4. Why don't you go through all of them and we'll take it
5. on one roll call.

7. From the Committee on Public Health, Welfare and Corrections,

9. of Tabling. And from the Committee on Elementary and Secondary
10. Education, I move that Senate Bill 496 be discharged for the

24. Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate.
25. While I don't see him on the Floor, it is also the birthday today
26. of Senator Arthur Berman and in style of our tradition, he is
27. not giving cake, he's giving pledges.

32. Thank you, Mr. President. There is, on the Secretary's

1. Desk, a...a resolution. I would like to correct one thing that
2. Senator Savickas said awhile ago in referring to Senator Rock's
3. birthday. He said, it's his forty-third, I know that's not
4. true because I'm forty-three and Senator Rock is older than
5. me. So I know that this is his forty-fourth birthday and we
6. have a resolution today which commemorates such an event as
7. this that I would like to take the time of the Body just for
8. a moment to read.
