PRESIDENT:

The Senate will please come to order. Will the members be at their desks and will our guests in the gallery please rise. Prayer this afternoon by the Reverend Rudolph Shoultz, Union Baptist Church, Springfield, Illinois. Reverend.

REVEREND SHOULTZ:

(Prayer given by Rudolph Shoultz)

PRESIDENT:

Thank you, Reverend. Reading of the Journal, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Thursday, May the 22nd; Friday, May the 23rd; Wednesday, May the 28th; Tuesday, June the 3rd and Wednesday, June the 4th, in the year 1986.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY:

Thank you, Mr. President. I move that the Journals just read by the Secretary be approved unless some Senator has additions or corrections to offer.

PRESIDENT:

You've heard the motion as placed by Senator Kelly. Is there any discussion? If not, all in favor indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The motion carries and it's so ordered. Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY:

Thank you, Mr. President. I move now that the reading and approval of the Journals of Tuesday, June 10th, in the year 1986, be postponed pending arrival of the printed Journals.

PRESIDENT:

You've heard the motion as placed by Senator Kelly. Is there any discussion? If not, all in favor indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The motion car-

ries and it is so ordered. Senator Savickas, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR SAVICKAS:

...for the purpose of...seeking...leave of this Body to reassign two bills...Senate...or House Bill 3075 from...Jud...Jud. I to Elementary and Secondary Education, and House Bill 2473 from Appropriations, since it's a substantive bill, to Executive, so they can be heard tomorrow. It was from Approp. I to Executive.

PRESIDENT:

All right. The gentleman seeks leave of the Body to discharge 2473 from Approp. I and reassign it to Executive. Okay. And House Bill 3075 to be discharged from Judiciary I to Elementary and Secondary. Any discussion? Senator Davidson.

SENATOR DAVIDSON:

...I thought you said 24, it should be 3473 on...from Approp. I to Exec. I happen to be the sponsor of the bill.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Savickas.'

Well, this...the number I have is typed on the note from Senator Davidson, 3473.

PRESIDENT:

Okay. 3473. All right. You've heard the motion. All in favor indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. So ordered. Committee reports, Mr. Secretary.

Senator Hall, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR HALL:

PRESIDENT:

All right. The gentleman seeks leave of the Body to rerefer House Bill 3133 from the Committee on Appropriations I to the Committee on Appropriations II. Without objection, leave is granted. Senator Kustra, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR KUSTRA:

Thank you, Mr. President. I've discussed this matter with Senator Luft, the chief sponsor of House Bill 2819, and I'd like to be added as a hyphenated cosponsor of that bill.

PRESIDENT:

All right. The gentleman seeks leave to be added as a cosponsor on House Bill 2819. Without objection, leave is granted. Senator Sangmeister, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR SANGMEISTER:

Thank you, Mr. President, to be added as a cosponsor to House Bill 2819. House Bill 2819, request to be added as a cosponsor.

PRESIDENT:

All right. Gentleman seeks leave to be added as a cosponsor on House Bill 2819. Without objection, leave is granted.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZZIO)

All right. Leave of the Body, we'll go to the Order of Resolutions. Resolutions, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

SECRETARY:

A Message from the Governor by Kirk Dillard, Director of Legislative Affairs.

Mr. President - The Governor directs me to lay before the Senate the following Message.

To the Honorable members of the Senate, the 84th General Assembly. I have nominated and appointed the following named persons to the offices enumerated below and respectfully ask concurrence in and confirmation of these appointments by your Honorable Body.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIONI)

Executive Appointments. Senator Nedza, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR NEDZA:

Yes, thank you, Mr. President, just for the purposes of an announcement. The Transportation Committee will start promptly at two o'clock, and I'd request all the members to be prompt so we can get out of there in a hurry.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIONI)

With leave of the Body, we will go to the Order of Secretary's Desk...Secretary's Desk Concurrence. Page 9...page 9, Secretary's Desk Concurrence, Senate Bill 1200, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Senate Bill 1200, with House Amendments 2...with House Amendment 2 only.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIONI)

All right. Can we have some order, please. Ladies and gentlemen, can we have some order. We are about to conduct some business here. Senator Rock.

SENATOR ROCK:

Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I would move that the Senate nonconcur with House Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill 1200. I've discussed this

with Senator Philip. As you know, the Governor has called for a meeting tomorrow with the four legislative leaders and...in his office with respect to the...insurance-liability crisis. There is some talk that Senate Bill 1200 would...would then be in a position to be used as a possible Conference Committee for the purpose of resolving that. So we are just merely sending it back to the House...and they can adopt or call for a Conference Committee or not. I would move to nonconcur with House Amendment No. 2.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIIO)

All right. Discussion? If not, Senator Rock has moved to nonconcur with House Amendment 2 to Senate Bill 1200. Those in favor indicate by saying Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The motion carries and the Secretary shall so inform the House. All right. Senator Rock, for what purpose do you arise? Can we have some order.

SENATOR ROCK:

Thank you, Mr. President. Before we break to go to committee, on the Order of Secretary's Desk there are a couple of resolutions that are joint resolutions which...of which I am the sponsor and I'm sure some others who have requested that we get to that order. With leave of the Body, I'd ask that we get there so that we can send these joint resolutions over to the House so that if and when they ever come back they might be in a position to deal with them.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIIO)

All right. With leave of the Body, we will remain on the Order of Secretary's Desk, Resolutions. House Joint Resolution 104, Senator Luft. House Joint Resolution 183, Senator DeAngelis. House...Senator DeAngelis. Page 8, House Joint Resolution 183 urges Congress to...keep the Federal Government from...all right. House Joint Resolution 184, Senator D'Arco. House Joint Resolution 189, Senator Karpel. 197, Senator Poshard. Senate Joint Resolution 101, Senator Rock.

Senator Rock.

SENATOR ROCK:

Thank you, Mr. President. Senate Joint Resolution 101 is cosponsored by Senator Philip and myself and it calls for the creation of a council on the revision of the Illinois Constitution. As I'm sure all are aware, every twenty years we are required by Constitution to reexamine that Constitution. This would lay some of the necessary groundwork. It calls for the appointment of twenty members, five by each of the four legislative leaders for the purpose of examining and recommending what changes, if any, are necessary to our Illinois Constitution. I know of no objection. I would seek a favorable roll call.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All...Senator Rock, I...I am told that it may...require a roll call because of the expenditure of money. Discussion? Senator Marovitz. No...no further discussion? Senator Rock moves the adoption of Senate Joint Resolution 101. Those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed will vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, the Ayes are 54, the Nays are none, none voting Present. Senate Joint Resolution 101 is adopted. Senate Joint Resolution 117, Senator Rock. Senate...Joint Resolution 117, Senator Rock.

SENATOR ROCK:

Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. As I am sure you are aware, in 1987 we will celebrate the two-hundredth anniversary of the signing of the United States Constitution. There has been a committee to commemorate the United States Constitution already formed...by the constitutional officers and the Illinois Supreme Court. This resolution merely ratifies their action and will encourage and...and does invite legislative parti-

icipation. Again, I know of no objection. The committee is in existence, it consists of forty-five people including the constitutional officers. And I would seek a favorable roll call.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Discussion? All right. Senator Rock has moved the adoption of Senate Joint Resolution 117. Those in favor indicate by saying Aye...all right. Senator Rock has moved the adoption of Senate Joint Resolution 117. Those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed will vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, the Ayes are 56, the Nays are none, none voting Present. Senate Joint Resolution 117...is adopted. Senate Joint Resolution 155, Senator Woodyard. Senate Joint Resolution 159, Senator Holmberg. Senator Holmberg, Senate Joint Resolution 159, bottom of page 8. Senator Holmberg.

SENATOR HOLMBERG:

...Senate Joint Resolution 159 is...is jointly sponsored by Senator DeAngelis and myself. This problem was brought to...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Senator...Senator Holmberg, I am told that this is to be...amended, there is an amendment filed.

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 1...was...recommended in committee.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Holmberg.

SENATOR HOLMBERG:

Yes, it was omitted who the...resolution should be sent to, a copy of it. And...it now states that a copy of this preamble and resolution be presented to the Governor and to the director of the Bureau of the Budget for distribution to those State agencies that contract with human service



providers.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Senator Holmberg has moved the adoption of Committee Amendment No. 1 to Senate Joint Resolution 159. Discussion? If not, those in favor indicate by saying Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Committee Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Further...committee amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. There are no further amendments. Senator Holmberg may proceed on Senate Joint Resolution 159.

SENATOR HOLMBERG:

Yes. This resolution was brought...to us on behalf of United Way Services of Illinois. One of the problems they're running into as the State contracts with their various service providers is the increased cost of insurance premiums that have to be taken out of their administrative costs. This merely asks that the State take this into consideration as contracts are awarded. It's to raise the consciousness of...of the State in awarding those contracts during these times of...of very high insurance premium rates.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Senator Holmberg has moved the adoption of Senate Joint Resolution 159. Discussion? Senator Holmberg has moved the adoption of Senate Joint Resolution 159. We will take a roll call. Those in favor indicate by saying...those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed will vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, the Ayes are 48, the Nays are none, none voting Present. Senate Joint Resolution 159 is adopted. Senator Marovitz, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

Thank you, very much, Mr. President...having checked with the lead sponsor, I'd ask to be added as a joint principal hyphenated sponsor to House Bill 2798.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIIO)

All right. Senator...you've heard the request of Senator Marovitz to be added as a hyphenated cosponsor of House Bill 2798. Is leave granted? Hearing no objection, leave is granted. All right. With leave of the Body, we'll go to the Order of Resolutions. Resolutions, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Senate Resolution 1046 offered by Senators Lechowicz, Lemke, Nedza...and Jeremiah Joyce and Degnan and also 1047 by the same sponsors.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIIO)

Executive.

SECRETARY:

Senate Resolution 1048 offered by Senator Watson and it's congratulatory.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIIO)

Consent Calendar. Further business to come before the Senate? Senator Hall, for what...Senator Hall, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR HALL:

Thank you, Mr. President. I'd like to announce that Appropriation II will begin if we're finishing up our business? Are we on the verge...are we going to finish up?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIIO)

This is the last order of business, Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL:

All right, that...would...would the members of the Appropriation II Committee please assemble in Room 212...at 2:00 p.m. as scheduled. We want to start right on time so we can all get out at a reasonable hour.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEHUZIO)

Senator Collins, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR COLLINS:

Purpose of announcement. The Labor Committee will also meet promptly at two o'clock. We only have one bill, and if you go immediately after this Session to A-1, we can finish our business within ten minutes, I'm sure, because I do have another committee meeting on...on appropriation this afternoon. So, please, be on time so that we can get out.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Further business to come before the Senate? Senator Netsch.

SENATOR NETSCH:

Thank you, Mr. President. By way of announcement, the Revenue Committee will meet tomorrow, Thursday, at two o'clock or immediately following Session in Room 212. We have, I believe it is, six bills on the agenda including one that is looking for a sponsor. But it should take us, probably a...couple of hours, but in any event, we will meet tomorrow and it will be in Room 212.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Netsch, I guess if all else fails, you'll have to be the sponsor, is that correct? Further business...Senator Geo-Karis, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, on a point of personal privilege.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. State your point.

SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

Sometime ago we distributed these little cards to each of the Senators. This is the North Point Marine Excursion inviting the Senators and the House members on...for July 20, 21 and 22, 1986, in Zion Winter Harbor area, Illinois, for

fishing, swimming, hayrides, golfing, great America. Mark your calendar, please bring your family. If you...haven't received this, we had it put in your mailboxes, please let my office know and we'll get all the information for you. We'd love to have you join us. Thank you, you were there before, we enjoyed having you, Mr. President.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right...all right, Senator Luft, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR LUFT:

Thank you, Mr. President. I'd ask leave to be added as a hyphenated sponsor to House Bill 3396.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. You've heard the request of Senator Luft to be added as a hyphenated cosponsor of House Bill 3396. Hearing no objection, so ordered. Senator Degnan, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR DEGNAN:

Thank you, Mr. President. I'd like to remove myself as a sponsor of House Bill 3032.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Senator Degnan seeks leave of the Body to withdraw as a cosponsor of House Bill 3032. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. Senator Sangmeister, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR SANGMEISTER:

Just a reminder that Executive meets tomorrow morning at nine o'clock and those Senators that had resolutions up, they will not be heard. Each of your offices should have heard individually from mine. The reason that we are cancelling out all of the resolutions is because we've got so many bills. We've got to get the House bills out this week, so your resolutions will all be rescheduled probably for next week.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Senator Kelly, for what purpose do you arise? Senator Luft, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR LUFT:

Thank you, Mr. President. Ask leave to add Senator DeAngelis as a hyphenated sponsor to House Bill 2879.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right...Senator Luft seeks leave to add Senator DeAngelis as a hyphenated cosponsor of House Bill 2879. Leave is granted. Further business to come before the Senate? Senator Rock moves that the Senate stand adjourned till Thursday, June the 13th at the hour of one o'clock. Senate stands adjourned. (Machine cutoff)...the 12th.
