33. the Body to go to that order for the purpose of a motion.

1. SENATOR NIMROD:

2. Yes, thank you, Mr. President. I would seek leave to  
3. Table Senate Joint Resolution No. 12.

4. PRESIDENT:

5. That motion is in order. Senator Nimrod moves to Table  
6. Senate Joint Resolution 12. All in favor signify by saying  
7. Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. So ordered. Senator  
8. Philip.

9. SENATOR PHILIP:

10. Same motion, Mr. President, on Senate Joint Resolution  
11. 24.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. Senator Philip moves to Table Senate Joint Resolution  
14. Constitutional Amendment 24. All in favor signify by saying  
15. Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The resolution is  
16. Tabled. All right. With leave of the Body, we'll move to  
17. the middle of page five. On the Secretary's Desk there is  
18. a FY+'80 Supplemental Appropriation that is a matter of  
19. some urgency, I am reliably informed. With leave of the Body,  
20. we'll go to that order, to consider Senate Bill 1484. Mr.  
21. Secretary.

22. SECRETARY:

23. Senate Bill 1484 with House Amendment No. 1.

24. PRESIDENT:

25. Senator Regner.

26. SENATOR REGNER:

27. Yes, Mr. President and members, this bill originally  
28. provided 1.1 million dollars supplemental for gas purchases  
29. for the State Police. The amendment put on in the House is  
30. a transfer bill... no ...transfer amendment, no new dollars;  
31. it's a hundred and twenty-five thousand dollars into a line  
32. item for apprehension of fugitives. The reason for the  
33. necessity, today, is the troop...the State Police are just



1. running out of money to pay and buy gas, so they can protect  
2. our highways. I ask for a favorable roll call.

3. PRESIDENT:

4. Any discussion? Senator Buzbee.

5. SENATOR BUZBEE:

6. Thank you, Mr...thank you, Mr. President. I concur with  
7. what Senator Regner has said and think that we ought to go  
8. ahead and get this. There's only thirty dollars...remains to  
9. the State Police of this State to apprehend fugitives, and  
10. I suspect that we ought to hurry up and give them some more  
11. money so they can start apprehending more fugitives. So, I  
12. would think we ought to vote Aye on this.

13. PRESIDENT:

14. All right. If there's no further discussion, the question  
15. is shall the Senate concur on House Amendment No. 1 to Senate  
16. Bill 1484. Those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed will  
17. vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish?  
18. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Are you  
19. ready? Is Senator Netsch on board? Oh, that's fine, all right.  
20. Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question,  
21. the Ayes are 51, the Nays are none, none Voting Present.  
22. The Senate does concur on House Amendment No. 1 to Senate  
23. Bill 1484, and the bill, having received the required con-  
24. stitutional majority, is declared passed. Senator Donnewald,  
25. for what purpose do you arise?

26. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

27. For two purposes, Mr. President. I would like the record  
28. to show that Senator Jerome Joyce is absent and he is on  
29. Senate business. The other item...

30. PRESIDENT:

31. The Journal will so reflect. Senator Donnewald.

32. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

33. ...the other item, I would call attention to the members,

1. there have been passed to you, joint leadership had a meeting  
2. just an hour or so ago and that is the revised schedule you  
3. have before you; and we would be coming into Session tomorrow  
4. morning at 9:00 a.m., and we will go ahead with the various  
5. committee meetings, and then we will recess until four and  
6. committee meetings be held in the interim. We would then  
7. again come back Thursday morning at nine. Session...for  
8. committee meetings, Session would be at twelve noon, Thursday.

9. PRESIDENT:

10. All right. Senator Donnewald has indicated the revised  
11. schedule for the week of June 3 to June 5. Is there any  
12. discussion? Senator Geo-Karis, for what purpose do you  
13. arise?

14. SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

15. I...according to this revised schedule, we...we come in  
16. at nine; and I notice we have Judiciary I at 9:00 a.m. Can  
17. anyone tell me...

18. PRESIDENT:

19. I understand Judiciary I has been cancelled.

20. SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

21. ...oh. Thank you.

22. PRESIDENT:

23. Senator Buzbee.

24. SENATOR BUZBEE:

25. Thank you, Mr. President. The revised schedule shows it,  
26. but the...today's Calendar does not; but Appropriations II  
27. Committee will be meeting at 10:00 a.m. tomorrow morning in  
28. Room 212. We were originally scheduled for Room 400, but  
29. it's now in Room 212, at 10:00 a.m., right after Session  
30. tomorrow morning.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. Senator Donnewald.

33. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

1. Yes, Mr. President. I have been asked to announce that  
2. tomorrow evening, we'll probably announce it again tomorrow,  
3. that there will be the House...or the Senate-House Softball  
4. game, and...I've not been advised where it will be, but keep  
5. that in mind, and we'll...we'll know tomorrow.

6. PRESIDENT:

7. Senator Philip...Senator Philip will handle that announce-  
8. ment. His co-captain seems to be a little shaky over there.  
9. Senator Philip.

10. SENATOR PHILIP:

11. Thank you...thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen  
12. of the Senate. The Annual House-Senate Softball game is tomorrow  
13. night, Chamberlain Park at six o'clock. It's approximately  
14. 18th and Capitol. As you know, this is our annual  
15. softball duel, and you know the Senate has never won. This  
16. year we look very good; we've had five practices. The team  
17. looks sharp; get your money out, because you're going to beat  
18. the pants off of them. Now, I might remind you, all the pro-  
19. ceeds from this game go to the Springfield Boys' Club. So,  
20. let's hope we have a good turn out.

21. PRESIDENT:

22. Any further business to come before the Senate? Senator  
23. Donnewald.

24. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

25. Yes, Mr...yes, Mr. President, this...this announcement is  
26. quite important. I...I'd sure like to remind all of the members,  
27. the sitting members, that tonight at six-thirty we have a  
28. reunion with the former members and that does begin at six-thirty.  
29. The dinner at seven-thirty, I believe; at the Sangamo Club.

30. PRESIDENT:

31. Senator Lemke. Senator Lemke.

32. SENATOR LEMKE:

33. Just to make an announcement that...that the Elections

1. Committee will meet on Thursday, June 5th, at 9:00 a.m., in  
2. Room A-1 in the Stratton Building; and also at that time, I  
3. would like to make a motion, now, to waive the Six-Day...  
4. Notice Rules to have House Bill 2734 heard in Elections  
5. Committee on that day.

6. PRESIDENT:

7. All right. You've heard the motion. Is there any discussion?  
8. If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed.  
9. The Ayes have it. The rules are suspended and the posting is  
10. waived. Any further business to come before the Senate?  
11. If not, Senator Carroll moves that the Senate stand adjourned  
12. until 9:00 a.m...9:00 a.m., Wednesday, June 4th...9:00 a.m.,  
13. Wednesday, June 4th. The Senate stands adjourned.

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
