SENATOR ROCK:

Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I have discussed with...if I can have the attention of the members...if you'll turn to the back page of the

Calendar where the...Senate schedule is indicated, let me outline, if I might, this week's schedule. It is, sure everyone is aware, a little on the light side because the Rules Committee is still deliberating. Allow me to remind the members that Friday is the last day for introduction in terms of moving bills through this Session. duction can take place at any time but obviously in terms of the deadline setup adopted by this Body, Friday is the last day. At three...I know Senator Carroll is anxious to convene the Appropriations Committee meeting at two o'clock, so we will end here shortly. At three o'clock in the Office of the President there will be a meeting of the Rules Committee. Tomorrow we will reconvene...there's an Executive Appointments Committee to consider a number of gubernatorial appointments. 50 the Senate will convene at twelve-thirty...twelve-thirty tomorrow. And the Rules Committee will again meet at three o'clock. For the benefit of the membership, at one o'clock or approximately one o'clock tomorrow we will have a...at the request of the Vietnam Veterans' Association, we will have a Vietnam Vet-Memorial Service here in the Senate. There is to be one in the Governor's Mansion, there will be one in the House and we...we in the Senate will have one at one o'clock. Then the Rules Committee will meet again tomorrow at three o'clock. On Thursday, the Rules Committee will meet at ten in the Office of the President. The Senate will convene noon with the hope that those who have constituent business or district business will then be free to leave. Friday the Senate will convene at...9:00 a. m. and will remain open all day until five o'clock for the purpose of introduction of bills. The Reference Bureau indicates that there are still a couple of hundred bills that they are working on and there are a number that have not vet been introduced. So Friday, we will literally go from nine till five but there will be no substantive issues before us, there will be no roll call votes, so the members, if indeed there's pressing constituent business, will be free to leave on Thursday afternoon. So three o'clock this afternoon for Rules, three o'clock tomorrow for Rules, ten o'clock on Thursday, and the Session will be at twelve—thirty tomorrow and at twelve o'clock on Thursday with the committee meetings otherwise as posted. And if there isn't any further business or further announcements, I would move you, Mr. President, that the Senate do stand adjourned until tomorrow, the 9th day of April, at the hour of twelve—thirty.
