28. Mr. President and members of the Senate, Senate Resolution

33. Thank you.

2. Further discussion? If not, all in favor signify by
3. saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. So ordered.
4. Resolutions.

5. SECRETARY:

6. Senate Resolution 548, offered by Senators De Angelis
7. and Moore; and it's a death resolution.

8. PRESIDENT:

9. Consent Calendar. Senator Merlo, for what purpose do you
10. arise?

11. SENATOR MERLO:

12. Mr. President, on a point of order. Is it necessary to
13. waive the Six-Day Notice by the consent of the Senate on any
14. House Bills?

15. PRESIDENT:

16. No, Sir, we did that last week. Senator Mitchler, for
17. what purpose do you arise?

18. SENATOR MITCHLER:

19. Mr. President and members of the Senate, at times, on the
20. Floor of the Senate, we notice some of the Senators have out-
21. standing and rather attractive wardrobes. Last week we were
22. blessed by the green sportcoat and the dolphin trousers of
23. Senator Pate Philip; and there was accusations and confirmation,
24. later, that his wife did purchase that. But on the Floor today,
25. I would like to have you take note of my seatemate, Senator

14. Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the

1. SENATOR BUZBEE:

2. Thank you, Mr. President. This amendment raises the
3. authorized expenditure level for the Department of Aging's
4. In-home Care Program to 10.65 million for FY-'80. It also
5. authorizes an expenditure level of twenty million for the
6. same program in FY-'81, and I would move its adoption.

7. PRESIDENT:

8. All right. Senator Buzbee has moved the adoption of
9. Committee Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 2905. Any further
10. discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye.
11. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted.
12. Any further amendments?

31. 3rd reading. 3019, Senator Vadalabene. Senator Vadalabene,
32. for what purpose do you arise? You want to move the bill?
33. Okay. On the Order of House Bills 2nd reading, House Bill

1. 3019...3019. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

2. SECRETARY:

3. House Bill 3019.

4. (Secretary reads title of bill)

5. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Appropriations I
6. offers one amendment.

7. PRESIDENT:

8. Senator Carroll.

9. SENATOR CARROLL:

10. Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the
11. Senate. This is a simple amendment; it reduces each of the
12. line items to one dollar, changing the appropriation, there-
13. fore, from a hundred and ninety-two thousand four hundred
14. dollars to nine dollars. The purpose of this was that the
15. St. Louis Metropolitan Area Airport Authority was intended
16. to create an airport in that area of our State. Last year,
17. for about the fourth time, they came to us and indicated if
18. we would just let them survive for one more year they would
19. bring us Flying Tiger, and if they failed to do so, they should
20. no longer be in existence. Some of us felt they should still
21. have a shot, so we gave them a dollar; but the years have gone
22. by and there is no airport; and we're spending a hundred and
23. ninety-two thousand dollars a year for absolutely nothing at
24. this point. DOT has taken over this function by recommending
25. four sites in Illinois, and DOT is paying for that as opposed
26. to this type of appropriation through their general budget.
27. I...I'm sure the Senator from part of that area isn't overly
28. happy with the dollar, but some of the other Senators from
29. that area thought we were too generous. I would move adoption
30. of Amendment No. 1.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. Senator Carroll has moved the adoption of Amendment...
33. Committee Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 3019. Any discussion?

1. Senator Vadalabene.

2. SENATOR VADALABENE:

3. Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate.

4. I'm going to oppose the amendment and ask my colleagues to
5. support the opposition of the committee amendment that was
6. adopted in committee. Naturally, at the time that the bill
7. was heard last year, conditions being what they may, Director
8. Reeves did indicate that, give us one more shot in regard to
9. keeping the St. Louis Metropolitan Airport Authority alive.
10. And I know by my experience here in the Senate, that some-
11. times you don't get things done in one year. To give you
12. an example, it has taken fourteen years to get a multi-purpose
13. building for our campus at S.I.U.E. It took us eight years
14. to get the Convention Centers across the State of Illinois;
15. and this is another problem, that again, because of the
16. leadership and the wisdom of the St. Louis Metropolitan
17. Airport Authority that someday, somewhere in the State of
18. Illinois is going to be a Flying Tiger Cargo Airport.
19. Now, we may not get it down there, but we have been instru-
20. mental in getting major events all over the State of Illinois,
21. and it started down there in my Senatorial district; and I
22. would ask for a roll call to oppose this amendment.

23. PRESIDENT:

24. The question is the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to
25. House Bill 3019. Further discussion? Senator Regner.

26. SENATOR REGNER:

27. Yes, Mr. President and members. I rise in support of
28. the amendment. Several years ago when this airport was first
29. proposed, it was proposed as a passenger airport. The U. S.
30. Secretary of Transportation, shortly thereafter, said that
31. no monies would ever be appropriated...Federal monies, and
32. it takes ninety percent Federal money for a new airport...
33. no Federal monies would be appropriated for a passenger

1. airport in that area. So what the group down there did then,
2. was to change the concept a couple of years ago; that it was
3. going to be an all-purpose cargo airport. Now, just recently,
4. Neal Goldschmidt, the Secretary of the U. S. Department of
5. Transportation, expressed that he felt there is no need for
6. an all-cargo airport near...Columbia-Waterloo, and that no
7. Federal funds would be available to build that airport. So
8. what we're doing by prolonging this; and last year, again,
9. as Senator Carroll said, it was stated to us in committee
10. that that would be the last year; if it didn't come to pass
11. during the current fiscal year, it would not come forth again.
12. So all it's doing is appropriating about two hundred thousand
13. dollars for a couple people's salaries and travel and
14. writing continuous reports that do nothing; will never be
15. accomplished, and I urge the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to
16. House Bill 3019.

17. PRESIDENT:

18. The question is the adoption of Committee Amendment No.
19. 1 to House Bill 3019. Further discussion? Senator Buzbee.

20. SENATOR BUZBEE:

21. Thank you, Mr. President. This particular proposed air-
22. port lies exclusively within my Legislative district, in the
23. counties of Monroe and St. Clair. As I explained in committee,
24. when I offered this amendment the other day; for seven years I
25. have supported this Airport Authority and their fiscal request.
26. I went through three campaigns...I went through three campaigns
27. and this was probably one of the...hottest topics that has ever
28. come up in my campaigns as to support or opposition to this
29. proposed airport. I supported it all along; I would still like
30. to see such an airport located in the Metro-East area, which
31. would probably be in my district in St. Clair and Monroe
32. Counties. However, I became convinced that the St. Louis
33. Metropolitan Area Airport Authority has become a bureaucratic

1. boondoggle of the worst type. There are a total of three
2. employees; one executive director, one bookkeeper and one
3. secretary. They have two cars, and their total budgetary
4. request is one hundred and ninety-two thousand dollars for
5. this coming fiscal year. Last year, the Director came before
6. the Appropriations Committee and promised us that that would
7. be his last year of requesting an appropriation, unless he
8. had a signed contract from Flying Tiger to put a cargo airport
9. in. As has been previously stated, this originally started
10. out to be a passenger airport; it became obvious a few years
11. ago that the Feds were not going to support that concept,
12. and so suddenly, the concept was changed to a cargo airport;
13. which I don't oppose, except that I am convinced that these
14. folks are there for one reason and one reason only and that's
15. to perpetuate themselves. It's my contention that this
16. function can be taken over by the Division of Aeronautics
17. Illinois Department of Transportation, the files, the
18. multitudinous studies that have gone on over the years,
19. can all be retained in the Illinois Department of Transportation.
20. As has also been pointed out, there are three or four other
21. sites in the State of Illinois that are vying for this same
22. thing. Senator Bruce has an appropriation request for fifty
23. thousand dollars, as I recall, for an airport authority in
24. his area. I intend to oppose that...appropriation request
25. adamantly, also. It seems ludicrous to me that we, in the
26. State of Illinois, spend all this taxpayer dollars to try
27. to compete among various airport authorities to get an
28. airport in our area. If there is to be a cargo airport located
29. in the State of Illinois, it can be contracted for by the
30. Illinois Division of Aeronautics Department of Transportation.
31. Director Reeves did not keep his word; he said last year he
32. would not be back if he didn't have a signed contract, he
33. doesn't have a signed contract; he's back again, saying give

1. me one more year. I submit to you that this is a...a good
2. amendment; it does not in perpetuity kill the St. Louis
3. Metropolitan Airport Authority, because if it should ever
4. become necessary to revive it at some point in the future,
5. the functions can simply be transformed...pardon me, trans-
6. ferred from the Division of Aeronautics back to St. Louis
7. Metropolitan Area Airport Authority. It's my belief that
8. Flying Tigers isn't going to locate anywhere in Illinois;
9. but if they do, the Department of Transportation can be the
10. agency that signs that contract. I submit it's a good
11. amendment and I would ask for your Aye vote on reducing this
12. appropriation to a total of nine dollars.

13. PRESIDENT:

14. Further discussion? Senator Vadalabene, for the second
15. time.

16. SENATOR VADALABENE:

17. No, I would appreciate a No vote. I was just standing
18. up, just to be standing up.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. I understand. Okay. Senator Carroll may close.

21. SENATOR CARROLL:

22. Thank you, Mr. President. I think the point is that both
23. the Legislator from the district and the General Assembly
24. has been more than favorably disposed to this over the years.
25. They were supposed to create an airport, that went by the way;
26. they then went into a cargo facility, and told us a year ago
27. that they only wanted one last year. We gave them that last
28. year last year; we're not jeopardizing anything for the State,
29. because DOT is pursuing an airport for Flying Tiger in Illinois
30. at any one of the four locations. To let three people spend
31. a hundred and ninety-two thousand dollars, year after year after
32. year, when there is no real purpose for it anymore, I think
33. flies in the face of Legislative and Executive integrity and
34. I would urge adoption of Amendment No. 1.
