21.	Senator Netsch is trying to fill a void with this bill, by
22.	providing statutorily for some gubernatorial successions beyond
23.	that which is contained in the Constitution of the State of Illinois
24.	Statutorily she would go to the elected Secretary of State,
25.	the elected Attorney General, the elected Comptroller, and the
26.	elected Treasurer, and then to the officers of the General Assembly
27.	And I have no quarrel with what she's trying to accomplish, but
28.	here's the point I want to make to particularly members of the
29.	Republican side of the aisle, andand maybe in the future to
30.	members of the other side of the aisle as well. We're in a very
31.	unusual situation this particular time, because we have an ap-
32.	pointed Attorney General, Mr. Fahner, and an appointed Secretary
2.2	of State, Mr. Edgar. If, heaven forbid, anything of an untoward

nature happens, such that the Office of Governor and Lieutenant

Governor would become vacant, under Senator Netsch's bill, we ١. would proceed to a Comptroller of the Democratic Party, Mr. 2. Burris, and then to a Treasurer, of the Democratic Party, Treasurer 3. of Illinois, but they were elected as democrats. Under this 4. amendment, I am asking that we follow the same order of succession 5. as Senator Netsch would follow, but preserve the political party 6. identity of the Governor who's vacancy is being filled, i.e., in 7. this case it would be a Republican political identity. So, we R. would go to the elected Comptroller of the same political party 9. as the Governor, the elected Treasurer of the same political party 10. as the Governor, the President of the Senate of the same political 11. party as the Governor, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives 12. of the same political party as the Governor. Now, if none of these 13. individuals were of the same political party, then we would revert 14. to the same order of succession that Senator Netsch has, regardless 15. of political party. I think it's a reasonable amendment, and 16. I would ask for support on the amendment. I would be happy to 17. answer any questions. 18. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE) 19. Is there discussion? Senator Netsch. 20. SENATOR NETSCH: 21. Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Rhoads is correct, I 22. do rise in opposition to the amendment. When the bill was in-23. troduced by me, it was in response to a recognition which I was 24. somewhat surprised about that we had never done anything to implement 25. that section of the Constitution, which provides only for part of 26. the succession in the event that the Governor is...dies in office, 27. resigns, or whatever. It was a surprise to many of us that that had happened. 28. Of course, it did come to our attention because I found that I was

was put in, in absolute good faith, and has nothing to do with

being asked the question, what, given the fact that we do not

have an elected Attorney General, and do not have...and might not

have a Lieutenant Governor, what happens at that point. The bill

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l. present circumstances, and since it appears that the Lieutenant Governor is not going to get a job in Washington now, it probably 2. is not necessary for the present circumstances, but it ought to 3. be done for the future. We just simply ought not to let...let 4. this subject hang. And it seems to me, that the ... what is proposed 5. in the original bill, which is that we follow the basic structure 6. of the...of the constitutional provision as it is, makes great 7. good sense. And I would point out to Senator Rhoads, that in 8. the Constitution, as it now is, where it does provide for the 9. elected Attorney General, and the elected Secretary of State, as 10. the two specified successors in the event that the Governor and 11. Lieutenant Governor disappear from the scene, there is no requirement 12. that they be of the same political party. And I think that what 13. that reflects, is the fact that those individuals have been elected 14. by a State-wide constituency to those...to their respective offices, 15. presumably because the electorate felt that they had merit re-16. gardless of political party. And I think it would really end up 17. discombobulating the entire scheme if we were all of a 18. to put a partisan litmus test into the line of succession. I 19. have...my guess is, that this is not going to be used now, and 20. hopefully never, but I don't think we ought to play games with 21. the Constitution just simply to take care of that kind of a 22. partisan concern. 23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE) 24.

Further discussion? Further discussion? Senator Rhoads may close.

SENATOR RHOADS:

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Thank you, Mr. President. I didn't, in any way, mean to suggest that Senator Netsch didn't offer the bill in good faith, obviously she did, and I compliment her for trying to fill this vacuum and meet a need. I do think that the principle of maintaining a partisan victory, if you will, is...is an important one, that people do vote at that level, at the gubernatorial level, for

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I rise in opposition. I think this is even more absurd than Senator Rhoads, and it really does play game...games with the process. I would point out to you, that...we have a serious question, we ought to implement the constitutional provision, and we ought not to do it in a petty partisan approach. Right now, the Constitution specifies that the elected Attorney General and the elected Secretary of State are next in line after the Governor and Lieutenant Governor. They could well be of the opposite political party from the Governor, and as a matter of fact, if you look back in history, I think you will find that the office that has most often been of the opposite political party from the Chief Executive, is that of Secretary of State. So, you already have that built into the constitutional succession, and I don't see any reason to play games with the pattern that is already established by this kind of an amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Further discussion? Further discussion? Senator Nimrod may close.
