9. Thank you, Reverend. Senator Nimrod, for what purpose do
10. you rise?

11. SENATOR NIMROD:

12. Mr. President. I just thought I might take a moment to acknow-
13. ledge the fact that Reverend Phyllis Koehnline makes it...yesterday
14. and today makes it the first time that we have had a gracious lady
15. as Senate Chaplin. I thought we might acknowledge that, and we cer-
16. tainly thank you for gracing and helping with ...Chaplin with the
17. prayer the last two days. Certainly this is a landmark...momentous
18. occasion, thank you.

23. Mr. President, before the Reverend Phyllis, I can't remember
24. her last name, but I would like to ask her if she would be kind
25. enough to leave us a copy of those beautiful thoughts she just
26. expressed, because they certainly are needed in this world today,
27. and I would...I would consider it a privilege if you would do that
28. for us.

30. Senator Nimrod indicates that he will see to it. Reading of

3. SENATOR JOHNS:

6. SECRETARY:

7. A Message from the House by Mr. O'Brien, Clerk. Mr. President-
8. I am directed to inform the Senate that the House of Representatives

17. PRESIDENT:

18. Secretary's Desk Concurrence. Senator Donnewald, for what
19. purpose do you rise?

20. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

21. Yes, Mr. President, and members of the Senate. I would ask
22. leave that House Bill 625 be rerefered from Public Health to Insurance.
23. House Bill 1142 from Judiciary to Agriculture. House Bill 2389,
24. from Judiciary to Insurance. House Bill 1210 from Judiciary I
25. to Transportation and House Bill 2771, from Executive to Insurance.

26. PRESIDENT:

27. You've heard the motions to rerefer. Is leave granted? Leave
28. is granted. So ordered. Yes, Senator Vadalabene... Senator Lemke,
29. for what purpose do you rise?

30. SENATOR LEMKE:

31. I have two bills on railroads and one's in Agriculture and the
32. other one is in Judiciary, and I don't know why they're there. They
33. should be in Transportation.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. Right.

3. SENATOR LEMKE:

4. So since I'm on that committee I think we should...Senate
5. Bill 1210 and 1211.

6. PRESIDENT:

7. Yes, Senator Donnewald.

8. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

9. I would make the same request as to 1211 from Agriculture to
10. Transportation.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. You've heard the request. Is leave granted? Leave is granted.
13. So ordered. Resolutions.

14. SECRETARY:

15. Senate Resolution 211 offered by Senator Rock and all members.
16. It's a Death Resolution. Senate Resolution 212 offered by Senator
17. Donnewald. It's congratulatory, and Senate Resolution 213 offered by
18. Senator Lemke and it's congratulatory.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. Is leave granted to immediately consider and adopt these...
21. there's a death resolution and two congratulatories. The Consent
22. Calendar has already been printed. Senator Vadalabene moves for the
23. suspension of the rules for the immediate consideration and adoption
24. of Senate Resolutions 212 and 213. All in favor signify by saying Aye.
25. All opposed. The Ayes have it. Senator Vadalabene now moves the
26. adoption of Senate Resolutions 212 and 213. All in favor signify by
27. saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. Those two resolutions are
28. adopted. Senator Vadalabene, for what purpose do you rise?

29. SENATOR VADALABENE:

30. Yes, thank you, Mr. President. I don't know the proper motion,
31. but I would like to...I have House Bill 1269, that is in the Transporta-
32. tion Committee. I...am requesting that no further notice be sent out for
33. meetings on House Bill 1269 and for that bill to be on a...to stay
in committee or in the Interim Study Committee, and I don't know the

1. proper motion.

2. PRESIDENT:

3. I think all you have to do, frankly, is advise the Committee
4. Chairman of your wish as the sponsor that the bill remain in
5. committee. House Bills, 1st reading.

6. SECRETARY:

7. House Bill 837, Senator D'Arco.

8. (Secretary reads title of bill)

9. 1st reading of the bill.

10. House Bill 1045, Senators Chew and Lemke.

11. (Secretary reads title of bill)

12. 1st reading of the bill.

13. House Bill 1688, Senator Keats.

14. (Secretary reads title of bill)

15. 1st reading of the bill.

16. House Bill 1687, Senator Keats.

17. (Secretary reads title of bill)

18. 1st reading of the bill.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. Senator Maragos, for what purpose do you rise?

21. SENATOR MARAGOS:

22. ...President, I would like leave of the House to become the chief
23. sponsor of House Bill 1357. Senator Savickas was the present sponsor...
24. has okayed it and I would like to have leave at this time.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. House Bill 1357, the Senator request leave to be shown as the spon-
27. sor. Is leave granted? Leave of the Senate is granted. I can't give you
28. leave of the House.

29. SENATOR MARAGOS:

30. Well I thought your powers were over...extended there too, Mr.
31. President. Thank you.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. If I had my druthers we'd have the House leave, period. All right,
we have 5 FY'79 appropriations bills of some emergency. If I can have

1. the attention of the membership, I will give the numbers and we will
2. proceed in that order. On 3rd reading we have House Bill...on page
3. 8 of the Calendar on 3rd reading we have House Bill 357, sponsored
4. by Senator Knuppel. On page 13 we have House Bill 747, sponsored
5. by Senator Lemke. On House Bill...page 23, House Bill 2487, and then
6. on the Order of the Secretary's Desk on Concurrence which is on page
7. 33 of the Calendar, Senate Bill 90 by Senator Shapiro, and Senate
8. Bill 841 by Senator Hall. Is there leave to take these five bills
9. under consideration? Leave is granted. With leave of the Body we will
10. go to the Order of House Bill,3rd reading. All right on the Order
11. of House Bills,3rd reading, page 8 on the Calendar, House Bill 357.
12. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

13. SECRETARY:

14. House Bill 357.

15. (Secretary reads title of bill)

16. 3rd reading of the bill.

17. PRESIDENT:

18. Senator Knuppel.

19. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

20. Yes, House Bill 357, is a bill to make certain transfers of
21. funds in the Public Defender Program. It was heard in Appropriations
22. and two days ago an amendment was adopted on the Floor of the Senate
23. here, which Senator Carroll offered, which brings the bill into compli-
24. ance with the funds they have to make necessary transfers to meet
25. their payroll here in the closing months of the biennium. I would
26. appreciate a favorable role call.

27. PRESIDENT:

28. Is there any discussion? If not,the question is shall House Bill
29. 357 pass? Those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed will vote Nay.
30. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish?
31. Take the record. On that question the Ayes are 48, the Nays are none,
32. none Voting Present. House bill 357 having received a constitutional
33. majority is declared passed. Senator Lemke, you wish to proceed on
747? On page 13 on the Calendar, House Bill 747. Read the bill, Mr.

1. secretary.

2. SECRETARY:

3. House Bill 747.

4. (Secretary reads title of bill)

5. 3rd reading of the bill.

6. PRESIDENT:

7. Senator Lemke.

8. SENATOR LEMKE.

9. What this bill does is transfers within funds...but heretofore
10. appropriated to the Insurance Laws Commission.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. Is there any discussion? If not, the question is shall House
13. Bill 747 pass? Those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed will
14. vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all
15. voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, the Ayes are 49,
16. the Nays are 1, none Voting Present. House Bill 747 having received
17. a constitutional majority is declared passed. Yes, Senator
18. Demuzio, for what purpose do you rise?

19. SENATOR DUMUZIO:

20. Yes, on a point of personal privilege. I just discovered that
21. my key was turned and I did push a green button on House Bill 375. I
22. don't know if it was recorded or not, but if it isn't I would like for
23. the record to record that I would have voted affirmatively.

24. PRESIDENT:

25. The record will so reflect. All right, on page 23 on the Calendar.
26. On the Order of House Bills, 3rd reading, is House Bill 2487. Is leave
27. granted to have Senator Carroll handle that bill in Senator Daley's
28. absence? Leave is granted. On the Order of House Bills, 3rd reading,
29. House Bill 2487. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

30. SECRETARY:

31. House Bill 2487..

32. (Secretary reads title of bill)

33. 3rd reading of the bill.

PRESIDENT:

1. Senator Carroll.

2. SENATOR CARROLL:

3. Thank you, Mr. President, and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate.

4. This bill is a supplemental appropriation for the cost of printing

5. the Digest. We change this to a transfer bill and corrected the

6. technical defects of the Reference Bureau in their own budget request.

7. I would ask for a favorable role call now that we have it in tech-

8. nically correct form. It's a transfer...it's money supplemental for

9. the printing of the Digest, and we've made it into a transfer, but

10. when they presented the bill, it was in technically incorrect form.

11. The Reference Bureau is the traditional shoemaker who goes barefoot.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. Is there any discussion? If not, the question is shall House

14. Bill 2487 pass? Those in favor will vote Aye. Those oppsed will

15. vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all

16. voted who wish? Take the record. On that question the Ayes are 48,

17. the Nays are none. None Voting Present. House Bill 2487 having re-

18. ceived a constitutional majority is declared passed. All right, if

19. you'll turn to...with leave of the Body we'll go to the Order of

20. Secretary's Desk Concurrences. Is leave granted? Leave is granted.

21. On page 33 of the Calendar...on the Order of the Secretary's Desk

22. Concurrence is Senate Bill 90. Mr. Secretary.

23. SECRETARY:

24. Senate Bill 90, with House Amendment No. 1.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. Senator Shapiro.

27. SENATOR SHAPRIO:

28. Mr. President, and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I would

29. move that the Senate concur on House Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill

30. 90. It's a technical amendment and what it accually does is delete

31. the words upon its becoming law and inserts in lieu thereof July 1st,

32. 1979, so I would ask for an affirmative vote on concurrence.

33. PRESIDENT:

Is there any discussion? Senator Buzbee.

1. SENATOR BUZBEE:

2. Thank you, Mr. President. The net effect of this technical
3. amendment is to make it an appropriation for FY'80 rather than for
4. FY'79, and it's my understanding that the department has agreed
5. that this amount of capital will come out of their ordinary and contin-
6. gent FY'80 budget, so that were all square on that. Right Senator
7. Shapiro?

8. PRESIDENT:

9. Is there any further discussion? The question is, shall the
10. Senate concur on House Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 90? Those
11. in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed will vote Nay. The voting
12. is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take
13. the record. On that question the Ayes are 51, the Nays are None.
14. None Voting Present. The Senate does concur on House Amendment
15. No. 1 to Senate Bill 90, and the bill having received the required
16. constitutional majority is declared passed. On the Order of the
17. Secretary's Desk Concurrence, again page 33 on the Calendar. Senate
18. Bill 841. Mr. Secretary.

19. SECRETARY:

20. Senate Bill 841, with House Amendment No.'s 1 and 2.

21. PRESIDENT:

22. Senator Hall.

23. SENATOR HALL:

24. Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate.
25. I move that the Senate concur in House Amendment No. 1, which is a
26. reduction of forty-eight thousand one hundred dollars from operations.
27. And also with House Amendment No. 2 it changes the source of funding
28. from the Road Fund to the General Revenue Fund, of a hundred and
29. eighty-six thousand dollars, under the State officers salaries section.
30. It makes no change in the bill total. I move that we concur.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. Is there any discussion? If not, the question is shall the
33. Senate concur on House Amendments No.'s 1 and 2, to Senate Bill 841?
Those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed will vote Nay. The voting

1. is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take
2. the record. On that question, the Ayes are 50, the Nays are 1.
3. None Voting Present. The Senate does concur on House Amendments
4. 1 and 2 to Senate Bill 841 and the bill having received the required
5. constitutional majority is declared passed. Senator Hall, for
6. what purpose do you rise?

7. SENATOR HALL:

8. I would like to have leave to make an announcement, Mr. President.

10. Yes, certainly.

12. I would like to announce to the Body, that Senator Collins is
13. absent today, because of the death of her mother. You know three
14. weeks ago her father died, and now she is absent today, because
