14. to take advantage of a grant from the Robert Woods Johnson
15. Foundation of ninety thousand six hundred dollars for model
16. projects in suburban areas dealing with senior citizens. Ad-
17. ditionally the bill was amended in committee to transfer seven
18. hundred and forty-nine thousand four hundred dollars with...
19. within the FY'80 appropriation, Department of Public Aid.
20. Appreciate a favorable roll call.

3. SENATOR BECKER:

4. Thank you, Mr. President. House Bill 3055 is an FY
5. transfer bill for the Bureau of Employment Security as well
6. as the Department of Revenue. Bureau of Employment Security...
7. concerning the Bureau of Employment Security, House Bill 3055
8. currently provides transfers between line items totaling one
9. million two hundred and eighty thousand four hundred. As House
10. Bill 35...3055 arrived in the Senate, it provided for transfers
11. totaling one million twenty-five thousand. And a supplemental
12. of two hundred and fifty-five thousand four hundred. However,
13. Senate Committee Amendment 1, increased transfers by two hundred
14. and fifty-five thousand four hundred, thus, converting House
15. Bill 3055 from a combination transfer supplement to a total
16. transfer bill. The Department of Revenue, concerning the
17. Department of Revenue, House Bill 3055 was amended in committee
18. to provide for a transfer of three hundred and forty-four
19. thousand eight hundred. This transfer is necessary to meet
20. the operational needs of the department for the...remainder
21. of the fiscal year, effective immediately I ask for a
22. favorable roll call.

23. PRESIDENT:

24. Any discussion? If not, the question is, shall House
25. Bill 3055 pass. Those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed
26. will vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish?
27. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the

29. None Voting Present. House Bill 3055, having received the
30. required constitutional majority is declared passed. 3059,

7. SENATOR MITCHLER:

8. Mr. President and members of the Senate. House Bill
9. 3059 transfers eighty-eight thousand dollars from grants and
10. aid for payment of veterans scholarships line of the FY'80
11. appropriation for the Department of Veteran's Affairs. This
12. bill does not change the department's appropriation total.
13. I would appreciate a favorable roll call.

14. PRESIDENT:

15. Any discussion? If not, the question is, shall House Bill
16. 3059 pass. Those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed will
17. vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have
18. all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record.
19. On that question, the Ayes are 54, the Nays are none. None
20. Voting Present. House Bill 3059, having received the required
21. constitutional majority is declared passed. 3061, Senator
22. Rhoads. On the Order of House Bills 3rd reading, top of
23. page 3, is House Bill 3061. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

26. (Secretary reads title of bill)

27. 3rd reading of the bill.

28. PRESIDENT:

29. Senator Rhoads.

30. SENATOR RHOADS:

31. Thank you, Mr. President, and members of the Senate. This
32. is a supplemental appropriation for FY'80 to the Commission on
33. Delinquency Prevention in the amount of eighty-seven thousand one

1. hundred dollars. Now, this is in order to take advantage of
2. a Title XX grant from the Federal government to study regulations
3. and the effects of local delivery on services. Now, we expect
4. to get reimbursed about ninety-five percent of this amount
5. with Federal monies. So, the actual impact on State dollars
6. and State General Revenue will ultimately be only four thousand
7. three hundred and fifty-five dollars, and I ask for a favorable
8. vote.

9. PRESIDENT:

10. Any discussion? If not, the question is, shall House
11. Bill 3061 pass. Those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed
12. will vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish?

13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

14. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take
15. the record. On that question, the Ayes are 55, the Nays are
16. none. None Voting Present. House Bill 3061, having received
17. the required constitutional majority is declared passed.
18. Is there leave to return to House Bill 3002? Leave is granted.
19. House Bill 3002. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary, please.

21. House Bill 3002.

22. (Secretary reads title of bill)

23. 3rd reading of the bill.

24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

25. Senator Graham. Senator Rock.

26. SENATOR ROCK:

27. Thank you, Mr. President, and Ladies and Gentlemen of
28. the Senate. House Bill 3002 is a bill at the request of the
29. Comptroller, and it will provide supplemental monies to pay the
30. salaries and benefits to former members and former members' survivors.
31. The total amount is twenty-eight thousand dollars. I seek a
32. favorable roll call.

33. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

1. Is there discussion? The question is, shall House Bill
2. 3002 pass. Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed vote Nay.
3. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted
4. who wish? Take the record. On that question, the Ayes are
5. 51, the Nays are none. None Voting Present. House Bill 3002,
6. having received the required constitutional majority is declared
7. passed. Is there leave to go to the Order of Resolutions?
8. Leave is granted. Resolutions. Mr. Secretary.

9. SECRETARY:

10. Senate Joint Resolution 115, offered by Senator Rock.

11. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

12. Senator Rock is recognized.

13. SENATOR ROCK:

14. Thank you, Mr. President, and Ladies and Gentlemen of the
15. Senate. I'm going to request suspension of the rules and the
16. immediate consideration and adoption of Senate Joint Resolution
17. ...

18. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

19. Excuse me. May we have some order. Thank you. Mr...
20. Senator Rock.

21. SENATOR ROCK:

22. Thank you, Mr. President. Of Senate Joint Resolution 115,
23. it is a housekeeping type resolution. As you will recall, this
24. Senate passed, and the House then passed, a proposed Constitutional
25. Amendment with respect to the lessening or the reduction of the
26. period of the right of redemption, with respect to a tax sale.
27. Under that same provision of the Constitution, which provides
28. the vehicle to put these propositions on the ballot, it also
29. is required of us that we appoint a committee to prepare an
30. explanation for the voters of this State along with a preparation
31. of the form that the question is to take when it is presented
32. on the ballot. That has to be done before we leave here, because
33. we have to certify that to the Office of the Secretary of State,

1. so that it can be printed and distributed to the...every
2. registered voter in this State. So, all Senate Joint
3. Resolution 115 does, is it calls upon the House and the Senate,
4. each of the four leaders, to appoint two members to have this
5. committee of eight draw up the explanation and the form of
6. the question on the ballot, run that by us...by virtue of
7. a subsequent resolution and then we will certify it to the
8. Office of the Secretary of State. There is, in my judgment no objection,
9. and I would seek to suspend the rules for the immediate con-
10. sideration and adoption of Senate Joint Resolution 115.

11. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

12. You've heard the...motion is to suspend the rules for
13. the immediate consideration and adoption of the resolution.
14. On the motion to suspend, is there discussion? On the motion,
15. all in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Now,
16. the resolution is before the Body. On the motion to adopt, is
17. there discussion? Senator Rhoads.

18. SENATOR RHOADS:

19. Question of the sponsor.

20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

21. Indicates he will yield. Senator Rhoads.

22. SENATOR RHOADS:

23. Senator Rock, yesterday, I had a conversation with represent-
24. atives of the Index Division of the Secretary of State's Office,
25. relative to the cost of the publication of the arguments and
26. the cost of mailing the explanations to every registered voter
27. and that cost is considerable and they...the question was asked,
28. is there any vehicle alive that we could find that...anyway in
29. which we could cut down on that cost, such as by newspaper
30. publication or something like that. Do you know if there's
31. any vehicle alive, and would that be your desire, if it could
32. be done?

33. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

1. Senator Rock.

2. SENATOR ROCK:

3. Well, the question of the money, did, of course, come
4. up. I...my recollection is, and was, that the appropriation
5. for the Office of the Secretary has already been sent to the
6. Governor's Desk. I am sure that either in the omnibus bill
7. or some other appropriation to the Comptroller, we could provide
8. the kind of money that's needed. And frankly, I just have not
9. thought through the...the other proposal about whether it's
10. better to send each...each voter an individual explanation
11. in the...in a pamphlet form or whether just to advertise in
12. the newspaper. It seems to me that the Constitutional Convention
13. and the subsequent Assemblies decided that this pamphlet
14. explanation sent to each voter was a better way of doing it,
15. and I'm...I'm just not prepared to immediately commit that
16. we ought to be changing that procedure.

17. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

18. Is there further discussion? Further discussion? The
19. question is, shall Senate Joint Resolution 115 pass. Those
20. in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed will vote Nay. The
21. voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted
22. who wish? Take the record. On that question, the Ayes are
23. 58, the Nays are none. None Voting Present. Senate Joint
24. Resolution 115 is hereby adopted. For what purpose does
25. Senator Rock arise?

26. SENATOR ROCK:

27. Thank you, Mr. President. Under our rules, as you are well
28. aware, when a House sponsor of a piece of legislation wishes
29. to change sponsorship that opportunity is afforded him. I
30. would like the record to reflect that currently I am listed
31. as the chief Senate sponsor of House Bill 3204, Representative
32. Kornowicz, in a letter addressed to me suggests that he would
33. appreciate it, if Senator Leroy Lemke would be assigned as the

1. sponsor, and I would like the record to so reflect.

2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

3. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Senator Rock.

4. SENATOR ROCK:

5. Thank you, Mr. President. We have, as you can see on
6. the Calendar, a pretty heavy schedule in committee this
7. afternoon. I know Senator Philip wishes to announce, concerning
8. the ball game tonight, but if there is no further business, or
9. no further announcements, I'm going to move that we stand
10. adjourned until noon tomorrow.
