PRESIDENT:

The hour of eleven having arrived, the Senate will please come to order. Will the members be at their desks and will our guests in the gallery please rise. Our prayer this morning by the Reverend Anthony Tzortzis, St. Anthony's Hellenic Orthodox Church, Springfield, Illinois. Father.

REVEREND TZORTZIS:

PRESIDENT:

Thank you, Father. Reading of the Journal. Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL:

Mr. President, I move that reading and approval of the Journals of Thursday, March 19th; Tuesday, March 24th and Wednesday, March 25th, in the year 1987, be postponed pending arrival of the printed Journals.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Senator Rock...on the adjournment resolution.
SENATOR ROCK:

Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. Senate Joint Resolution 31 is the adjournment resolution. It calls for us when we conclude our business today, which will be very shortly, to return to Springfield next Tuesday, the 31st day of March, at the hour of noon. And I would move you, Mr. President, to suspend the rules for the immediate consideration and adoption of Senate Joint Resolution 31.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. You've heard the motion as posed by Senator Rock. Senator Kustra.

SENATOR KUSTRA:

Thank you, Mr. President. Due to the emergency nature of Senate Bill 366 which was heard yesterday...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Well...we're...we're...we're going to get to that in a minute, I'm told. Senator Rock has moved to suspend the rules for the immediate consideration and adoption of...of the Senate Joint Resolution 31. The...is there discussion? If not, those in favor indicate by saying Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The rules are suspended. Senate Rock now moves the adoption of Senate Joint Resolution 31. Those in favor will indicate by saying Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Senate Joint Resolution 31 is adopted. Senator Kustra. I think we're ready now. Senator Kustra.

SENATOR KUSTRA:

Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate. Senate Bill 366 is the supplemental appropriation to the Department of Rehabilitation Services. It makes an appropriation of four million seven hundred and ninety-three thousand four hundred dollars to the General Revenue Fund which is earmarked for the department's home services program. I'd ask for your favorable consideration. Read it a second time.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Senator Kustra has asked that...the bill be...read a second time. Is Senator Hall on the Floor? Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL

Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I concur with Senator Kustra that this is of an emergency nature and that's why we heard the bill and passed it out yesterday. So...I...am in complete accord.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. With leave of the Body, we will go to the Order of...of Senate Bills...2nd Reading. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. On the Order of...of Senate Bills 2nd Reading is Senate Bill 366. Madam Secretary, you want to read the bill.

SECRETARY:

Senate Bill 366.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. The bill is read a second time. It will be on the Order of 2nd Reading when we come back on...on Tuesday of next week. Senator Vadalabene, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR VADALABENE:

Yes, I would...have leave to be added as a hyphenated sponsor...cosponsor of Senate Bill No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Senator Vadalabene has sought leave of the Body to be added as a cosponsor of Senate Bill 1. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. So ordered. Senator Smith, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR SMITH:

Thank you, Mr. President. I beg leave to...request to be added as a cosponsor to Senate Bill No. 1 and also Senate Bill No. 4.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. You've heard the request of Senator Smith to be added as a cosponsor of Senate Bill 1 and Senate Bill 4. There is objection? If not, leave is granted. So ordered. Senator Holmberg, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR HOLMBERG:

I would like to request that my name be added as the hyphenated cosponsor to Senate Bill 102.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Holmberg, 102? All right. Senator Holmberg seeks leave of the Body to be added as a hyphenated cosponsor of Senate Bill 102. Is...is there objection? If not, leave is granted and it's so ordered. All right. Introduction of bills.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Senator Brookins has requested leave to be
added as a cosponsor of Senate Bill 102. Objections? Hear-
ing none, leave is granted. So ordered. Senator O'Daniel,
for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR O'DANIEL:

Mr. President, I'd like leave of the Body to be added as

a cosponsor of Senate Bill 132. I have permission from the chief sponsor.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Senator O'Daniel requests leave of the Body to be added as a cosponsor of Senate Bill 102...132, 1-3-2. Is there objection? If not,...leave is granted. So ordered. Senator Vadalabene, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR VADALABENE:

Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate. I rise in a...in an announcement of the Senate has a right to know.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Could we have your...could we have order, please. Senator Vadalabene has an announcement.

SENATOR VADALABENE:

Yes.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Watson, could you break up that caucus back there please. Senator Vadalabene.

SENATOR VADALABENE:

Yes. I think the Senate should know...they know quite a bit about Bev and I. But yesterday as I was leaving I got on the elevator and Bev got on the elevator too, and we were by ourself. And she said to me, how long will it take? And I said, about ten seconds. And she says, I hope the elevator doesn't get stuck. When we arrived on the first floor she helped me get to my office. And I appreciate that, Bev, and I thought you ought to know about this episode. Thank you.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Well, it was a great first chapter and...and final chapter, we're waiting for the in between. All right...all right. We are momentarily waiting for...another supplemental bill, I understand, to come down, so we'll just stand at...at ease for a moment. Introduction of bills.

SECRETARY:

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Are there any further resolutions for the Consent Calendar? All right. Madam Secretary, have there been any objections filed to the Resolutions Consent Calendar?

SECRETARY:

There have not.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. The Resolutions Consent Calendar...which has been passed out to the membership, we will add...with leave of the Body, we will add Senate Resolutions 135 through and inclusive of 141 and House...House Joint Resolutions 44 and 45. Is there leave to add those? Leave is granted. They are so added. Senator Welch moves the adoption of the Resolutions Consent Calendar. Discussion? If not, those in favor indicate by saying Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The Resolutions Consent Calendar is adopted. Is there further business to come before the Senate? Senator Philip, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR PHILIP:

Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. A point of personal privilege. Yesterday I had a little slip of the tongue or a little white lie, whatever you'd like to call it. Senator DeAngelis is not sixty-nine years of age, he's only fifty-five. Although he may look, act and think like a sixty-nine year-old man, he's only fifty-five.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Well, Senator Philip, it was very convincing. I'm glad

you cleared that up. All right. Further business to come before the Senate? If not, Senator Rock moves that the Senate stand adjourned until next Tuesday, March 31st, at the hour of noon. The Senate stands adjourned.
