SECOND SPECIAL SESSION
OCTOBER 15, 1985

PRESIDENT:

All right, pursuant to the call of the Governor, the Second Special Session will come to order. Reading of the Journal. Senator Vadalabene.

SENATOR VADALABENE:

Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate. I move that reading and approval of the Journal of Wednesday, October 2nd of the Second Special Session, in the year 1985, be postponed pending arrival of the printed Journal.

PRESIDENT:

All right, you've heard the motion as placed by Senator Vadalabene. Is there any discussion? If not, all in favor indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The motion carries. It's so ordered. All right, with leave of the Body, we'll move to the Order of Motions in Writing. Mr. Secretary.

SECRETARY:

I move that Senate Bill 1454...to take the bill from the Table and to nonconcur with House Amendments 1 and 3. Signed, Senator Keats.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Kustra.

SENATOR KUSTRA:

Thank you, Mr. President. You'll have to forgive my handwriting, Mr. Secretary. That bill, Senate Bill 1454, is the bill that we considered during the regular Session that deals with McCormick Place. This will...allow us to take that bill from the Table, send it back to the House and eventually use this bill for the vehicle for the McCormick Place reforms. I ask for your...

PRESIDENT:

All right, Senator Kustra has moved to take Senate Bill 1454 from the Table and place it on the Order of Nonconcurrency for the purpose of nonconcurring with House

Amendments 1 and 3. All in favor of the motion to take from the Table indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The motion carries. Senator Kustra now moves to nonconcur with House Amendments 1 and 3 to Senate Bill 1454. All in favor of the motion to nonconcur indicate by saying Aye. All opposed Nay. The motion carries and the Secretary shall so inform the House. Any further business to come before the Special Session? If not, Senator Demuzio moves that the Special Session stand adjourned until Wednesday, ...October 16th at the hour of twelve-thirty, twelve-thirty tomorrow. Senate stands adjourned.
