I want to thank my...especially colleague Senator Frank Watson and the respective staffs of both the Republican and Democratic...democrats in helping us to achieve this compromise. It permits for these townships and the cities to annex and coterminously into these townships. It does have a referendum proposal built into it, and...under the...proposal, for ten years the cities that are going to annex these properties will give these funds to the township officials. It's a...it's a compromise...and achieved. I would ask for your favorable support.

Anybody has amendments, I wish they would bring them up to the Secretary so we can get them properly filed. All right, with leave of the Body, we'll return 2724 to the Order of 2nd Reading. I understand an amendment has been filed with the Secretary. On the Order of House Bills 2nd Reading, House Bill 2724, Mr. Secretary. Any...any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY:

...Amendment No. 1 filed by...offered by Senators Philip and Schuneman.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Philip on Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR PHILIP:

Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. Floor Amendment No. 1 is...is a EPA clean-up amendment. When we passed the emission laws for automobiles we listed the zip codes that were out in various counties, DuPage, St. Clair and Madison. What has happened since that time some of the municipalities have had...their own zip code; in other words, before they were included with another municipality, they get a little larger, they've got a new zip code number. So they would automatically be included because they're not named. What this does is take those municipalities and...and include them so they will not be in the emission area. I'll be happy to answer any questions and I move the adoption of Floor Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDENT:

All right. Senator Philip has moved the adoption of

Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 2724. Is there any discussion?

Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL:

...will the sponsor yield for a question?

PRESIDENT:

Sponsor indicates he'll yield, Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL:

...Senator, as you know, my area is included like your area. Now, when you saying you taking some of those out so that they will not be included. Now, tell me what you're taking out, will you please?

PRESIDENT:

Senator Philip.

SENATOR PHILIP:

All right, I will give you the three zip codes that are taken out of your area, Senator, 62026, 62220, 62222. I've been led to believe that's the SIU-Edwardsville campus in Madison, at St. Clair and Belleville and...St. Clair and Belleville. AS...as you know, we did it by zip codes.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL:

That's what I understand, you...all this about zip codes, that's what makes it so ridiculous. Are you...are you telling me now that you're taking out part of...of Edwardsville, the SIU campus...you're taking out the campus at SIU and you're taking out some places in Belleville and leaving the other counties there? How did you arrive at doing that? Who figured that out?

PRESIDENT:

Senator Philip.

SENATOR PHILIP:

In the...in the first place, they were never meant to be in, Senator. As you know, not all of Dupage County is in,

not all of...Madison and St...Clair County are not in. Those areas were not...they were not recommended by the State or the Federal Government to be in. Now they've got new zip code numbers, so we're just excluding them. So they're not in, they do not have to be tested. You ought to be for it, it ought to make your constituents happy.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: .

Well, there's no way that we could be happy with that because what's that simply doing is taking us...an area that surrounds another area in my area...and excludes them. Well, I'm...I'm going to oppose it anyway but...it's just wrong the way this thing is being handled.

PRESIDENT:

Further discussion? Senator Netsch.

SENATOR NETSCH:

Thank...thank you, Mr. President. Again, were there some areas taken out of Cook and/or DuPage, Lake, et cetera, the northern...northern part? We simply could not hear what you were suggesting over here or is it only in the East St. Louis area?

PRESIDENT:

Senator Philip.

SENATOR PHILIP:

My information tells me it is just DuPage, Madison and St. Clair Counties, the only counties that are affected. There has...there's not been a recommendation from the State EPA to take anybody else. I am taking their recommendations, not mine.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Netsch.

SENATOR NETSCH:

And I assume their recommendations with respect to these

particular zip codes would not be forthcoming unless they did not in any way endanger the State's compliance with the Federal guidelines and the available funds. Is that correct?

PRESIDENT:

Senator Philip.

SENATOR PHILIP:

Any...any new zip code that would be created would...if it was in DuPage County or St. Clair County would automatically be in because they have not been excluded.

PRESIDENT:

Any further discussion? If not, Senator Philip has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 2724. All in favor indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Are there further amendments?

Thank you, Mr. President. Under the legislation the House passed over to us there was a question of whether Illinois Print Shop would be prohibited from printing lottery tickets. This opens it up to clarify it so that our own Illinois printers can print our own lottery tickets. I'd ask for the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT:

All right. Senator Darrow has moved the adoption of Committee Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 2770. Any discussion? If not, all in favor indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Are there further amendments?

SECRETARY:

PRESIDENT:

Senator Darrow on Amendment No. 2.

SENATOR DARROW:

Thank you, Mr. President. This amendment opens it up further so that the Illinois printing business can also print lottery tickets for foreign governments. It's my understanding Canada may have some lottery business for our printers.

I'd ask for the adoption of Amendment No. 2.

PRESIDENT:

All right. Senator Darrow has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 2 to House Bill 2770. Any discussion? If not, all in favor indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

PRESIDENT:

3rd reading. Senator Kelly on 2775...wait just a minute, we have a special guest. If I can have the attention of the membership, Senator Karpriel.

SENATOR KARPIEL:

Thank you, Mr. President. Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, I'd just like for you to meet Miss Schaumburg, Lori Beth Hayden, who is competing now in the Miss Illinois Pageant in July. Last year she was a finalist and this year, of course, we're hoping she takes the whole thing. Please welcome her.

Today's bond market, according to the bond proposals that have been received, indicates that the State could save 1.3 million dollars a year in annual debt service payments. This amendment requires that the money saved out of that one million dollars per year be appropriated from the Build Illinois purposes fund. The effect is to reallocate debt service savings to allow the State to expend more in projects without incurring additional bond costs or additional interest payments.

PRESIDENT:

All right. Senator Welch has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 2 to House Bill 3396. Discussion? Senator DeAngelis.

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

Well, Mr. President, I just got a copy of this amendment and I'm not going to use this for any dilatory purpose, but I understand the Authority is going to propose something that allows them to refund it. And I'm wondering why the State of Illinois wants to enlarge its bonding by three hundred million dollars when the same thing could be done by the Authority and it does not, in fact, impact upon the State of Illinois. I'd like to have an answer to that.

Well, it is your analysis; however, what is your LRB No. on that amendment?

PRESIDENT:

It that the Students for a Democratic Society number?

Amendment No. 3 also requires the Governor before he enters into any agreements for the delivery of professional services with reference to an intent to refund GO bonds and Build Illinois bonds, he must first give public notice soliciting proposals for professional services. Such notice...must be published twice in a newspaper in general circulation in the State with the second notice at least ten days before the Governor expects to select a provider. The notice must include a description of the work to be accomplished and the notice must contain a description of the factors that will be considered by the Governor or BOB in selecting the provider. Copies of every proposal for delivery

of professional services submitted in response to the notice shall be submitted by the Bureau of the Budget to the four legislative leaders. Persons submitting a proposal for the delivery of services must disclose each individual having a beneficial interest of more than seven and an half percent of such entity, names of officers and directors and the name of any person that will benefit financially from the contract. Persons that have provided professional services related to recommending the issuance of a refunding bond are prohibited...from performing any work with respect to the...refinancing.
