30. SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

31. I have obtained permission from the sponsors of Senate
32. Bills 15, 16, 1-5, 1-6, and 52 and I would like to be added as
33. a cosponsor to those three bills if I may.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

2. Yes and if I might have the attention of the membership.
3. In an agreement worked out by Senator Rock and Senator Shapiro,
4. those Senators who would like to join as cosponsors of legisla-
5. tion, rather than occupying the time of the Senate, if you will
6. inform the Secretary, we will just automatically add your
7. name as cosponsors. Now, if you're going to ask to be a...a
8. joint cosponsor, we will still ask for permission on the Floor.
9. But just to join as a cosponsor, if you will just inform the
10. Secretary's office, they will place you on bills in which
11. you would like to be shown as a cosponsor. And obviously,
12. under custom and tradition of...of the Body, it would be
13. appropriate first to contact the actual sponsor of the
14. legislation to indicate that you're going to do that. Senator
15. Vadalabene.

16. SENATOR VADALABENE:

17. Yes, what...I think you answered the...my question,
18. that before they sign their name, be sure to ask the sponsor
19. if it's okay. I think that's...really in order.

20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

21. That is the custom of the Body. It's just...the
22. permission is usually they let the...the Body alert...be
23. alerted to it. You would...and I think Senator Vadalabene
24. is correct, the...custom is always inform the sponsor, but
25. to get it into the Journal, all you have to do now is tell
26. the Secretary. So, always contact the sponsor, get his
27. permission and then just tell the Secretary that you've
28. got permission of the sponsor to be joined as a cosponsor.
29. Any further business to come before the Senate? We'll stand
30. in recess subject to the call of the Chair, there are other
31. members that wish to introduce bills and we will take those
32. introductions later on at...today, maybe early this...this
33. morning. But if there's no further business to come before

10. thirty. Motion by Senator Rock to recess until the hour of
11. eleven-thirty. All in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes
12. have it, the Senate stands in recess.
