PRESIDENT:

The Senate will please come to order. Will those not entitled to the Floor please vacate. Members please be at their desks. Will our guests in the gallery please rise. Prayer this afternoon by the Reverend Laurie Tockey, Chaplain from Western State Hospital, Fort Steilacoom, Washington.

REVEREND LAURIE TOCKEY:

(Prayer given by Reverend Tockey)

PRESIDENT:

Alright. Turn the cameras off, please. Reading of the Journal.

SECRETARY:

Thursday, May the 20th, 1982.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Johns.

SENATOR JOHNS:

Thank you, Mr. President. I move that the Journal just read by the Secretary be approved unless some Senator has additions or corrections to offer.

PRESIDENT:

You've heard the motion as placed by Senator Johns. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. Motion carries. It's so ordered. Senator Johns.

SENATOR JOHNS:

Mr. President, I move that reading and approval of the Journals of Monday, May the 24th; Tuesday, May the 25th; Wednesday, May the 26th; Thursday, May the 27th; Tuesday, June the 1st; Wednesday, June the 2nd; Thursday, June the 3rd, in the year of 1982 be postponed pending arrival of the printed Journal.

PRESIDENT:

You've heard the motion as placed by Senator Johns. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All

opposed. The Ayes have it. The motion carries. It's so ordered. Resolutions.

SECRETARY:

Senate Resolution 569 offered by Senators Hall, Rock and all Senators, and it's congratulatory.

PRESIDENT:

SECRETARY:

Senate Resolution 570 offered by Senator Davidson and all Senators, and it's congratulatory.

PRESIDENT:

Consent Calendar. Alright, with leave of the Body, we'll go to Page 2 on the Calendar, on the Order of House Bills 2nd Reading. 1033, Senator... (Machine cut-off)... 1296... 1296, Senator Netsch. 1302, Senator Netsch. 1648, Senator Sangmeister. 1902, Senator... Senator Sangmeister. On the Order of House Bills 2nd Reading is House Bill 1648. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

House Bill 1648.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDENT:

Are there amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDENT:

3rd reading. 1924, Senator Joyce. 2221, Senator Grotberg. 2310, Senator Grotberg. 2359, Senator Berman. 2425, Senator Rupp. 2441, Senator Bloom. 2451, Senator Coffey. 2485, Senator Jeremiah Joyce. 2503, Senator Etheredge. Alright. 2485. On the Order of House Bills 2nd Reading, the bottom of Page 3 is House Bill 2485. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

2nd Reading

SECRETARY:

House Bill 2485.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. Committee on Revenue offers one amendment.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Joyce.

SENATOR JEREMIAH JOYCE:

Yes, Mr. President, Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 2485 is a technical amendment. I ask for its adoption.

PRESIDENT:

Alright, Senator Joyce has moved the adoption of Committee Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 2485. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Are there further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further committee amendments.

PRESIDENT:

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDENT:

3rd reading. Senator Donnewald, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR DONNEWALD:

For two purposes, Mr. President. First of all, Senator Carroll is absent due to illness in his family, I want the record to so show. And the other announcement is that we will have a meeting of the Rules Committee in Room 400 immediately after adjournment for the purpose of discharging certain bills only.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Marovitz, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

With leave of the Body, I'd like leave to discharge the Committee on Local Government on House Bill 1060 and reassign the bill to Executive Committee. I've checked with the chairman of the committee and the minority spokesman and received approval.

PRESIDENT:

Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The motion carries. It's so ordered. Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL:

Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I would like to have leave of the Body to have Finance and Credit Regulations, and the bill is 958 and be rereferred to the Labor and Commerce Committee. I've cleared this with both chairmen and also with Senator Donnewald who's assignment of the bills.

PRESIDENT:

You've heard the motion as placed by Senator Hall. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. Motion carries. It's so ordered. Senator Bloom.

SENATOR BLOOM:

Thank you, Mr. President. I'd like the record to reflect that Senator Somner is absent today because of illness, and I'd also like the Chair to know the sponsor of House Bill 608, Senator Berman, would like the sponsorship to read Berman, Bloom and Nash. Okay.

PRESIDENT:

Alright. Senator Bloom asks leave to show himself and Senators Nash as co-sponsors of House Bill 608. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. Senator Sangmeister.

SENATOR SANGHEISTER:

Yes, as the Senate sponsor of House Bill 396, I would

like to show Senator Nash as a co-sponsor of House Bill 396.

PRESIDENT:

Alright. Leave has been requested to show Senator Nash as a co-sponsor of House Bill 396. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. Further business to come before the Senate? Senator Bruce.

SENATOR BRUCE:
