For what purpose does Senator Gec-Karis arise?

SENATOR GEC-KARIS:

I would like to, if I may, take sponsorship of House Bill 670 that was read into the record and 1584. I don't know...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Just bring your request down to the Secretary and we'll take care of it.

SENATOR GEC-KARIS:

Alright. In the meantime,...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Yes, Senator Geo-Karis.

SENATOR GEC-KARIS:

...on a point of personal privilege. Last night, the home town awards were granted to a number of municipalities out of ninety-two that competed for the home town awards. I'm very happy to tell you that two of my municipalities took three first prize awards. The City of Waukegan took the first prize award for their crime stopper program for crime prevention, and the Village of Round Lake Beach took two first prize awards. First...one first prize was for their

great work in their youth commission and youth efforts, the second was for their economic development. And it's my pleasure to introduce to this Assembly today four folks that are here from Round Lake Beach. James and Sandy Pairr, F-A-I-H-R, who worked very hard on the youth program; Jean Lange, L-A-N-G-E, and her daughter who is probably the youngest trustee in our county of a village...and of the Village of Round Lake Beach, Corene Lange, L-A-N-G-E. Senator...Senate Bill 31, Senator Collins. Senator D'Arco, on 37. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary, please.

2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Are there amendments from the floor?

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Geo-Karis.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Geo-Karis on Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, amendment...my...my amendment amends Senate Bill 37, on page 3, in line 16 by providing that...by deleting the words "such conviction" and inserting in lieu thereof "completion of sentence." And I move the passage of this amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Motion is to adopt Amendment No. 1. Discussion of the motion? Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Further amendments?

3rd reading. Is there leave to return to Senate Bill 22? Leave is granted. Senate Bill 22, 2nd reading, Mr. Secretary.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Are there amendments from the floor?

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Jeremiah Joyce.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Joyce on Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR JEREMIAH JOYCE:

Yes, Mr. President, would you ask the...would the Secretary tell me the LRE Number on Amendment No. 1?

SECRETARY:

This was the last one you...you gave me, Senator Joyce. It's SDS83, it appears to be S, as in Sam, 22FAM1.

SENATOR JEREMIAH JOYCE:

Thank you. Yes, Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 22 comes at the request of the...of the trustees of the...of the various pension funds. It was discussed in committee, the committee agreed with it, and I ask for its adoption at this time.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Motion is to adopt Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 22. On the motion to adopt, is there discussion? Those in favor say

Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Are there further...amendments?

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 2 offered by Senator Degnan.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Senator...Senator Degnan is recognized.

SENATOR DEGNAN:

I'd like leave to withdraw the amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Is there leave? Leave is granted. The amendment is withdrawn.

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 2 offered by Senator Jeremiah Joyce.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Senator Jeremiah Joyce.

SENATOR JEREMIAH JOYCE:

Ask leave to Table Amendment No. 2...withdraw.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Senator Joyce withdraws Amendment No. 2. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

3rd reading. Senate Bill 23, Senator Jeremiah Joyce. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary, please.

SECRETARY:

Senate Bill 23.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Are there amendments from the floor?

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Jeremiah Joyce.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Senator Joyce on Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR JEREMIAH JOYCE:

Thank you, Mr. President. Amendment No. 1 is merely technical in nature. It sets out specifically what the intent of the bill is, and that is to guarantee the home rule provision which is the purpose of the legislation. I ask for its adoption at this time.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Motion is to adopt Amendment No. 1. On the motion, those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

3rd reading. Senate Bill 89, Senator Maitland. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary, please.

SECRETARY:

Senate Bill 89.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Are there amendments from the floor?

SECRETARY:

No floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

3rd reading. Senate Bill 99, Senator Egan. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary, please.

SECRETARY:

Senate Bill 99.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. Committee on Revenue offers one amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

...Amendment No. 1, Senator Egan.

SENATOR EGAN:

Yes, Mr. President and members of the Senate, Amendment No. 1 which was adopted in the committee reduces the amount from forty-five hundred to thirty-five hundred, and I move its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Motion is to adopt Amendment No. 1. Discussion? Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further...no further committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Are there amendments from the floor?

SECRETARY:

No floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

3rd reading. Senate Bill 123, Senator Berman. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary, please.

SECRETARY:

Senate Bill 123.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. Committee on Public Health, Welfare and Correction offers five amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Berman on Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR BERMAN:

Mr. President, there's a floor amendment filed which deletes everything after the enacting clause. So, I think what I'll do is move on one motion to adopt one through five and then go to the floor amendment because that will take everything else out.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Berman, if you would just Table the first five, it would save Enrolling and Engrossing a ton of time.

SENATOR BERMAN:

That's even better. I move to...I move to Table Committee Amendments 1 through 5. This bill, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, Mr. President,...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

May we have some order, please.

SENATOR BERMAN:

...started out as creating a new Act called the Experimental Cancer Treatment Act. There were several provisions in the bill and several amendments adopted to it in committee which related to the questions of creating a...an experimental cancer treatment board and requiring informed consent affidavits to be filed by patients and doctors. After substantial consultation with recognized experts and organizations in the cancer treatment field, those parts of the bill which were adopted in committee have been supplemented and replaced by the Floor amendment which I will offer in a few moments. So, that is the reason why I'm moving to Table Committee Amendments 1 through 5.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Motion to Table. Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Committee Amendments 1 through 5 are Tabled. For what purpose does Senator Figney arise?

SENATOR HIGNEY:

Mr. President, for the purposes of an introduction. In the President's gallery, the eighth grade class from Steward, Illinois in Lee County.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Would our guests from Steward please rise and be recognized by the Senate. Senator Berman on Amendment No. 6. May we have some order, please, Ladies and Gentlemen. Senator Berman on Amendment No. 6.

SENATOR BERMAN:

Alright. Mr. Secretary, this is the Floor amendment, is

that correct?

SECRETARY:

Yes.

SENATOR EERMAN:

Alright. Amendment No. 6 incorporates some of the amendments that have just been Tabled and, in effect, is the bill upon adoption. It creates the Cancer Treatment Act, it provides the stated categories of medical providers that are enabled under this Act to treat cancer; it spells out the violations as a Class 4 felony for violation of those stated professions that can treat it; it gives enforcement powers to the Attorney General and state's attorneys, and provides for the Department of Public Health to act as a clearing house for cancer treatment information. I move to adopt Amendment No. 6.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Motion is to adopt Amendment No. 6. Discussion? Senator Darrow.

SENATOR DARROW:

Will the sponsor yield?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Indicates he will yield, Senator Darrow.

SENATOR DARROW:

Does this amendment have any...anything to do with chiropractic medicine or have any reference to chiropractors?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Senator Eerman.

SENATOR EERMAN:

The amendment does not relate...does not state chiropracting. It is in keeping the bill and the amendment...it is in keeping with the discussions that I've had with both chiropractic societies. I have shown it to my own personal chiropractic adviser, Senator Davidson, and they are in agreement with...with this bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Senator Davidson.

SENATOR DAVIDSON:

I rise in support of the amendment. This amendment was worked out between all the parties...particularly we who have more than a normal interest in this little amendment, and it's okay.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Motion is to adopt. Further discussion? Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 6 is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

3rd reading. Senate Bill 168, Senator Demuzio. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary, please.

SECRETARY:

Senate Bill 168.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Energy offers one amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Senator Demuzio.

SENATOR DEMUZIO:

Yes, thank you, very much, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen. I...I would seek leave to Table Committee Amendment No. 1 and adopt an amendment that has been filed with the Secretary. There was basically a...a problem into expanding the time period for the Pollution Control Board, and as a result, I think this amendment will do that, and as a result, would save Enrolling and Engrossing some time. So, I move to Table Committee Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Motion is to Table Amendment No. 1. Those in favor say

Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 1 is Tabled. Amendment No. 2, Senator Demuzio.

SENATOR DEMUZIO:

Yes, what this amendment now does, and it does have the support of the Environmental Protection Agency and the Pollution Control Board, it directs the Pollution Control Board to issue rules and regulations to implement the Act. The committee amendment...or the original bill had sixty days, this would expand that period of time now to almost nine months. It also directs the EPA to determine those wastes that shall be prohibited from landfills. The amendment is identical in intent to the effect of the amendment that was adopted in committee, and it will keep those liquid hazardous wastes that have the potential of entering ground water from being disposed of in landfills. I've discussed the amendment with the other side of the aisle and I know of no known opposition on the Floor at this time.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR RUCE)

Senator Demuzio moves the adoption of Floor Amendment No. 2. On the motion, those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 2 is adopted. Further amendments?"

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 3 by Senator Demuzio.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR RUCE)

Senator Demuzio, Floor Amendment No. 3.

SENATOR DEMUZIO:

Yes, thank you, very much. This is an amendment that was also suggested to us. It's to minimize the adverse consequences of land disposal when the treatment has been considered not to be feasible. Land disposal should not be considered environmentally acceptable just because it's a temporarily expedient. It, too, I think is a noncontroversial amendment, would move for its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Motion is to adopt Amendment No. 3. Discussion? Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 3 is adopted. Further Floor amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

3rd reading. Senate Bill 187, Senator Demuzic. Purchase gas adjustment clauses. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary, please.

SECRETARY:

Senate Bill...187.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Energy offers one amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Senator Jerome Joyce on Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR JEROME JOYCE:

Thank you, Mr. President. Amendment No. 1 deletes everything after the enacting clause...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

This is a committee amendment, Senator.

SENATOR JEROME JOYCE:

Oh. Table it.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Motion is to Table Committee Amendment No. 1. Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Committee Amendment No. 1 is Tabled. Further committee amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Are there amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 2 offered by Senator Jerome Joyce.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Senator Joyce.

SENATOR JEROME JOYCE:

Thank you, Mr. President. This deletes everything after the enacting clause and puts in this bill the Citizens Utility Board, the construction work in progress...stopping of construction work in progress, the consumer counsel for the Attorney General's office, does away with the lobbying and advertising and the winter shut-off. Now, what is not in this bill is an elected Commerce Commission and the fuel transportation clause. Those two items are not in this bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Motion is to adopt Amendment No. 2. On the...or the motion, is there discussion? Senator Grotherg. Can we move in front of Senator Grotherg, Senator Schaffer?

SENATOR GROTHERG:

Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Joyce, because, again, of the magnitude...and if this is the vehicle that you think is going to travel, let's go through it. Give us a word or two on each of the subjects, CDE...CUB is in it, and describe each of those items a little, if you would for the record.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Senator Jerome Joyce.

SENATOR JEROME JOYCE:

The bill has the Citizens Utility Board in it which is an eleven member board. This board will have six members from outside Cook County, five members from inside Cook County, it will be politically independent, it will be financed by contributions from customers at the rate to...to be determined by the interim board which will be appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate, and so forth and so on. If there's any further questions about CUB, I'd be glad to...answer. Then, the next is eliminating construction work in progress. I think that's self-explanatory. Next is

the consumer counsel asked for by the Attorney General, and perhaps Senator Demuzic could explain that better than I. I would yield to Senator Demuzic.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Demuzic.

SENATOR DEMUZIC:

This is a consumer counsel, s-e-l, in the Attorney General's office paid for out of the...the public utility tax. It is identical to the provisions that are in Senate Bill 5. Senator Joyce has explained it adequately. Everything is in this amendment with the exception of the elected Commerce Commission is not included and also the transportation cost.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Further discussion? Senator Grotberg. I would remind the members we are on the...on an amendment to a bill.

SENATOR GROTEBERG:

I'll wait for 3rd reading on some of those questions, but my question is, how come the Attorney General gets a consumer counsel?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Further discussion? Senator Rigney.

SENATOR RIGNEY:

Mr. President, two questions, if I may. First of all, who's going to be doing the collecting of the funds under the CUB, is that still going to be the responsibility of the utility?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Jerome Joyce.

SENATOR JEROME JOYCE:

Yes, they're...with their bills, they're going to send out the little thing you check off. They would have to collect, yes.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Rigney.

SENATOR RIGNEY:

In regard to the construction work in progress, is there any timetable on this, any phase in or is it...does it all come off at once?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Jerome Joyce.

SENATOR JEROME JOYCE:

Yes, it all comes off at once.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Further discussion? Senator Davidson.

SENATOR DAVIDSON:

On the stopping construction in progress, I wasn't sure I got that whole part, are you talking about stopping nuclear power stations in progress or are you talking about they cannot put into the present rate costs of a construction in progress?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Jerome Joyce.

SENATOR JEROME JOYCE:

You're correct on the latter, they cannot put in the rate of construction in progress. Yes.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Further discussion? Further discussion? On the motion to adopt, those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 2 is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

3rd reading. Senate Bill 197, Senator Fock. Senate Bill 209, Senator D'Arco. Senate Bill 305, Senator Dawson. Is Senator Dawson on the floor? Read the bill, Mr. Secretary, please. Senate Bill 305.

SECRETARY:

Senate Bill 305.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

It would extend the cure period to six months after a foreclosure suit has been filed. It allows the court, upon the application by the borrower, to extend the redemption period on a foreclosure sales of farm property as the court deems just and equitable and repeals the law after two years. I would urge for adoption of the amendment.

They would have to require workman corp. insurance for their employees. A roofing contractor that employs a person would have to require workman comp. insurance as well as liability insurance.

On the Order of Senate Bills 2nd Reading, Senate Bill 71, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 3 offered by Senator Netsch.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Netsch.

SENATOR NEISCH:

Thank you, Mr. President. The amendment, which was prepared with the permission of the sponsor of the bill and at the...with help in terms of coverage from the Adjutant General's Office, provides that where the sale price of the Army...Armory exceeds three and a half million dollars and the Armory is located in a county with a population of one million or more, the authorization of the General Assembly will be required for the sale of such armory. The basic program of the bill I understand and do not object to at all. The concern is that some armories and one, in particular, at Chicago Avenue that has enormous value might be sold without any input from the Illinois General Assembly. This amendment would make clear that that could not happen, and it probably affects, at the moment, only one armory, that at Chicago Avenue.

PRESIDENT:

nify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

PRESIDENT:

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 1, Senator Marovitz...I hear...

PRESIDENT:

Senator Marovitz.

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate. Having voted on the prevailing side...on Amendment No. 1, I move that the Senate do reconsider the Bill by which Amendment No. 1 was adopted to Senate Bill 188.

PRESIDENT:

Alright. Senator Marovitz has moved to reconsider the vote by which Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 188 was adopted. All in favor of the motion to reconsider indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. If you will turn to page 57 on the Calendar, there is a series of bills which were on the Agreed List, which apparently are now subject to amendment. They will obviously then now come off the Agreed List. We will deal with them in the ordinary course of business, about the 15th of July, John. Don't get nervous...don't get nervous. Turn to page 57, on the Order of Senate Bills 3rd Reading, Senate Bill 418. Senator D'Arco seeks leave of the Body to return that bill to the Order of 2nd Reading for purposes of an amendment. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. On the Order of Senate Bills 2nd Reading, Senate Bill 418, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator D'Arco.

PRESIDENT:

Senator D'Arco.

SENATOR D'ARCO:

Alright. Thank you, Mr. President. I just hope Senator Rupp is in his chair and listening to these amendments, because I know he is vitally interested in what these amendments do, because it affects all these condominiums in his district, and these are condominium amendments from the Joint Condominium Study Commission. And this bill was on the Agreed...all these bills were on the Agreed Bill list, and we tried to adopt these amendments but there was some objection, so here we go. Amendment No. 2...

PRESIDENT:

Senator D'Arco, before we start, Senator Rupp seeks recognition. Senator Rupp, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR RUPP:

Since my name was used, I would like to make just a few remarks right at this time.

PRESIDENT:

It was not used in vain, but you're certainly entitled to the floor.

SENATOR RUPP:

Oh, thank you. Alright. No...in this particular instance, and I do think it was a little unusual for a technical amendment to be a complete rewrite after the enacting clause. That is why I asked about it, I feel I would have been remiss if I had not. I don't have any further questions as long as Senator D'Arco will state that there are no substantive changes and that there aren't any questions from any other Senators. I think it was...it was my responsibility to ask in such a situation because it was unusual.

PRESIDENT:

Your point is well-taken. Thank God, it's Friday. Senator Degnan, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR DEGNAN:

Yes, thank you, Mr. President. On a point of personal privilege.

PRESIDENT:

I would like to introduce in the gallery, the students, teachers and parents from Healy School in Chicago.

PRESIDENT:

Will our guests in the gallery please rise and be...recognized. Welcome to Springfield. Senator D'Arco, on Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill 418.

SENATOR D'ARCO:

Thank you, Mr. President. Amendment No. 2 makes certain changes and references and also changes some of the language, but simply are word changes without any substantive changes; and in Section 2.1 it also makes some reference changes. So there is really nothing substantive about Amendment No. 2.

PRESIDENT:

Alright. Senator D'Arco has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill 418. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 3 offered by Senator D'Arco.

PRESIDENT:

Senator D'Arco.

SENATOR D'ARCO:

Amendment No. 3 adds the...the two bills that were inadvertently not added on in the Senate, and...I'm talking about the House bills that we inadvertently did not add on here, and those bills, obviously, are substantive in change and

they solved the double taxation problem that condominium associations are facing when they have property that is jointly owned by more than one association. That's in...in one of the House Bills and would be in Amendment No. 3 to Senate Bill 418. And the other...the other bill would require the bylaws to be recorded separately from the declaration. Under the present law, that is not in effect and that is a necessary change. There are other changes that I will not specify, unless some Senate...Senator desires me to do so, and I move to adopt Amendment No. 3 to Senate Bill 418.

PRESIDENT:

Senator D'Arco has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 3 to Senate Bill 418. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

PRESIDENT:

3rd reading. 432, on the Order of the Agreed Bill List, page 57, on the Order of Senate Bills 3rd Reading, Senate Bill 432. Senator D'Arco seeks leave of the Body to return that bill to the Order of 2nd Reading for purposes of an amendment. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. On the Order of Senate Bills 2nd Reading, Senate Bill 432, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator D'Arco.

PRESIDENT:

Senator D'Arco.

SENATOR D'ARCO:

What was inadvertently left out of the bill, was the fact that if...if there is an election, the election has to take place prior to the board of managers and the association and

that election was not specified in the bill. So, this would...this amendment would specify the election. It would also provide that when there is an unconscionable contract, instead of the language we put in the bill, it would have to go to a circuit court and be litigated at that point, rather than setting out the procedure in the Act, and I would move to adopt Amendment No. 1 to 432.

PRESIDENT:

Senator D'Arco has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 432. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDENT:

This changed the notice provisions in a action for possession under the Forceable Detainer Act, and it changes it from a formal notice to an informational notice, and it also gives notice to tenants that are not parties to the proceedings, and I would move to adopt Amendment No. 1 to 433.

PRESIDENT:

Alright. Senator D'Arco has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 433. Any discussion? If not, all

in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDENT:

3rd reading. On the Order of Senate Bills 3rd Reading, Senate Bill 434. Senator D'Arco seeks leave of the Body to return that bill to the Order of 2nd Reading for purposes of an amendment. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. On the Order of Senate Bills 2nd Reading, Senate Bill 434, Mr. Secretary.

This provides a mechanism where the minority unit...unit owners can have representation on the board when the developer is still in control, and it provides that certain percentages taking effect, the unit owner would have minority representation, even though the association does not...is not formally constituted and the developer still has control, and I would move to adopt Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDENT:

Senator D'Arco's has moved to adopt Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 434. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDENT:

3rd reading. On the Order of Senate Bills 3rd Reading, Senate Bill 436. Senator D'Arco seeks leave of the Body to return that bill to the Order of 2nd Reading for purposes of

an amendment. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. On the Order of Senate Bills 2nd Reading, Senate Bill 436, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator D'Arco.

PRESIDENT:

Senator D'Arco.

SENATOR D'ARCO:

Thank you, Mr. Chairman. What we have in Illinois are called master associations, where one or more condo unit owners associations get together and form an umbrella association. This has not been codified into law, and this amendment would codify that into law and the procedures and mechanisms whereby the association would operate, and I would move to adopt Amendment No. 1 to...

PRESIDENT:

Alright. Senator D'Arco has moved to...the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 436. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

PRESIDENT:

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 1 offered by Senators Etheredge and Epp.

PRESIDENT:

This is on page 21 of the Calendar, 477, Senator Etheredge.

SENATOR ETHEREDGE:

Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, this amendment would require the Department of Revenue to publish annually a report, identifying the number of dollars derived from each county through the levy of the personal income tax. I would move its adoption.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Etheredge has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 477. Any discussion? Senator Lechcwick.

SENATOR LECHCWICZ:

Thank...thank you, Mr. President. I question the germaneness of the amendment.

Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Bruce.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Is there leave for Senator Carroll to handle the amendment? Leave is granted. Senator Carroll.

SENATOR CARROLL:

But the Commonwealth Edison could hold on to the money and not pay it to the State, because it was exempt. So, what this does is exempts it all the way through.

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Lemke.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Lemke.

SENATOR LEMKE:

This is the same amendment we put on 1106. This bill deals with the exemption of religious institutions from utility tax, and this does the same thing I explained in 1106. It makes it, the exemption, completely true and where Edison can't collect the money and hold on to it.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Lemke.

SENATOR LEMKE:

My staff tells me it widens it just a little.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Senator Etheredge.

SENATOR ETHEREDGE:

Do you have an estimate as to what the new fiscal impact would be?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Senator Lemke.

SENATOR LEMKE:

No, but since the bill itself had an insignificant amount of fiscal impact, I think the new definition wouldn't even raise the fiscal impact above a million.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Senator Etheredge.

SENATOR ETHEREDGE:

I...I would hope that we would have some updated information in regard to fiscal impact when we reach 3rd reading.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Senator Lemke.

SENATOR LEMKE:

I advise you the staff says they're getting the fiscal impact.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Alright, the motion is to adopt Amendment No. 2. Discussion? Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 2 is adopted. Further amendments?

SENATOR GEC-KARIS:

Would our guests in the galleries please rise and be recognized by the Senate. Welcome to Springfield. Senator Fock, on 87 were there other amendments?

SENATOR ROCK:

Yes, I just wanted everybody to know that that's why Senator Gec-Karis did that, all those kids are for 87...get it moved back.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Well, I...I...I apologize. I thought Senator Gec-Karis had a comment concerning the amendment, and it would help the Chair if we can try to catch the Chair's eye on these introductions when we're sort of at a lull, it will help us. Are there amendments, Mr. Secretary, to 87?

SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

3rd reading. Senator Rock was presiding when we got to Senate Bill 1000. Is there leave to return Senate Bill 1000 to the Order of 2nd Reading for the purpose of amendment? Leave is granted. Are there amendments, Mr. Secretary?

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 2 offered by Senator Rock.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Senator Rock on Amendment No. 2.

SENATOR ROCK:

Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. Amendment No. 2 is a cleanup amendment. We adopted in committee a rather lengthy amendment, and in consultation with the Reference Bureau there was some technical changes that have to be made. I would...Amendment No. 2 effectively amends Amendment No. 1. I would move its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Motion is to adopt Amendment No. 2. Discussion? Those in favor say Aye. Opposed say Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 2 is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Senator Keats, you have an amendment to Senate Bill 1000?

SECRETARY:

Amendment...Amendment No. 3 offered by Senator Keats.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Would you care to explain it?

SENATOR KEATS:

What Amendment No. 3 does with Senate Bill 1000 is, it does not really touch the basic impact to Senate Bill 1000 which is the Prairie State Two Thousand Retraining Fund. This sets up a...a second mechanism that allows for...if there is a job opening and you want to train people for it, you, as a company, can do it internally and receive the same benefits as if you hired someone else to do it. That was a major complaint we had with the formulas, that someone else is doing the training. This amendment says, if you have jobs available, go ahead and hire them, train them yourself and you get the same benefits as if you had the State training them. There should be no direct cost, although in the long-term, there could be a tax cost.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Motion is to adopt Amendment No. 3. On the motion, those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 3 is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

3rd reading. Is there leave to go to the Order of Resolutions? Leave is granted. Resolutions.

SECRETARY:

Senate Resolution 177 offered by Senators Eberman, Carroll and all Senators, it's commendatory.

Senate Resolution 178 offered by Senator Zitz, it's congratulatory.

Senate Resolution 179 offered by Senator Sangmeister, it's congratulatory.

Senate Resolution 180 offered by Senator Bruce and all Senators, and it's congratulatory.

And Senate Joint Resolution 44 offered by Senator Sangmeister.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Consent Calendar. Senator Bruce, do you seek recognition? Senator Bruce.

SENATOR BRUCE:

Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate. I'd like to have leave of the Body to take Senate Resolution 80, which I believe we just placed on the Consent Calendar, and have that...to suspend the rules and have that brought before the Body...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

180.

SENATOR BRUCE:

...180. Senate Bill...Resolution 180.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Senator Bruce has moved to suspend the rules to...for the immediate consideration of Senate Resolution 180. Is leave granted? Leave is granted...Senator Bruce.

SENATOR BRUCE:

Yes, Mr. President, one of our members today is celebrating a birthday, and if Senator Kenneth Hall won't drift away too far, we've been trying to find him all morning, and, Senator Hall, we have a birthday for you today. You old fellows forget when your birthdays are, he's been drifting around all day today. The text of this resolution basically is we wish Senator Hall a very happy birthday and that his birthday age shall never increase greater than his district number which is 57. And so we have a cake for everyone today, and this is Senator Kenneth Hall's birthday.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Senator Kenneth Hall.

SENATOR HALL:

Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. As...unaccustomed as I am to speaking, I'd just like to say that when you get my age, and I'm thirty-nine plus, that you don't have any more birthdays. Thanks again.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Senator Bruce has moved for the adoption of Senate Joint...Senate Resolution 180. All those in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed. Ayes have it...resolution is adopted. Happy birthday. Senator Savickas.

SENATOR SAVICKAS:

Yes, Mr. President and members of the Senate, while we're looking for a little business here, I do have three motions I would like leave of the body to adopt. One, is to discharge the Committee on Executive from further consideration of House Bill 768 and ask that the bill be rereferred to the...Committee on Executive Appointments. Also, to discharge the Committee on Executive...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Let's take them one at a time, is that alright? Senator Savickas has moved to discharge the Committee on Executive from further consideration of House bill...House Bill 768 and the bill be...rereferred to Committee on Executive Appointments. You've heard the motion, is leave granted? Leave is granted. Senator Savickas.

SENATOR SAVICKAS:

The next bill would be to discharge the Committee on Executive from further consideration of House Bill 796 and ask that the bill be rereferred to the Committee on Appropriations I.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

You've heard the motion. All in favor signify by saying

Aye. The Ayes have it. Senator Savickas.

SENATOR SAVICKAS:

Yes, Mr. President, thank you. The third motion is to move to discharge the Committee on Judiciary I from further consideration of House Bill 349 and ask that the bill be rereferred to the Committee on Judiciary II.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

You've heard the...heard the motion of Senator Savickas. All in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed. Ayes have it. Senator Chew.

SENATOR CHEW:

I would ask that the Senate discharge the Committee on Transportation from further hearing on Senate Bill 693 and bring it to the Floor on 2nd reading, Senator Egan's bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Senator Chew.

SENATOR CHEW:

Taking 693 from the Committee on Transportation and bringing it to the Floor of the Senate, by request of Senator Egan, and it was temporarily held in the committee until we had finalized some problems and the...problems have been finalized. We will not have a committee hearing on Senate bills and would ask that it be placed on 2nd reading.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Alright. Senator Chew has moved to discharge the Committee on Transportation of...from further consideration of Senate Bill 693 and the bill be placed on the Order of 2nd reading. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. Senator Coffey, did you seek recognition? Senator Coffey.

SENATOR COFFEY:

Yes, Senator Chew, what does that...I don't recall that bill. What does that bill...he's gone.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Well, Senator, we've...

SENATOR COFFEY:

You know, I'd...I'd like to object to bring the bill to the Floor unless, you know, we have a little clarification exactly what it was. I wasn't aware that he was going to do this.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Well, Senator, I didn't see your light. We've already taken the...the action. Senator Egan.

SENATOR EGAN:

Senator Coffey, I was told...I discussed the matter with Senator Rupp, I'm sure he'll remember, and the...the Democratic staff person from the Transportation Committee, and he told me he would notify you. But this bill is the bill that requires police authority before private towing from private lots.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Senator Coffey.

SENATOR COFFEY:

Well, you know, I...I was standing up when Senator Chew was...was bringing this to the attention of the Senate, and, you know, I'm not saying definitely we have any problems with this. Maybe your staff knew about it, but my staff didn't know about it, and I didn't know about it, and my staff has been down here this morning, that's all I'm saying. If we're going to start doing this, we'd like to...to know so I can inform my members what's going on.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Senator Egan.

SENATOR EGAN:

Well, I...I was informed by our staff that you were told about it. So, I'm sorry, I thought you were...were aware of it. Senator Rupp was and...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Well, Senator...Senator Coffey. Senator Coffey.

SENATOR COFFEY:

Well, you know, Senator Supp is a good friend of mine, and...and not to take anything away from him, but I am the spokesman for the Republicans on our side. When my members ask me what's going on, I would like to give them an intelligent answer, that's all I'm saying.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Senator Egan.

SENATOR EGAN:

Alright, Senator, would you...can I sit down and discuss it with you, if...if you don't agree, I'll send it back.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Senator DeAngelis.

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

Yeah, just a question of the Chair. It is appropriate for the chairman of the committee rather than the sponsor to make the motion to discharge the bill? I believe the bill is Senator Egan's bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Well, anyone can make...

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

Senator Chew made the...made the motion to discharge Senator Egan's bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Either party may make the motion under our rules. Senator Chew.

SENATOR CHEW:

Yes. Apparently Senator Coffey does not recall this, but I certainly discussed it with him and told him about what the plan was, and at that time, Senator, if I could have you remember this, when we were coming out of the last committee hearing we had, you and I were coming out together, it may have slipped your memory, but certainly we didn't do anything to...to attempt to do this without your knowledge. I brought

it to your attention, which was agreed upon. Senator Coffey.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZZIC)

Senator Coffey.

SENATOR COFFEY:

Yes. Senator, I don't recall that, but the sponsor of the bill has said that...that he would be glad to take it back if there's any problems, and all I want to know is...know what's going on so I can inform my members and I...and I have no objections at that point.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZZIC)

Senator Grothberg, do you still wish to be recognized on this question?

SENATOR GROTHBERG:

Yes, thank you, Mr. Chairman...Mr. President. If the time is appropriate, I'd like leave to be added as a hyphenated cosponsor to House Bill 975 with Senator...Jerome Joyce.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZZIC)

Is leave granted? Leave is granted. Senator Welch, what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR WELCH:

Thank you, Mr. President. I would ask to be named as a hyphenated cosponsor to Senate Bill 187.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZZIC)

You've heard the motion. Senator Welch moves to be the hyphenated cosponsor of...Senate Bill 187. You've heard the motion. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. Resolutions.

SECRETARY:

Senate Resolution 181 offered by Senator Bruce and all Senators, and it's congratulatory.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZZIC)

Consent Calendar. Senator Zito, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR ZITO:

Thank you, Mr. President, to ask leave to be added also as a cosponsor of Senate Bill 187.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZZIC)

Senator Zito...would like...requests leave of the Body to be added as a cosponsor to Senate Bill 187. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. Senator Carrillo also asks leave of the Senate to be added as a cosponsor of Senate Bill 187. Senator Luft also requests leave to be added as a cosponsor of Senate Bill 187. Is leave...Senator Buzbee asks leave to be added as a cosponsor of Senate Bill 187. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. Senator Kustra, what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR KUSTRA:

Mr. President, as the chief sponsor of House Bill 422, I'd like leave of the House to add Senator Hclmberg as a hyphenated cosponsor.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZZIC)

Senator Kustra has made the motion to...is leave granted? Leave is granted. Senator Vadalabene asks leave of the Body to be added as a cosponsor of Senate Bill 187. Senator Johns, a similar request. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. Senator Gec-Karis asks to be...leave of the Senate to be added as a cosponsor of Senate Bill 87. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. Any other...187. Senator Darrow asks leave to be added. Anybody else, would you please give the Secretary a list and we'll handle it. Senator D'Arco. Senator D'Arco.

SENATOR D'ARCO:

I want leave not to be added as a cosponsor on 187.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZZIC)

Senator Lemke, for what purpose do you arise? Will you turn Senator Lemke on. Senator Lemke.

SENATOR LEMKE:

We have Senate Resolution 166 was sent to Executive. I talked to the chairman of the committee and I'd like to make

a motion to have it taken from committee and passed today. This is a resolution to send to the University of Illinois in regards to the art exhibits they've been having there. Many people are concerned that they'll have some more exhibits defacing other religions.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Where's that at, Executive, Senator?

SENATOR LEMKE:

Yes.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Senator Lemke has moved to discharge the Committee on Executive from further consideration of...of Senate Resolution 166 for the purpose of having that discussed today. Is...Senator Rock.

SENATOR ROCK:

I've just had a rather lengthy discussion with...I understand...with Senator Philip and we have arbitrarily decided that we'd leave the House to its own devices and we could go home. I don't know that this is the appropriate time to get into a long discussion about an art exhibit at the University of Illinois. All of us have been contacted, I am sure. It will be heard in Executive, I am sure, in due course. We will have our chance to vent our respective spleen about that. It seems to me this is not the appropriate time and I would object.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Senator Lemke.

SENATOR LEMKE:

Well, it's...the art exhibit that has been there has ended, but we want to make sure that the University of Illinois doesn't start any new exhibits, you know, assassinating some other religion. The last exhibit...assassinated the priests and nuns of the Catholic faith. We were afraid that the...they might have another art exhibit that will assassi-

nate some other religion, either Lutheran or Methodist or Episcopalian, Jewish, Arabs. We don't want that to take place, and I think we should advise the University of Illinois that we don't want it to take place as a Body so they don't start in and we get caught in another pickle with another art exhibit.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Senator Rock.

SENATOR ROCK:

That, my friend, is the purpose of committee hearings and that's why I suggest that this resolution ought to be properly heard in committee. If...if any religion is to be vilified, we will certainly take the appropriate action. But it seems to me that the appropriate action at this moment is to leave it in committee and have it heard at...at length.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Senator Schuneman.

SENATOR SCHUNEMAN:

Well,...Mr. President, thank you. Simply to join with Senator Rock in...in making the suggestion that we should hear this kind of resolution in committee. It's not had a hearing, I haven't even seen it as speaker on the committee, and I think that we should follow the proper procedure here and...and have the hearing.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Senator Lemke has asked leave of the Body to discharge the Committee on Executive from further consideration of Senate Resolution...Senator Lemke.

SENATOR LEMKE:

Well, if that's the wishes of the...of the Body, I'm not...I'm not going to start and create a long dissertation. But I do want it to be known that it'll be on the burden of the President of the Senate and Mr. Schuneman if this University of Illinois gets the bright idea to have another

antireligious...art exhibit prior to this bill being passed...this resolution being passed. And I...that is my concern. I do not want them to start exhibiting anything, whether it's against my religion or anybody else's religion. I wasn't brought up that way, and I think that we should advise the University of Illinois that we don't want this stuff, and I'm...some of those professors are like the arts counsel, you know, they get ideas that this is art when actually, it's actually hatred of a man that's critical of somebody's religion.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Senator Rock.

SENATOR ROCK:

Thank you, I appreciate the gentleman's concern. I am fully prepared to accept the burden and I still object. Let's move on.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Senator Macdonald, your light is on, what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR MACDONALD:

For a point of information, Mr. President. It so happens that I do have at least Xerox copies of the art exhibit in question, and I don't know whether it is appropriate, but I would like to see that every member gets a copy of this on the desk. I don't know what the Senate rules are providing for individual members to put things on the desk or if you have to have special permission. But at least it would be helpful when this is taken care of in committee, and if it does come out, I'd like the opportunity to see that every member of this House has an opportunity to see what that exhibit was about.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Senator Rock.

SENATOR ROCK:

Every member of this Chamber will be afforded that opportunity, no question about it.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Senator Egan, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR EGAN:

Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate. Just to ask Senator Terke if he'd add me to that list, because all my Catholic friends want it to be heard in the Executive Committee, and I'd appreciate it so that we can get more of the facts heard. I...I want to see what it's all about.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

We...we have...thank you, Senator Egan, we have disposed of that question. Resolutions. Is there leave granted to go to resolutions? Leave is granted. Resolutions.

SECRETARY:

Senate Joint Resolution 45 offered by Senator Rock.

(Secretary reads SJR 45)

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

Senator Rock.

SENATOR ROCK:

Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. This is the adjournment resolution, Senate Joint Resolution 45. When we leave here, I hope momentarily, we will return, and please return, noon on Monday, and we will begin immediately with the business at hand. I think today...this week we have done a great deal of work. Senator Philip and I have discussed the opportunity to leave a little early today and I think it's in everybody's best interest. I would move for the suspension of the rules and the immediate consideration and adoption of Senate Joint Resolution 45.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIC)

You've heard the motion. All those in favor signify by saying Aye. Ayes have it. We...resolution is adopted.

Mr....Resolution...Consent Calendar. Mr. Secretary, have there been any...any objections filed to any of the resolutions?

SECRETARY:

No objections have been filed, Mr. President, but we have added Resolution 177, 178, 179, 181 and Senate Joint Resolution 44 to the Consent Calendar.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

You've heard the list that has been...has been added. Are there any objections to those that have been added? Senator Bruce moves to adopt the Consent Calendar. All those in favor signify by saying Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The Consent Calendar is adopted. Senator Bruce.

SENATOR BRUCE:

I would like leave of the Senate to be added as a hyphenated cosponsor of House Bill 606 along with Senator Netsch.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Bruce seeks leave to be added as a cosponsor of House Bill 606. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. Senator Rock.

SENATOR ROCK:

Senator D'Arco and I want leave not to be shown as a cosponsor whatever that one is.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

The Chair would notice that there are still several pieces of Senator Hall's cake off to the...ry left for those of you that have not partaken as of yet.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

For what purpose does Senator Demuzio arise?

SENATOR DEMUZIO:

Thank you, Mr. President, for the purpose of Tabling two bills. I'd seek leave of the Body to Table Senate Bills 801 and 802. The State Treasurer has indicated that he wishes

not to proceed with those two bills, so I would move to Table Senate Bill 801, 802, they are on the Order of 3rd Reading.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Motion is to Table Senate Bills 801 and 802. On the motion, those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The bills are Tabled. For what purpose does Senator Davidson arise?

SENATOR DAVIDSON:

To announce there will be a Republican caucus immediately on adjournment in Senator "Fate" Philip's office. Please come in and be prompt.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Any further business to come before the Senate? Any further business? Senator Rock moves that the Senate stand adjourned until Monday, May the 23rd, at the hour of noon. On the motion to adjourn, discussion? Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The Senate stands adjourned until Monday at noon.
