9. SENATOR JOHNS:

10. Mr. President...I...I hope that I'm in order, but I'd  
11. like to move to...I've talked to the...Jerry Joyce, the Senator,  
12. in charge of Agriculture, Conservation Ecology and...Environment,  
13. and I'd like to move to discharge from the Agriculture Committee  
14. House Bill 192. It's concerning the election by the school  
15. children of the white-tailed deer. It's not a...a bill of any  
16. controversy and they want to make it the State animal and I  
17. would like to move that to 2nd reading. I'd like to...ask the  
18. ...Ag...to discontinue any further consideration of a  
19. Senate...or House Bill 192 and place it on the Order of 2nd  
20. reading. I'll get it right in a minute.

21. PRESIDENT:

22. ...This is not the proper time for that motion.

23. SENATOR JOHNS:

24. It isn't. That's what I wanted to know, Mr. President.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. Yeah...right. Resolutions. Yes, Senator Geo-Karis, for  
27. what purpose do you arise?

28. SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

29. Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I  
30. would like to have leave to add myself as a cosponsor to Senate  
31. Bill 1 of Senator Egan's and I have his permission.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. You've heard the request. Is leave granted? Leave is

1. granted. Senator Nimrod, for what purpose do you arise?

2. SENATOR NIMROD:

3. Yes, thank you, Mr. President. I would like to seek leave

15. Senator Demuzio.

16. SENATOR DEMUZIO:

17. Thank you, Mr. President. This is a congratulatory resolu-  
18. tion that needs to be presented today and I was asking if there would  
19. be leave to suspend the rules to have it be considered...at this  
20. ...at this time, Sir.

21. PRESIDENT:

22. All right. Senator Demuzio has moved to suspend the rules
