13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

14. Senator Johns.

15. SENATOR JOHNS:

16. Mr. President, I move the Journals just read by the
17. Secretary be approved unless some Senator has additions or
18. corrections to offer.

19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

20. You've heard the motion. Are there additions or corrections?
21. On the motion, all in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes
22. have it. And the Journals are approved. Resolutions.

23. SECRETARY:

24. Senate Resolution 161, offered by Senators Savickas, Rock,
25. Donnewald, and all Senators, it's congratulatory.

26. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

27. Is there leave to place it on the Resolution Consent Calendar?
28. Leave is granted. Is there leave to return to the Order of
29. the Journal? Leave is granted. Senator Johns.

30. SENATOR JOHNS:

31. Thank you, Mr. President. I move that reading and approval
32. of the Journals of Wednesday, May the 6th, and Thursday, May
33. the 7th, in the year 1981 be postponed pending arrival of the

2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

3. You've heard the motion. Discussion? All in favor say
4. Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Those Journals will
5. be postponed. Resolutions.

7. Senate Resolution 162, offered by Senator Johns.

8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

9. Executive. For what purpose does Senator Geo-Karis arise?

10. SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

11. Mr. President, and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate.
12. I would like to...have as my hyphenated co-sponsor on House
13. Bill 475 in which I'm the principal sponsor.

14. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

15. Is there leave...

16. SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

17. 475. House Bill 475, I'd like to add as...Senator D'Arco
18. as hyphenated co-sponsor to me.

19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

20. There is leave. Senator Johns.

21. SENATOR JOHNS:

22. I'd like to be shown as the hyphenated co-sponsor of Senate
23. Bill 725.

24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

25. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Senator, I think there's
26. already a hyphenated co-sponsor on that already. Senator
27. Gitz is already, I think, co-sponsor. All right. Senator
28. Rock.

29. SENATOR ROCK:

30. Thank you, Mr. President, and Ladies and Gentlemen of
31. the Senate. It's been a long hard week for everyone. We do
32. not, frankly, intend to do a great deal of business. There are,
33. however, I have been informed by the Administration Spokesman,

1. four bills on page 47 of the Calendar that are of an emergency
2. nature. They are Fiscal Year '81 supplemental appropriations,
3. and they are Senate Bills. So, I think it would be in our best
4. interest to get them on over to the House, so that the
5. operation of government will not be curtailed.

6. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

7. We'll get right to those, Senator. The bills are on page
8. 47 of your Calendar, they're appropriation bills. Senator
9. Savickas.

10. SENATOR SAVICKAS:

11. Yes, Mr. President, I would just like the record to show
12. that Senator...Lemke is due...absent due to illness in his family.

13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

14. The Journal will so reflect. Senator Rock.

15. SENATOR ROCK:

16. Thank you. I think the same is true with Senator DeAngelis.

17. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

18. Senator Weaver.

19. SENATOR WEAVER:

20. Senator...Senator DeAngelis is home due to illness in the
21. family, and Senator Bowers is absent because of illness.

22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

23. All right, the Journal will so reflect. Is there leave to
24. go to the Order of Senate Bills 3rd reading? Senator Rock.

25. SENATOR ROCK:

26. While...while we're on this order of announcements, I have
27. and will distribute shortly, the Senate schedule for the weeks
28. of May 18 through 22, May 25 through 29, and the week of June
29. 1 to June 5th, June 9th to June 12, and June 16th to June 19th.
30. These will also contain the proposed committee schedules. So,

13. SENATOR SCHAFFER:

14. Mr. President, and members of the Senate. This bill provides
15. a four hundred thousand dollar supplemental for the Department
16. of Public Health, all Federal Funds and transfers 1.2 million
17. between various line items.

19. Is there discussion? The question is, shall Senate Bill
20. 871 pass. Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed vote Nay.
21. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted
22. who wish? Take the record. On that question, the Ayes are 48,
23. the Nays are none, none Voting Present. Senate Bill 871, having
24. received the required constitutional majority is declared passed.
25. Senate Bill 872. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary, please.

28. (Secretary reads title of bill)

29. 3rd reading of the bill.

30. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

31. Senator Grotberg.

32. SENATOR GROTBORG:

33. Thank you, Likewise with the Department of Corrections, this

1. is a transfer bill, transferring eighty-three thousand dollars
2. from the Centralia Correctional Center's Personal Services line
3. to the Travel and Allowance line for committed, paroled and
4. discharged prisoners as we're running out of gate money, is
5. the name of the game, as they go with these early outs. And
6. I would ask for a favorable roll call.

7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

8. Is there discussion? Is there discussion? The question is,
9. shall Senate Bill 872 pass. Those in favor vote Aye. Those
10. opposed vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who
11. wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that
12. question, the Ayes are 49, the Nays are none, none Voting Present.
13. Senate Bill 872, having received the required constitutional
14. majority is declared passed. Senate Bill 873, Senator Grotberg.

18. (Secretary reads title of bill)

19. 3rd reading of the bill.

20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

21. Senator Grotberg.

22. SENATOR GROTBORG:

23. Thank you, Mr. President. This is a transfer bill...in the
24. Dangerous Drugs Commission FY'81 appropriation by transferring
25. a hundred and thirty-two thousand in General Revenue Funds from
26. the grants-in-aid to the general office. I would seek a
27. favorable roll call.

28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

29. Discussion? The question is, shall Senate Bill 873 pass.
30. Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed vote Nay. The voting
31. is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish?
32. Take the record. On that question, the Ayes are 47, the Nays
33. are none, none Voting Present. Senate Bill 873, having received

1. the required constitutional majority is declared passed. 874,
2. Senator Kent. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary, please.

3. SECRETARY:

4. Senate Bill 874.

5. (Secretary reads title of bill)

7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

8. Senator Kent.

9. SENATOR KENT:

10. Senate Bill 874 amends the FY'81 appropriation for the
11. Department of Veterans Affairs by transferring fifteen thousand
12. dollars in General Revenue Funds among the grant-in-aid line items.

13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

14. All right. Senator Rhoads...is there...is there discussion?
15. Senator Rhoads.

16. SENATOR RHOADS:

17. Several people didn't hear your explanation. This is an
18. OCE or a transfer?

19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

20. Senator Kent.

21. SENATOR KENT:

22. Transfer.

23. SENATOR RHOADS:

24. Is this your first bill, Senator?

25. SENATOR KENT:

26. On the Floor, yes Sir.

27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

28. Further discussion? Further discussion? Senator Kent,
29. anything in defense? Senator Kent.

30. SENATOR KENT:

31. I'd ask for a favorable roll call.

32. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

33. All right. The question is, shall Senate Bill 874 pass.

1. Those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed will vote Nay.
2. The voting is open. Doesn't look good. Have all voted who
3. wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish?
4. Last time. Have all voted who wish? Secretary, we should
5. almost take the record. Take the record. On that question,
6. the Ayes are 48, the Nays are none, 1 Voting Present. Senate
7. Bill 874, having received the required constitutional majority
8. is declared passed. Resolutions. For what purpose does
9. Senator Grotberg arise?

10. SENATOR GROTBORG:

11. To seek leave to become a co-sponsor with Senator
12. Demuzio's Senate Bills 171 and 172.

13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

14. Is there leave? Leave is granted.

15. SENATOR GROTBORG:

16. And there are two more, Mr. President. Of Senator Bloom's
17. 1144 and Senator Geo-Karis' 1167.

18. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

19. Right.

20. SENATOR GROTBORG:

21. Senator Grotberg.

22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

23. Is there leave? Leave is granted. For what purpose does
24. Senator Johns arise?

25. SENATOR JOHNS:

26. I talked it over with Senator Demuzio also yesterday, I
27. want to be a hyphenated co-sponsor of 172.

28. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

29. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Resolutions.

30. SECRETARY:

31. Senate Joint Resolution 45, offered by Senator Rock.

32. (Secretary reads SJR 45)

33. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Rock.

1. SENATOR ROCK:

2. My understanding is that the House was not going to return
3. until 7:00 p.m.

4. SECRETARY:

5. That...this was the information they gave my office, twelve
6. o'clock.

7. SENATOR ROCK:

8. Well, I...I don't want to send them one that they're not
9. going to pass. Let's check...hold it and check it. I...

11. We have...we have some other business, we can...

17. Thank you, Mr. President, and Ladies and Gentlemen of the
18. Senate. Senate Joint Resolution 45 is the adjournment resolution.
19. It calls for us to return to Springfield next Tuesday, May 12th,
20. at the hour of noon. The House, as you know, is coming back on
21. Monday evening. We will return to Springfield Tuesday, at the
22. hour of noon. I'd move for the suspension of the rules and the
23. immediate consideration and adoption of Senate Joint Resolution
24. 45.

25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

26. You've heard the motion to suspend, and the motion to adopt.
27. On the motion to suspend, all in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay.
28. The Ayes have it. On the motion to adopt, all in favor say Aye.
29. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The resolution is adopted. I
30. would want the members to note that the schedule we passed

1. SENATOR BERMAN:

2. I wish to move, regarding House Bill 364 that was read
3. a first time today, to move it to 2nd reading without reference

5. is a transfer...interline transfer bill of the School Problems
6. Commission to authorize the immediate entry of a School Finance
7. Study. I'd move...to waive the applicable rules to move 364...
8. House Bill 364 to the Order of 2nd reading.

9. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

10. You've heard the motion to advance House Bill 364 to the
11. Order of 2nd reading without reference to committee. On that
12. motion, all in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it, and
13. the bill is advanced to the Order of 2nd reading. We're still
14. on the Order of Resolutions. The Resolution Consent Calendar.
15. Resolution Consent Calendar. Mr. Secretary, have any Senators

25. Senator Rhoads joins in the objection. I don't know, Senator
26. Rock, should we hold this off, if we're going to get into con-
27. troversy we...a lot of Gentlemen have left the Floor already.
28. Senator Rock.

29. SENATOR ROCK:

30. I...I too, have objections to birthdays, I have no problem
31. with that.

32. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

33. I think...I will withdraw my objection. I think Senator

1. Keats and Senator Rupp and Senator Rhoads...having no objection,
2. Senator Rock moves the...that the Resolution Consent Calendar
3. be adopted. All in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have
4. it, and the Resolution Consent Calendar is adopted. Senator Philip,
5. for what purpose do you arise?

6. SENATOR PHILIP:

7. Thank you, Mr. President. For the purpose of an announcement.
