PRESIDENT:

The Senate will come to order. Pursuant to the call of the Governor, we will call to order the Second Special Session. Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Communication from the Secretary of State.

(Secretary reads Proclamation from Executive Department)

PRESIDENT:

All right, in order to organize, we will have a...resolutions, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Senate Resolution No. 1...offered by Senator Demuzio.

(Secretary reads SR No. 1)

PRESIDENT:

Senator Demuzio.

SENATOR DEMUZIO:

Hello.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Demuzio. Right.

SENATOR DEMUZIO:

This is...I...the Senate Resolution No. 1 is the...the...the adoption of the temporary rules for the Special Session. I would move adoption of Senate Resolution No. 1.

PRESIDENT:

All right, Senator Demuzio has moved the adoption of Senate Resolution No. 1 in the Second Special Session. All

in favor of the motion to adopt indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The resolution is adopted. Further resolutions?

SECRETARY:

Senate Resolution No. 2 offered by Senator Demuzio.

(Secretary reads SR No. 2)

PRESIDENT:

Senator Demuzio.

SENATOR DEMUZIO:

Yes, thank you, Mr...Mr. President. Senate Resolution No. 2 is, in fact, the adoption of the standing committees and their membership as designated by...the Senate of the 94th General Assembly. I move adoption of Senate Resolution No. 2.

PRESIDENT:

All right, Senator Demuzio has moved to suspend the rules for the immediate consideration and adoption of Senate Resolution 2. All in favor of the motion to suspend indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The rules are suspended. Senator Demuzio now moves the adoption of Senate Resolution No. 2. All in favor indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The resolution is adopted. Further resolutions?

SECRETARY:

...Senate Resolution No. 3 offered by Senator Demuzio.

(Secretary reads SR No. 3)

PRESIDENT:

Senator Demuzio.

SENATOR DEMUZIO:

Yes, Mr. President, I move the...for the immediate...suspension of the rules and the adoption of Senate Resolution No. 3 which simply informs the House that we are ready to do business.

PRESIDENT:

All right, Senator Demuzio has moved to suspend the rules for the immediate consideration and adoption of Senate Resolution No. 3. All in favor of the motion to suspend indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The rules are suspended. Senator Demuzio now moves the adoption of Senate Resolution No. 3. All in favor indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The resolution is adopted. Mr. Secretary, further resolutions?

PRESIDENT:

PRESIDENT:

All right, Senator Demuzio has moved to suspend the rules for the immediate consideration and adoption of Senate Resolution 4. All in favor of the motion to suspend indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The rules are suspended. Senator Demuzio now moves the adoption of Senate Resolution No. 4. All in favor indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. PRESIDENT:

All right, Senator Demuzio has moved to suspend the rules for the immediate consideration and adoption of Senate Resolution 6. All in favor of the motion to suspend indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The resolution is adopted. The rules are suspended. Senator Demuzio now moves the adoption of Senate Resolution No. 6. All in favor of the adoption indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The resolution is adopted. Mr. President - I am directed to inform the Senate the House of Representatives has accepted the Governor's specific recommendations for change, which are attached, to a bill with the following title, in the adoption of which I am instructed to ask concurrence of the Senate, to-wit:

House Bill 2472.

I am further instructed to deliver to you the objections of the Governor which are contained in the attached copy of his letter to the House of Representatives. Adopted by the House...October the 2nd, 1985 at the Second Special Session. Jack O'Brien, Clerk of the House.

PRESIDENT:

Motions in writing, Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

I move to accept the specific recommendations of the Governor as to House Bill 2472 in the manner and form as follows. Signed, Senator Philip.

PRESIDENT:

All right, with leave of the Body, Senator Weaver will handle the motion in writing. This is the motion to accept the specific recommendations for change. Senator Weaver.

SENATOR WEAVER:

Thank you, Mr. President. I would move to accept the specific recommendations of the Governor as to House Bill 2472 in the manner and form as followed. This is the Act that takes effect upon becoming law. I think everyone is familiar with it. If there's any discussion, I'll try to answer any of their questions.

PRESIDENT:

Is there any discussion? Any discussion? If not, the question is, shall the Senate accept the specific recommenda-

tions of the Governor as to House Bill 2472 in the manner and form just stated by Senator Weaver on behalf of Senator Philip. Those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed will vote Nay.
