PRESIDENT:

The Senate will please come to order. Will the members be at their desks and will our guests in the gallery please rise. Prayer this morning by the Reverend Elmer Fowler, Third Baptist Church, Chicago, Illinois. Reverend.

REVEREND FOWLER:

PRESIDENT:
