PRESIDENT:

The Senate will please come to order. Our prayer this afternoon by the Reverend Eugene Weitzel, Director of Chaplains from St. John's Hospital in Springfield. Father.

REVEREND EUGENE WEITZEL:

(Prayer given by Reverend Weitzel)

PRESIDENT:

Thank you, Father. Reading of the Journal.

SECRETARY:

Monday, June the...21st; Tuesday, June the 22nd; Wednesday, June the 23rd; Thursday, June the 24th; Friday, June the 25th; Saturday, June the 26th; Sunday, June the 27th; Monday, June the 28th; Tuesday, June the 29th; Wednesday, June the 30th; Thursday, July the 1st and Friday, July the 2nd, in the year 1982.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Vadalabene.

SENATOR VADALABENE:

Yes, thank you, Mr...thank you, Mr. President. I move that the Journals just read by the Secretary be approved unless some Senator has additions or corrections to offer.

PRESIDENT:

You've heard the motion as placed by Senator Vadalabene. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. Motion carries. It is so ordered. Resolutions.

SECRETARY:

Senate Resolution...Senate Resolution 660, offered by Senators Rock, Donnewald, Savickas, and Carroll and all Senators, and it's a death resolution.

Senate Resolution 661, offered by the same sponsors, and it's a death resolution.

Senate Resolution 662, offered by Senator Rock and all Democrat Senators, and it's a death resolution.

Senate Resolution 663, offered by Senator DeAngelis. It's a congratulatory resolution.

PRESIDENT:

Consent Calendar. Resolutions.

SECRETARY:

Resolution 664 and 665, offered by Senator Lemke, and they're congratulatory.

PRESIDENT:

Consent Calendar. For what purpose does Senator Donnewald arise?

SENATOR DONNEWALD:

Well, probably twofold. First of all, I think it...if we could have the attention of the Body, I'd like to call attention to the fact that we have a new Senator within our midst, just sworn in the last few hours or days, and that happens to be Senator Ted Lechowicz.

PRESIDENT:

Senator, welcome. Senator Donnewald.

SENATOR DONNEWALD:

If we are on the Order of Motions, are...are we or are we not, Mr. President?

PRESIDENT:

Yes.

SENATOR DONNEWALD:

Alright. I move to dispense with the reading of the Governor's Veto Messages, that they be entered upon the Journal and a copy of each Message be placed on the desk of each member.

PRESIDENT:

You've heard the motion as placed by Senator Donnewald. We have a number of Messages received from the Governor. Rather than reading them all, we'll just have them journalized and a copy of...will be placed on every member's desk. Any discussion on the motion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. Motion carries. So ordered. Channel 7 has requested leave to film the proceedings, so if everybody will put on their best smile and get the right profile. Leave granted? Leave is granted. Yes. On the Order of Motions, Senator Bruce. On the Order of Motions. Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Motion in writing. I move to discharge...Senate Committee on Higher Education from further consideration of House Bill 746, and that the bill be read a second time today and be advanced to the Order of 3rd Reading. Signed, Senator Bruce.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Bruce.

SENATOR BRUCE:

Yes, Mr. President. This is relating to the community college...community college funding. We're not going to take any final action on this, but when we passed the rate bill for community colleges last session, in the corporate per-

sonal property tax date on which you make the determination of how much money a community college has gotten for charge backs, the date October of 1980 remained in the bill. It must be removed...moved forward to calendar year 1981, and this bill, once it gets out on the Floor if it is discharged from the Committee on Higher Education, we will put that amendment on. Everyone will have a chance to take a look at it over the next week and a half and we would pass it on the first day we're back on the 17th. And I have talked to the committee chairman, he understands it; and I understand the Minority Leader has also been advised. I would move to discharge the Committee on Higher Education from further consideration of House Bill 746.

PRESIDENT:

You've heard the motion as placed by Senator Bruce. Any discussion? Senator Etheredge. No. Okay. Senator Newhouse. Alright. You've heard the motion. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The motion carries. House Bill 746 is discharged. It will now be read a second time, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

House Bill 746.

(Secretary reads title of bill) 2nd reading of the bill.

PRESIDENT:

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDENT:

3rd reading. Alright. On the Order of House Bills 2nd Reading is House Bill 746. The Secretary advises that an amendment has been filed. Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 1 offered by Senators Bruce and Etheredge.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Bruce.

SENATOR BRUCE:

This amendment does what we explained earlier. It deletes everything in the bill and puts back in a new rate bill for the community colleges with the correct corporate personal property assessment date, and that will be calendar year 1981 rather than October of 1980. Every community college in the State would like to have this so that they get full access to the corporate personal property tax replacement fund.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Bruce moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 746. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Are there further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDENT:

3rd reading. Resolutions.

SECRETARY:

Senate Joint Resolution 110, offered by Senator Bruce.

(Secretary reads SJR 110) PRESIDENT:

Senator Bruce.

SENATOR BRUCE:

Thank you. This is the adjournment resolution. I would move for the suspension of the rules and immediate consideration and adoption of the resolution, which will have us adjourn today and come back on noon on November 17th.

PRESIDENT:

You've heard the motion. All in favor of the move to suspend the rules indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The rules are suspended. Senator Bruce now moves the adoption of Senate Joint Resolution 110. Any

discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The resolution is adopted.
Introduction of bills.

SECRETARY:

Senate Bill 1690, offered by Senators...introduced by Senators Philip, Weaver, Grotberg and DeAngelis.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd...1st reading of the bill.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Philip moves to suspend the applicable rules, so that Senate Bill 1690 can be assigned to the Committee on Appropriations. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. So ordered.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (Senator Bruce)

That's it. Is there leave to go to the Order of Resolutions Consent Calendar? Leave is granted. Resolution Consent Calendar. Mr. Secretary, have any members filed objections to the resolutions filed with your office?

SECRETARY:

No objections have been filed, Mr. President.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (Senator Bruce)

Hearing no objections, Senator Rock moves that the resolutions contained on the Resolution Consent Calendar be adopted. On the motion, is there discussion? All in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The resolutions are adopted. Any further business to come before the Senate? Senator Rock.

SENATOR ROCK:

Thank you, Mr. President. It appears there is no further business. I would move that we...the Senate stand adjourned until the 17th of November at the hour of noon. I urge all the members to get some well-deserved rest, and we'll come back on the 17th ready to go.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (Senator Bruce)

Motion is to adjourn. Discussion? All in favor say Aye.
Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The Senate stands adjourned
