted. HJR 30, Senator Mitchler. On the Order of
29. Secretary's Desk, Resolutions, House Joint Resolution 30.
30. Senator Mitchler.

31. SENATOR MITCHLER:

32. Mr. President, members of the Senate. House Joint Resolution
33. No. 30 urges Congress to enact legislation to mandate that

1. any school district that receives Federal funds, extend
2. a ten point preference to Disabled American Veterans seeking
3. employment as teachers, and a five point preference to any
4. other veteran. The Point Preference shall also apply to
5. any reduction of staff, granting seniority retention rights
6. to Disabled Veterans and other veterans. I would ask for
7. a favorable roll call.

8. PRESIDENT:

9. Is there any discussion? Senator Mitchler has moved
10. the adoption of House Joint Resolution 30. All in favor
11. signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it.
12. The resolution is adopted. House Joint Resolution 40,
13. Senator Netsch, for what purpose do you rise?

14. SENATOR NETSCH:

15. I would like to be recorded No on that resolution. I
16. did not get recognized in time to point out some problems
17. with it.

18. PRESIDENT:

19. The record will so indicate. House Joint Resolution
20. 40, Senator Bruce.

21. SENATOR BRUCE:

22. Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate.
23. Nolan Blair Seale was Editor of the Mercury Independent in
24. Grayville, Illinois, and was very deeply involved in
25. transportation problems of Southern Illinois for some
26. forty years as Editor of that paper. People got together
27. a resolution and met with DOT, they said it was fine, that
28. they would name a Rest Area outside of Interstate 64. Representatives
29. Brummer and Bower and the other Representatives in the
30. House have passed this over on their Agreed Bill List, and
31. I would ask for favorable consideration of this resolution.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. Is there any discussion? If not, Senator Bruce moves

1. ...the adoption of House Joint Resolution 40. All those
2. in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have
3. it. The resolution is adopted. SJR 29, Senator Johns.
4. SJR...Senate Joint Resolution 33, Senator Graham.

5. SENATOR GRAHAM:

6. Yes, Mr. President, thank you very much. I'd like
7. to do two things when it's convenient. We have a similar
8. resolution to SJR 33. In the Committee on Executive, chaired
9. by Senator Wooten, we've talked to him about discharging
10. that Committee. Maybe we could consider both of these the
11. same time, and fill up the Congressional wastebaskets real
12. good someday.

13. PRESIDENT:

14. You've heard the request. Is leave granted? All right,
15. Senator Graham moves to discharge the Committee on Executive
16. from further consideration of House Joint Resolution 44, and
17. ask that it be immediately considered. Is leave granted?
18. Leave is granted. It is so ordered. On the Order of
19. Secretary's Desk, Resolutions, SJR 33 and HJR 44. Senator
20. Graham.

21. SENATOR GRAHAM:

22. Thank you, Mr. President. These memorialize the President
23. and the Congress to insure Federal reimbursement to the States
24. for costs incurred by...for the implementation of some of their
25. new programs. So I know they'd be happy to get these. I urge
26. their adoption.

27. PRESIDENT:

28. Is there any discussion? All right. Senator Graham moves
29. the adoption of Senate Joint Resolution 33 and House Joint
30. Resolution 44. All in favor signify by saying Aye. All
31. opposed. The Ayes have it. The resolutions are adopted.
32. SJR 40, Senator Merlo...Senator Garmisa...thank you. On the
33. Order of Secretary's Desk, Resolutions, Senate Joint Resolution

1. 40, Senator Merlo.

2. SENATOR MERLO:

3. Thank you, Mr. President, and members of the Senate.

4. I'm sure that you'll all agree with me that the condominium
5. phenomena still continues, and that the condominiums are
6. here to stay. It is still the fastest growing form of
7. housing, not only in the United States, but in Europe,
8. Central Asia and various other parts of the world. The
9. Senate...Joint Senate Resolution creates the Joint Condominium
10. Study Committee, consisting of sixteen members, eight
11. from the Senate, four selected by the President, and four
12. selected by the Senate Minority Leader, and eight from the
13. House, four selected by the Speaker, and four by the Minority
14. Leader there. It's something that is absolutely necessary,
15. since the passage of the Condominium Package in the General
16. Assembly last session. There have been many new problems
17. that have surfaced, and I think that it is our responsibility
18. to look into these problems, and I ask the adoption of Joint
19. Resolution 40.

20. PRESIDENT:

21. Is there any discussion? Senator Rhoads.

22. SENATOR RHOADS:

23. Inquiry of the Chair. Does this require expenditure of
24. funds?

25. PRESIDENT:

26. It does, and a roll call will be required, yes sir.

27. Senator Netsch.

28. SENATOR NETSCH:

29. Thank you. I stand in support of Senator Merlo's resolution.
30. It is a problem of enormous proportions to many areas of the
31. State, most notably to ours, and we clearly have not found
32. all the solutions yet. And some of them, incidentally, have
33. to do...go far beyond just the questions of protecting tenants

1. and putting some restraints on conversions. They have
2. to do with assessment problems and a variety of other
3. things, so there's no question that the legislature should
4. be spending some additional time looking at these issues.

5. PRESIDENT:

6. Is there any further discussion? If not, Senator
7. Merlo has moved the adoption of Senate Joint Resolution
8. 40. A roll call is required. Those in favor of the adoption
9. of Senate Joint Resolution 40 will vote Aye. Those opposed
10. will vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish?
11. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take
12. the record. On that question, the Ayes are 36, the Nays
13. are 4. 1 Voting Present. Senate Joint Resolution 40
14. is adopted. 42, Senator Nimrod. On the Order of Secretary's
15. Desk, Resolutions, Senate Joint Resolution 42. Senator Nimrod.

16. SENATOR NIMROD:

17. Thank you, Mr. President. This is a resolution to
18. bring the attention to the Illinois Congressional Delegation
19. the concerns within the General Assembly, regarding our
20. difficulties in complying with the deadlines of the
21. Clean Air Act Amendments in 1977. There
22. is presently a bill there, and I think it's important
23. that our Congressional Delegation be notified. What we're
24. asking is that they postpone the requirements of that Act,
25. which are presently July first, '79, until July
26. first, 1980. The Federal Government has not, in
27. fact, provided a number of the limitations that have to be
28. provided in order for us to even comply or send in a
29. State plan, and what is presently in jeopardy, of course,
30. are our funds for highways and our sewage construction, so
31. I would move for the adoption of this amendment.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. Is there any discussion? Senator Netsch. Senator Netsch
wishes to be recorded No. Any further discussion? If not,

1. Senator Nimrod moves the adoption of Senate Joint Resolution
2. 42. All in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The
3. Ayes have it. The resolution is adopted. All right, with
4. leave of the Body, we will move to the Order of Resolutions,
5. Consent Calendar. The Calendar, I'm told, has been distributed.
6. Mr. Secretary, have any objections been filed?

7. ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

8. None.

9. PRESIDENT:

10. All right. Senate Resolution 184, 185, 186, 187, 188,
11. 189, 190, 191, 192, 194, 195, Senate Joint Resolution 54
12. and House Joint Resolution 58. No objections having been
13. filed, Senator Donnewald moves the adoption of the resolutions
14. contained on the Consent Calendar. All in favor signify by
15. saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The resolutions
16. are adopted.

17. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

18. Senator Rock.

19. SENATOR ROCK:

20. Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the
21. Senate. Again, I would like to reiterate that there are a
22. number of Senate Bills on 1st Reading on the House Calendar,
23. and under the House Rules, if they're not picked up by the
24. close of House business today, they will be determined to
25. have been dead, so I would suggest that you take a look at
26. a House Calendar and get over and get a House sponsor. I've
27. spoken with the Speaker and intend to meet with him at noon.
28. They go in at noon. Secondly, I would move at this time,
29. Mr. President, for the suspension of the rules with respect
30. to the Six Day Posting Requirement. I'm causing to have
31. passed out now our Senate schedule for next week and the
32. following two weeks, through June 23rd, and you will notice,
33. particularly the week of June 11th through June 15, that

1. we have a pretty heavy committee schedule, in an attempt
2. to adequately address the twelve hundred plus House Bills
3. the House has seen fit to send us, so I would at this
4. time, move for the suspension of the Six Day Posting
5. Requirement, in hope that all members would...be afforded
6. the opportunity to have their House Bills heard.

7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

8. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Senator Rock.

9. SENATOR ROCK:

10. It does not appear that there is any further absolutely
11. necessary business, and I would suggest that since we do, in
12. fact, have Monday off, or at least are not required to be
13. here on Monday for Session purposes, that we might well
14. take advantage of the early hour, and send everybody on
15. their way, so if there's no further business, I would
16. move that, pursuant to the adjournment resolution, that
17. the Senate stand adjourned until Tuesday, June 5, at the
18. hour of noon.

19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

20. You've heard the motion. Those in favor indicate by saying
21. Aye. Those opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The Senate
22. stands adjourned.

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
