3. Welcome to Springfield. Will our guests please stand
4. and be recognized. 440, Senator Lemke. On the Order of
5. Senate Bills 2nd reading, Senate Bill 440. Read the bill,
6. Mr. Secretary.

8. Senate Bill 440.

9. (Secretary reads title of bill)

10. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Revenue offers
11. one amendment.

13. Committee Amendment No. 1, Senator Lemke.

15. This is a...a Enrolling and Engrossing Amendment.

16. PRESIDENT:

17. I...I'm informed it is not an Enrolling and Engrossing
18. Amendment.

19. SECRETARY:

20. Child which may be valued...at the sum of five thousand
21. multiplied by the number resulting by...subtracting such.

22. SENATOR LEMKE:

23. This is...how the bill...so it's clear...it's Enrolling
24. and Engrossing to clear up the language that...it's double
25. language in the bill, this clears up that language...how...how
26. it would apply.

27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

28. ...Is there further discussion? Senator Ozinga.

29. SENATOR OZINGA:

30. What's the clarifying language?

31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

32. Senator Lemke.

33. SENATOR LEMKE:

1. ...It's how they multiply the five thousand dollar deductions
2. as to these minor children.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

4. Senator Ozinga.

5. SENATOR OZINGA:

6. You mean this raises the exemption for a minor child to
7. five thousand dollars?

8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

9. Senator Lemke.

10. SENATOR LEMKE:

11. What this bill...is...is supposed to do is for orphans,
12. it's supposed to raise the exemption for a minor child by
13. those years under twenty-one. In other words, if he's one
14. years old, he gets five thousand dollars times twenty-one, if
15. he's twenty-one years old, he's gets no deduction except
16. twenty thousand dollars. It's for orphans.

17. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

18. Senator Ozinga.

19. SENATOR OZINGA:

20. Senator, I am informed that the amendment is technically
21. incorrect and will not fit on the bill. That's why I'm asking,
22. so that you better check it before you put it to 3rd reading
23. or pass the amendment.

24. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

25. Take the bill out of the record. ...Senate Bill 441,
26. Senator Lemke. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

27. SECRETARY:

28. Senate Bill 441.

29. (Secretary reads title of bill)

30. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

5. ...There...there was a Fiscal Note request filed on this
6. bill, but it has been answered.

7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

8. 3rd reading. Senate Bill 443, Senator Lemke. Read the
9. bill, Mr. Secretary.

10. SECRETARY:

11. Senate Bill 443.

12. (Secretary reads title of bill)

13. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Judiciary I offers
14. one amendment.

15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

16. Senator Lemke.

17. SENATOR LEMKE:

18. This is the amendment that we worked out with the Department
19. of Revenue to take care of the...ethnic and the...youth...athletic
20. clubs under the Bingo Act which are now facing a problem not renewing
21. their license. Senator Becker and I and the Governor's Office
22. worked this language out. It also puts in a date, which is
23. a grandfather clause which allows people that are existing now
24. so in the future anybody after that has to comply with the
25. act. I ask for its adoption.

26. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

27. Further discussion? Senator Demuzio.

28. SENATOR DEMUZIO:

29. Yes, thank you, Mr. President. I'd like to ask the sponsor
30. of the amendment a question, if I may. You indicate that the
31. individuals who are currently operating their bingo license are
32. covered in this amendment. What about those that were operating,
33. let's say, a year ago, such as a...a sporting...a sports club or

1. some civic function of that nature that had been subsequently
2. denied in the last twelve months?

3. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

4. Senator Lemke.

5. SENATOR LEMKE:

6. If you will wait for Amendment No. 2, that allows organizations
7. who were licensed under this act prior to September 21st of 1979.

8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

9. Senator Demuzio.

10. SENATOR DEMUZIO:

11. I patiently await Amendment No. 2, Mr. President.

12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

13. Is there further discussion? If not, the question is shall
14. Amendment No. 1 be adopted to Senate Bill 443. Those in favor
15. indicate by saying Aye. Those opposed? The Ayes have it,
16. Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Any further committee amendments?

17. SECRETARY:

18. No further committee amendments.

19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

20. Any amendments from the Floor?

21. SECRETARY:

22. Amendment No. 2 offered by Senator Lemke.

23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

24. Senator Lemke.

25. SENATOR LEMKE:

26. I just explained it to Senator Demuzio. What it does is
27. allows organizations, associations which were licensed under
28. the act prior to September 21st, 1979 should not be required
29. to meet the organization definitions and requirements which
30. were adopted on that date. In other words, this is the ones
31. that were...licenses were revoked, this would allow them to
32. get their licenses...this...grandfather...and after the date
33. everybody else will have to comply with the act.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

2. Senator Demuzio.

3. SENATOR DEMUZIO:

4. Thank you, Mr. President. Once this amendment goes on
5. and Amendment No. 1, what is now left, who can't obtain a
6. bingo license?

7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

8. Senator Lemke.

9. SENATOR LEMKE:

10. Who can't? Well, there's a lot of people that can't,
11. but what will happen after the date of the enacting of this
12. act, everybody will have to comply with the Bingo Act, as
13. the regulations are now. Everybody before this, would not
14. have to comply because there's a change in the policy of the
15. department. So, this would...by doing this, by putting a
