19. the question is shall this series of bills pass. Those in favor
20. will vote Aye. Those opposed will vote Nay. The voting is open.
21. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the
22. record. On these bills the votes are 56 Ayes, Nays as recorded
23. in the Office of the Secretary of the Senate, none Voting Present.
24. This series of bills, having received a Constitutional majority
25. by record vote, is declared passed. And the record vote of the
26. Ayes and Nays for each bill passed shall be entered on the Journal.
27. All right, the Chair..if we can have the attention of the member-
28. ship, the Chair will yield to Senator Mitchler.

29. SENATOR MITCHLER:

30. Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate. We are
31. again honored by having the elected officers of Premier Boy's
32. State with us this morning. That, as you know, is a program
33. sponsored by the American Legion Department of Illinois, in all

1. of the fifty states, where high school students are assembled in
2. each of the respective states each year to study and learn about
3. government at all levels. They elect governmental offices at
4. all levels, all including the Judicial, Executive and Legislative
5. Branch. They also get into the county and municipal government.
6. They are taking these studies this year, as they have for past
7. several years, at Charleston at the Eastern Illinois University.
8. And we're very proud to have the State officers that were
9. elected along with the Supreme Court Justices with us this morning.
10. I would like to introduce them to you. First of all I'd like to
11. introduce the Governor of Premier Boy's State for 1979, Eric
12. Ewell of Wheaton, Illinois, from Senator Bowers' district. And
13. I'm going to ask the Governor if he wouldn't kick it off with a
14. few words. Governor.

15. ERIC EWELL:

16. (Remarks by Eric Ewell)

17. SENATOR MITCHLER:

18. And the Lieutenant Governor, Premier Boy's State for 1979
19. is Samuel Williams, 104 Minton Road in Joliet. And Senator
20. Sangmeister, I guess, we...we never know who we got over there
21. in Joliet, but I think he happens to be in the 39th. But anyway
22. Senator Sangmeister and I from Joliet certainly welcome Sam Williams.
23. Will you step forward. And the Secretary of State, Greg Kazarian
24. from Lake Bluff, Senator Adeline Geo-Karis. Will you step forward.
25. And the Comptroller, Steve Thompson from Woodstock, Illinois, Senator
26. Schaffer. Mark Neuman is the Attorney General from Champaign, Senator
27. Weaver's district. And Robert Lieske from Libertyville, also from
28. Senator Geo-Karis'. Now, our four Supreme Justices. From the
29. First District, Joe Reinoffer from Zion, Illinois, Senator Geo-Karis.
30. The Second District Supreme Court Justice, Joseph Ritter from
31. Peoria, Senator Bloom. And the Third District Justice, Todd
32. Burch of Hoopeston, Illinois, Senator Coffey. And the Fourth
33. District Justice who is also the Chief Justice of the Supreme

1. Court for 1979 Premier Boy's State, Mark Allen Stevens of
2. Rantoul from Senator Weaver's district. Tom Johnson is the
3. sponsor from the Boy's State group that have...has brought
4. the young men up to...Springfield today. We've very appreciative
5. of this and Mr. President, we have on the Secretary's Desk a
6. Senate Resolution and I would like to ask leave at this time
7. if we could go to that order of business for immediate consideration
8. and adoption of that resolution so that we may send it to these
9. fine gentlemen. And Senator Vadalabene, would you care to sum
10. up a few words. He's all set. Thank you.

11. SENATOR VADALABENE:

12. Yes, leave...can we go to the Order of Resolutions? Resolutions.

13. SECRETARY:

14. Senate Resolution 228 offered by Senators Mitchler, Vadalabene
15. and all Senators. It's congratulatory.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

17. Do we have leave...do we have leave to suspend the rules for
18. the consideration of the resolution? Leave is granted. The
19. question is shall Resolution No. 228 be adopted. Those in favor
20. indicate by saying Aye. Those opposed Nay. The Ayes have it.
21. The resolution is adopted. The Chair...the Chair yields to...
22. Senator Maitland...Senator Maitland.

23. SENATOR MAITLAND:

24. Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the
25. Senate. I have a distinct honor today in joining with Senator
26. Davidson in presenting to the Body an outstanding group. On
27. the 1st of June, this Assembly adopted a resolution that
28. commended the Great American People's Show Company on their
29. inspiring and...and...thank you. On June 1st, this Body offered
30. a resolution commending the American People Show Company on their
31. inspiring and critically acclaimed production in recent years
32. of "Your Obedient Servant Abraham Lincoln." This...an outstanding
33. production held in Kelso Hollow out at Lincoln's New Salem State

1. Park. One that we're very proud of in Illinois, one that we hope
2. goes on for a long time. We're delighted to have the group here
3. today. Introduce to you the man who plays Abraham Lincoln, who
4. will make a...a few brief remarks to you. His name is Kirk Hard
5. and give this group a...a great Senate welcome, if you would please.

6. KIRK HARD:

7. (Remarks given by Kirk Hard)

8. SENATOR DAVIDSON:

9. Ladies and Gentlemen, let's please have your attention. The
10. man's going to give you a rendition of a short, "Farewell to
11. Springfield", which many of you may or may not heard, but it's
12. a pretty stirring tale of words that you'll enjoy. So please
13. give this attention and could we get the...noise level to a little
14. less amount. Thank you.

15. KIRK HARD:

16. (Farewell to Springfield speech given)

17. SENATOR MAITLAND:

18. Thank you. Thank your group very much for honoring us with
19. your presence this afternoon. I hope that all of us as Senators
20. around the State to recommend to our constituents they come to
21. New Salem and...and see this outstanding production. Once again,
22. thank you so very much for being here.

23. SENATOR DAVIDSON:

24. Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, I would like to just add
25. one footnote, one is the show opens tonight at Kelso Hollow at
26. New Salem, it'll run till August, middle of August. But most
27. importantly, everyone of the people here are students or a
28. professor at one of the public universitites, the State of Illinois,
29. which you support. And I think we got a good investment.

30. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

31. May I have the attention of the Body. We're going to go to
32. the Order of 2nd Reading and I would suggest strongly to the
33. membership that if there is anything extremely controversial or

1. controversial on the Order of 2nd Reading, I would suggest that

16. number of bills that were introduced on the whole question of
17. hazardous conditions for transportation of school children within
18. a mile and a half radius on...on bus service. These bills were
19. all put in a subcommittee, House Bill 96 emerged as the vehicle
20. for legislation that was proposed by Representative Huskey, by Represent-
21. tative Yourell, by Representative Deuster and Steczko. House
22. Bill 19...96 now, has a Committee Agreed amendment. The amend-
23. ment is as follows; it clarifies, for example, the point where
24. a pupil resides, it defines that. It also leaves the determination
25. of a safety hazard to be made by the school board, but, and this
26. is very important, in accordance with guidelines of the State
27. Department of Transportation they will be promulgated in consultation
28. with the State Superintendent of Education. It also sets up a
29. situation where this will be reviewed in future years. It also
30. includes provisions of the Administrative Review Act. I would
31. ask for its adoption.
