Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, I think some...some background on this amendment would be helpful to you. House Joint Resolution 22 established a bipartisan study committee to review the status of the State's alcoholism and drug abuse programs. Specifically, this committee was to consider whether or not these services offered by the State should be combined into one agency, and if that question was answered in the affirmative, where this new combined set of programs should be incorporated into the administrative structure of the State. This committee held three hearings and has come to the conclusion that these services, the alcoholism-drug abuse programs, should be combined into a single agency and that this...agency should be a...a free-standing department. What this amendment does is to...is to establish this pair of goals as our legislative intent. This combination would become effective on July 1, 1984, and the amendment sets forth a process in which this committee can be involved in working out the conforming legislation which would accomplish this combination. I would ask for your support of this amendment to House Bill 670.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Etheredge has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 670. Discussion? Senator Netsch.

SENATOR NETSCH:

...thank you, Mr. President. I rise, also, in support of the amendment, as I will of the bill as amended. The...what is incorporated in Amendment No. 1 was the unanimous recommendation of all of the members of the joint committee who were present at the time we wrapped this up and finally adopted a resolution of the three very extensive hearings that we had held on the subject. It doesn't, as Senator Etheredge indicated, mandate consolidation. It makes it effective a year from now so that there's ample time to work the problems out, and it is clearly the direction that we should be going, as reflected in the committee's motion and in this amendment.

Mr. President and members of the Senate, this amendment is the School Problems Commission recommendation in relation to the school formula bill which came from them to try to equalize some of the reaction or harm that school districts would have in relation to their Title One count loss. It gives...provides a limited hold-harmless for school districts Title One count, and says that the school district may use a greater than 1981 title count or eighty-five percent of their 1971 count, whichever is their greater financial benefit to themselves. It changes the guarantee EAV figure to seventeen hundred fifty-five dollars and fifty-three cents per pupil foundation level requested by the State Board of Education, and this will adjust automatically with the appropriation level and then changes, so there is a change in the Federal law the words, "Title One" to "Chapter One." Move the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Senator Davidson has moves...moved the adoption. Is there any discussion? Senator Berman.

SENATOR BERMAN:

Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Davidson, I apologize for this request but I've been trying to put together some tracking of what districts go up and what districts go down. Would...would you do me the courtesy of taking this bill out of the record until Monday?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Davidson.

SENATOR DAVIDSON:

Senator Berman, with your kind acquisition, I would like...just put this on and move it to 3rd and we're going to leave it, 'cause I'm figure some other people are going to want to tinker with this depending on what the appropriations and this will be one of the last bills passed out of here on 3rd reading; and if you have an amendment, I'll bring it back and we'll then debate the amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Berman.

SENATOR BERMAN:

All right, you're saying if I have an amendment that you will bring the...bill back?

SENATOR DAVIDSON:

I'll bring it back and if I agree with the amendment, we have no problem. If we disagree, we'll argue and whoever has got the votes will be the best man.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right, Senator Berman.

SENATOR BERMAN:

That's...that's fine with me.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right, any further discussion? Senator Lechowicz.

SENATOR LECHOWICZ:

One question, Mr. President, if the sponsor will yield.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Sponsor indicates he will yield. Senator Lechowicz.

SENATOR LECHOWICZ:

Is there any revenue loss to the City of Chicago schools?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Davidson.

SENATOR DAVIDSON:

There...will be some revenue loss over this year because

the loss of Title One students, but with the eighty-five percent of the Title One count they...the City of Chicago will be the same as the City of Springfield...have the opportunity to choose whichever is the most financial rewarding to them.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Lechowicz.

SENATOR LECHOWICZ:

How much of a revenue loss will it be to the Chicago school system?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Davidson.

SENATOR DAVIDSON:

Give me just a minute.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Davidson.

SENATOR DAVIDSON;

The amendment will not affect what you win or lose, it'll...all it does is give some hold-harmless provision to districts that want to use it by allowing them to use eighty-five percent of Title One count from 1970 rather than just have to go with the 1980 census count.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Lechowicz.

SENATOR LECHOWICZ:

Thank you. I believe you mentioned that twice, but you've never answered my question. How much of a revenue loss is this to the City of Chicago school system?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Lechowicz, would you...repeat your question?

SENATOR LECHOWICZ:

Thank you, Mr. President. My question, for the third time, is how much of a revenue loss is this for the Chicago school system?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Davidson.

SENATOR DAVIDSON:

We don't have the...figures of what your general loss is. What this...amendment will do is hold you harmless to the best that you want to use, whichever figure gives you the best shot for yourself.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right, any further discussion? Senator Lechowicz.

SENATOR LECHOWICZ:

Well, I'm sorry, Mr. President and members of the Senate, I can't accept that type of an answer, and I would ask that the gentleman hold the amendment and we do not adopt the amendment. I believe Senator Berman was absolutely correct that maybe we should look at this and maybe have some of these questions answered in a more direct manner. I'm not questioning the sponsor of the amendment, but I think that this matter should be addressed more completely, and I would ask that the...gentlemen withdraw the amendment at this time.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Any further discussion? Senator Schaffer.

SENATOR SCHAFFER:

Well, just in the event that he does not withdraw the amendment, I'd like to have a similar commitment. There are some of us that might have some other amendments besides Senator Berman and like to have an understanding that it be brought back for us too. There are some people outside the club that have some thoughts on the School Aid Formula.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Okay, further discussion? Senator Buzbee.

SENATOR BUZBEE:

Well, yes, I would point out to Senator Lechowicz that without the amendment the City of Chicago is absolutely bound and determined going to lose a whole bunch of money. His amendment will assure you of retrieving a good portion of

that money you were going to lose because of the definition of what's now called Chapter One, used to be Title One, students. We have all lost. In my legislative district, Senator, I'm facing the same thing that you face the City of Chicago with the exception of one school district...every school in my State because of the definition of now the Chapter One student, we're going to lose massive amounts of money just as you are in Chicago. What Senator Davidson's amendment does is to allow us to recapture a portion of what we were going to have lost...yes...what...what we would have lost, and what his amendment does, if I understand it is, it says it will hold your district and my districts harmless if we choose to go that way...if we choose to go that way, up to the tune of eighty-five percent of what we would have retained. This is something that the School Problems Commission had not addressed apparently until just in the last week or so, and now Senator Davidson's amendment, although not helping us to the tune of what we we'd like to be helped, is certainly a lot better than without the amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZZIO)

All right, further discussion? Senator Berman, for a second time.

SENATOR BERMAN:

Thank you, Mr. President. I...I would suggest, and again I...even though you've made an offer, I would suggest that you take it out, but let me just tell you this. Senator Buzbee, I'm not sure what you've said is correct. When I first heard this proposal my initial reaction was the same as yours. How can we lose if there's a hold-harmless whereby you can get the...the higher of either the eighty...the new '80 census count for Title One or eighty-five percent of the census count of 1970? Well, let me tell you, you can lose. This amendment represents a shift of twelve million dollars State-wide. It costs the City of Chicago schools four mil-

lion dollars. Now, I've got the printout...I think Senator Davidson or staff has the printout, and if you look at the printout, Senator Davidson, on the last page the difference between the first column and the last column is four million dollars. That's a loss, meaning that if this amendment is adopted, Chicago will lose four million dollars. I only say this, there's still another eight million dollars that school districts throughout the State are either losing or gaining by this amendment. Our staff has been trying to get an analysis as to who the gainers are and who the losers are, so that when you do vote on this kind of an amendment, you know what you're doing. You know, you...some people may want to go up and...some may go down.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right, Senator Davidson, your...Senator Davidson.

SENATOR DAVIDSON:

To save a lot of time, 'cause we were moving very swiftly down the Calendar, take it out of the record and we'll argue about it Monday.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Take it out of the record. House Bill 1187, Senator Berman. House Bill 1192, Senator Bloom. House Bill 1196, Senator D'Arco. House Bill 1202, Senator Zito. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

3rd reading. There...there was a Floor amendment. Is there leave to return...the bill to the Order of 2nd? Leave is granted. Amendments from the Floor, Mr. Secretary?

SECRETARY:

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

No objections having been filed, Senator Kelly moves the adoption of the resolutions on the Resolution Consent Calendar. On the motion, those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The resolutions are adopted. Senator Rock, we have the adjournment resolution if you'd like to...resolutions, Mr. Secretary.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

The motion is to adopt Amendment No...

SECRETARY:

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

...1 to House Bill 240. On the motion, those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 1 is

adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

3rd reading. House Bill 261, Senator Lemke. Senator Lemke asks leave of the Senate to return the bill to the Order of 2nd Reading. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Are there amendments, Mr. Secretary?

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 1 offered...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Lemke. Alright. Take it out of the record. 367. Alright, Senator...Jerome Joyce on the Floor? Alright. 368, Senator Zito. Senator Zito asks leave of the Senate to return the bill to the Order of 2nd Reading for the purpose of amendment. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Are there amendments, Mr. Secretary?

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 2 offered by Senator Zito.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Zito on Amendment No. 2.

SENATOR ZITO:

Thank you, Mr. President and members. Amendment No. 2 made further technical and clarification changes to some terms that we had in the bill, and it was thought best that we put this amendment on so there would be no discrepancies if and when the bill passed, and I would move for its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

The motion is to adopt Amendment No. 2 to House Bill 368. On the motion to adopt, those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it and Amendment No. 2 is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

3rd reading. House Bill 470. Is Senator Nedza on the Floor? Senator Nedza. Hold. 638...Senator D'Arco. Senator Lemke on...House Bill 720, did you wish to recall that? Senator Lemke. Senator Lemke asks leave of the Senate to return the bill to the Order of 2nd Reading. Is there leave? Leave is granted. The bill is on the Order of 2nd Reading. Are there amendments, Mr. Secretary, please?

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Lemke.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Lemke on Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR LEMKE:

What this amendment is is a amendment worked out between the Right to Life people and the Medical Society to clear up some of the technical problems that the Medical Society had with the bill. I ask for its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

3rd reading. Senate Bill...House Bill 742, Senator Lemke. It's your amendment also, Senator.

SENATOR LEMKE:

Is that the...amendment about the mandates?

SECRETARY:

Schuneman's amendment, yes. Senator Schuneman's amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Alright. Senator Schuneman. Alright. Senator Lenke asks leave of the Senate to return the bill to the Order of 2nd Reading for the purpose of amendment. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Senator Schuneman is recognized.

SECRETARY:

SENATOR SCHUNEMAN:

3rd reading. 1076, Senator Vadalabene indicates he does not wish to call that bill back. 1090, under the sponsorship of Senator Lenke. Self-service storage facilities. Alright, Senator Lenke, do you wish to recall 1090?

SENATOR LENKE:

Yeah.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Is there leave? Leave is granted. Are there amendments, Mr. Secretary?

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Lenke.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Lenke.

SENATOR LEMKE:

This is a amendment by the Reference Bureau changing certain...putting in certain...words that were omitted in the bill and adding words such as "either" and changing them to "manner" in regards to definitions and so forth.

PRESIDENT:

Alright. Senator Leake has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 1090. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDENT:

3rd reading. 1076, Senator Jones seeks leave of the Body...top of Page 30, seeks leave of the Body to return that bill to the Order of 2nd Reading for purposes of an amendment. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. 1076. On the Order of House Bills 2nd Reading, House Bill 1076, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Jones.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Jones.

SENATOR JONES:

Yes, thank you...thank you, Mr. President. Amendment No. 1 allows the State Board of Education to enter into agreement with any...with any governmental agency, school boards, corporation or private individuals for the purpose of processing surplus commodities. This amendment allows the board to do what...allows statutorily what the board is already doing. I move its adoption.

PRESIDENT:

Alright. Senator Jones has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 1076. Any discussion? If not, all

in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDENT:

3rd reading. 1141, Senator Kelly. On the Order of House Bills 3rd Reading is House Bill 1141, the middle of Page 31. Senator Kelly seeks leave of the Body to return that bill to the Order of 2nd Reading for purposes of an amendment. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. On the Order of House Bills 2nd Reading, House Bill 1141, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Kelly.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY:

Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate. This...this amendment merely adds the language, "Except as otherwise provided by Federal law." That's all it does, and I move for its adoption.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Kelly moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 1141. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDENT:

3rd reading. 1237, Senator Kelly, do you wish that recalled? 1386. Senator Kustra does not wish that recalled. 1399. Senator Lemke, you wish that recalled? On the Order of House Bills 3rd Reading, the middle of page 35, is House Bill 1399. Senator Lemke seeks leave of the Body to return that bill to the Order of 2nd Reading for purposes of an amend-

ment. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. On the Order of House Bills 2nd Reading, House Bill 1399, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 2 offered by Senator Lemke.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Lemke.

SENATOR LEMKE:

What this amendment does, it's another amendment with the Medical Society, it deletes the requirement that a woman be given a true copy of her pregnancy test in substitute that she be giving the results of such tests. I ask for its adoption.

PRESIDENT:

All right. Senator Lemke has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 2 to House Bill 1399. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDENT:

3rd reading. 1789, page 41, Senator Bruce. On the Order of House Bills 3rd Reading, the top of page 41, is House Bill 1789. Senator Bruce seeks leave of the Body to return that bill to the Order of 2nd Reading of purposes of an amendment. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. On the Order of House Bills 2nd Reading, House Bill 1789, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Bruce.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Bruce.

SENATOR BRUCE:

Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate. This amendment deals with the change in the notification for early retirement and reduces the time for notification in the Uni-

versity Civil Service Retirement System from one year to six months. I'd move its adoption.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Bruce has moved the adoption of Amendment No...1 to House Bill 1789. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDENT:

3rd reading. 1978, Senator Coffey, you wish that called back? 2085, Senator Davidson, you wish that bill returned? Senator Davidson on the Floor? He's not. 2284, Senator Chew. Top of page 50, on the Order of House Bills 3rd Reading is House Bill 2284. Senator Chew seeks leave of the Body to return that bill to the Order of 2nd Reading for purposes of an amendment. We can...we can hold it. Hold it. Take it out of the record. 775. 775, they wish held. Further business to come before the Senate? Senator Kelly, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR KELLY:

Thank you, Mr. President. On...bill 1237...House Bill 1237, Senator Zito has an amendment that he wanted to have considered on it. I wonder if we could have the leave of the Body.

PRESIDENT:

All right, with leave of the Body, we'll go back to 1237. On the Order of House Bills 3rd Reading, House Bill 1237, bottom of page 32. Senator Kelly has changed his mind and now seeks leave of the Body to return that bill to the Order of 2nd Reading for purposes of an amendment. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. On the Order of House Bills 2nd Reading, House Bill 1237, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Zito.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Zito.

SENATOR ZITO:

Thank you, Mr. President and member...Amendment No. 1 provides the petitions for local advisory questions. Public policy shall be signed by voters equal in number to eight percent of the voters cast in the past gubernatorial election. It also reduces the minimum number of signatures needed to submit a local question. I would move for its adoption.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Zito has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 1237. Any discussion? If not, all in favor signify by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDENT:

Any further business...3rd reading. Any further business to come before the Senate? Any announcements? Senator Bruce.

SENATOR BRUCE:

I have a motion to discharge a bill that I've spoken with the Republican staff, the minority leader and the chairman of Senate Executive Committee. The bill was to have been heard in the the Senate Executive Committee. There was no objection to it but, unfortunately, it was not heard. The bill was House Bill 726...which dealt with patent protection. I would move to discharge the Committee on Executive and have the bill placed on the Order of 2nd Reading.

PRESIDENT:

726, Senator Bruce has moved to discharge the Committee on Executive from further consideration of House Bill 726 and

asks that the bill be placed on the Order of 2nd Reading. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. It's so ordered. Further business to come before the Senate? Senator Lechowicz. Senator Chew, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR CHEW:

2284 was amended on yesterday and passed on to 3rd and you have it here on a recall. We have no desire to call that back. I didn't make that request.

PRESIDENT:

It's...it's your amendment.

SENATOR CHEW:

My amendment?

PRESIDENT:

Indeed it is and you may have it back. Leave is hereby given to take your amendment back.

SENATOR CHEW:

I...I will put the amendment on there if it's mine.

PRESIDENT:

Leave is hereby granted for you to take your amendment back. Any further business to come before the Senate? Charlie, it's time to go home, Charlie. Indeed...all right, Senator Bruce moves that pursuant to the adjournment resolution, the Senate stand adjourned until Monday, June the 20th, at the hour of noon. Monday at noon. Have a nice weekend everybody. The Senate stands adjourned.
