PRESIDENT:

The hour of eleven-thirty having arrived, the Senate will please come to order. Will the members be at their desks and will our guests in the gallery please rise. Prayer this morning by the Reverend Linda Spencer, Unity Church of Practical Christianity, Springfield, Illinois. Reverend.

REVEREND LINDA SPENCER:

(Prayer given by Reverend Linda Spencer)

PRESIDENT:

Thank you, Reverend. Reading of the Journal, Madam Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Senate Journals of Thursday, May 28; Tuesday, June 2nd; Wednesday, June 3rd; Thursday, June 4th and Friday, June 5th, 1987.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL:

Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. Mr. President, I move that the Journals just read by the Secretary be approved unless some Senator has additions or corrections to offer.

PRESIDENT:

You've heard the motion as placed by Senator Hall. Is there any discussion? If not, all in favor indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The motion carries and it's so ordered. Senator Geo-Karis, for what purpose do you arise? I beg your pardon, Senator Hall. I forgot that yesterday, too. Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL:

Mr. President, I move that reading and approval of the Journals of Tuesday, June 9th; Wednesday, June 10th and Thursday, June 11th, in the year 1987, be postponed pending arrival of the printed Journals.

PRESIDENT:

You've heard the motion as placed by Senator Hall. Is there any discussion? If not, all in favor indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The motion carries and it is so ordered. Senator Geo-Karis, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

Mr. President, on a point of personal privilege. Senate Resolution No. 372 offered by Senators Kelly, Watson, Rock and Philip commending our retired Senator Peter Miller, I'm just wondering if we couldn't have all our names on that resolution.

PRESIDENT:

That point is well taken. Madam Secretary, if we can show Senate Resolution 372...with leave of the Body, we'll show all members as cosponsors. Without objection, leave is granted. Committee reports.

A Message from the House by Mr. O'Brien, Clerk.

Senate Bill 158 with House Amendment No. 1.

And Senate Bill 759 with House Amendment No. 1.

And Senate Bill 917 with House Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDENT:

Secretary's Desk. If I can have the attention of the Senate, we have with us some special guests, and I would ask

them to come up to the Podium and I'll yield to Senator Severns for the purpose of an introduction of some special guests.

SENATOR SEVERNS:

Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate. It's my honor to have join us in this Chamber today the Steven Decatur High School Cheerleading Squad and...and their coach, Connie Air. We're recognizing them today with a resolution where they won the International Open Cheerleading Championships in Nashville, Tennessee. So, Coach Connie Air, Denise Shevron, Dana Henton, Michelle Gasamon, Julie Linston, Lori Phillips, Amy Holmes, Jaime Surratt and Stephanie Kaye, we thank you for coming...the squad that also placed first place at the 1986 State Fair. Thank you for joining us in the Senate today.

PRESIDENT:

Committee reports, Madam Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Senator Welch, chairman of the Committee on Energy and Environment, reports House Bills Noed. 62, 72, 345, 401, 747, 1359, 1590, 1767, 2247, 2606, 2745 and 2849 Do Pass.

And House Bills Noed. 942, 1818, 1867 and...2791 Do Pass as Amended.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Demuzio, the adjournment resolution. Resolutions, Madam Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Senate Joint Resolution 68.

(Secretary reads SJR 68)

PRESIDENT:

Senator Demuzio.

SENATOR DEMUZIO:

Yes, this is the...adjournment resolution, Senate Joint Resolution 68. Calls for us to return next...

PRESIDENT:

Tuesday at noon.

SENATOR DEMUZIO:

...Tuesday at noon. I would move to suspend the rules for the immediate consideration and adoption of Senate Joint Resolution 68.

PRESIDENT:

All right, you've heard the motion as placed by Senator Demuzio to suspend the rules for the immediate consideration of Senate Joint Resolution 68. All in favor of the motion to suspend indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The motion carries. The rules are suspended. Senator Demuzio now moves the adoption of Senate Joint Resolution 68 which calls for us to return to Springfield next Tuesday at the hour of...of twelve o'clock, noon. All in favor indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The resolution is adopted. Senator Geo-Karis, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

Mr. President, on a point of personal...privilege.

PRESIDENT:

State...state your point.

SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

Mr. President and members of the Senate, it's my privilege to introduce to this auspicious group of Senators, my constituent, Mrs. Arla Fiedler, who is the general manager of the Radison Hotel in Arlington...Arlington Heights and her two granddaughters, Jenny and Tracy Fiedler. In addition, it's my pleasure to introduce their companions, Mrs. Susan Martin and her daughter, Jill, who are constituents of Senator Davidson's. They are sitting in the President's Gallery and I would like us all to welcome them.

PRESIDENT:

Would our guests in the gallery please stand and be

recognized. Welcome to Springfield. Senator Geo-Karis, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

Mr. President, there will be a Republican Caucus in Senator Philip's room immediately after this Session.

PRESIDENT:

All right, that...that...I was going to allude to that, that's correct. Senator Watson.

SENATOR WATSON:

Thank you, I'd like to, at this particular time, ask leave to be added as a hyphenated cosponsor. Is this the appropriate time to do that?

PRESIDENT:

This is as good a time as any.

SENATOR WATSON:

Thank you, sir. With Senator Demuzio's okay, I would like to be added as the chief sponsor of House Bill 1512 and have Senator Demuzio removed as sponsor.

PRESIDENT:

All right, the gentleman seeks leave to be shown as the chief Senate sponsor...first Senate sponsor on House Bill 1512, hyphenated with Senator Demuzio. Without objection, leave...

SENATOR WATSON:

...then I have another request.

PRESIDENT:

...leave is granted. Yes, sir, Senator Watson.

SENATOR WATSON:

I'd like to be added as a hyphenated cosponsor of House Bill 261.

PRESIDENT:

All right, gentleman seeks leave of the Body to be added as a hyphenated cosponsor on House Bill 261. Without objection, leave is granted. Madam Secretary, have any...let me

just explain...if I can have your attention, here's what's going on this afternoon...this morning. We're going to adjourn very shortly. Senator Philip has indicated that he wishes to have a caucus...or someone wished to have a caucus in his office and so in order to accommodate all, we said we would be out of here by twelve-thirty. If they have a caucus and then we come out, we'll never make it. So, we're going to adjourn and have the caucus and we'll come back Tuesday at noon. We will at that point have probably four hundred bills on 2nd reading. We're going to start on 2nd reading and go like mad and, hopefully, conclude our business. If we can at all do it, I'd like to avoid a Session next Friday, but that depends on what happens on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, obviously. Senator Fawell, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR FAWELL:

Thank you, very much, Mr. President. I would like to add Joyce Holmberg on as a sponsor to 1101...House Bill 1101.

PRESIDENT:

All right, the lady seeks leave to add Senator Holmberg as the hyphenated cosponsor on House Bill 1101. Without objection, leave is granted. Any other members have resolutions? We're going to quickly get to the Resolutions Consent Calendar here. Senator Woodyard, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR WOODYARD:

Thank you, Mr. President. I would like to be removed as hyphenated sponsor of House Bill 1291. All right, gentleman seeks to be removed as the sponsor of House Bill 1291. Without objection, it is so ordered. 1291, remove Senator Woodyard. Senator Fawell, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR FAWELL:

Thank you, Mr. President. I just wanted to add for anyone who is interested, and this may sound like a crazy bill, but it's...it's the...it's the bluegill fish bill that the

school...all the school children voted to be...as our state fish and if anybody wants to join me on it, please feel free to do so.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Weaver has a list of those that he's played cards with who he determines are the state fish. Senator Weaver, make sure we get...everybody on that bill. Senator Lechowicz, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR LECHOWICZ:

Thank you, Mr. President. I ask leave of the Body to be listed as a principal cosponsor on Senate Bill 102 and Senate Bill 294.

PRESIDENT:

All right, gentleman seeks leave to be added as the principal sponsor on Senate Bills 102 and...Senator Lechowicz.

SENATOR LECHOWICZ:

Principal cosponsor on Senate Bill 102 and Senate Bill 294.

PRESIDENT:

294. 102 and 294. Without objection, leave is granted. Resolutions, Madam Secretary.

SECRETARY:

Senate Resolution 377 offered by Senator Dudycz. It is congratulatory.

PRESIDENT:

Consent Calendar. With leave of the Body, we'll put that on the Consent Calendar. Senator Dunn, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR RALPH DUNN:

Thank you, Mr. President. With leave of the principal sponsor, I'd like to be added as hyphenated cosponsor of 748...House Bill 748.

PRESIDENT:

Gentleman seeks leave of the Body to be added as the



hyphenated cosponsor on House Bill 748. Without objection, leave is granted. Committee reports.

SECRETARY:

Senator Collins, chairman of the Committee on Transportation, reports House Bills 65, 361, 380, 422, 597, 746, 919, 1021, 1185, 1258, 1320, 1537, 1672, 1735, 1760, 1908, 1959, 1968, 2052, 2151, 2202, 2208, 2209, 2319, 2321, 2323, ...2327, 2340, 2341, 2342, 2494, 2532, 2636 and...2655 and 2707 Do Pass.

PRESIDENT:

Senator Geo-Karis, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

Mr. President...and...members of the Senate, inasmuch as I sponsored the bill for the...choosing of the fish by the young students of the elementary schools, I would like to be added on as a hyphenated cosponsor of Senate...of House Bill 1101, I believe it is.

PRESIDENT:

All right, the lady seeks leave to be added as a hyphenated cosponsor on House Bill 1101. Without objection, leave is granted. Senator Mahar.

SENATOR MAHAR:

Thank you, Mr. President. I seek leave of the Body to be added as a hyphenated cosponsor of House Bill 1818.

PRESIDENT:

All right, gentleman seeks leave to be added as the hyphenated cosponsor on House Bill 1818. Without objection, leave is granted. Senator Jacobs.

SENATOR JACOBS:

Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. With leave of the Body, I'd like to add Senator Dunn and Senate...Senator Macdonald to Senate Bill 748...House

Bill 748, excuse me.

PRESIDENT:

Which...which Dunn is that? There are two Dunns in the Chamber?

SENATOR JACOBS:

Ralph Dunn.

PRESIDENT:

All right. Gentleman seeks leave to add Senators Ralph Dunn and Virginia Macdonald as cosponsors on House Bill 748. Without objection, leave is granted. All right, Madam Secretary, resolutions. Have any...objections been filed to the Resolutions Consent Calendar?

SECRETARY:

No objections have been filed.

PRESIDENT:

All right, Senator Hall then moves the adoption of the Resolutions Consent Calendar, that is, Senate Resolutions 347, 348, 349, 350, 351, 352,...353, 354, 355, 356, Senate Resolution 358, 59, 60, 61, Senate Resolution 362, 363, 364, 366, 368, 369, 370, 372, 373, 374, 375, Senate Joint Resolution 65, 66, 67, House Joint Resolution 90, House Joint Resolution 91, 92, 93 and House Joint Resolution 95 and additionally Senate Resolutions 376 and 377. Any discussion? If not, all in favor indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The resolutions are adopted. Senator Topinka.

SENATOR TOPINKA:

Yes, I...oops, excuse me, Mr. President. If we could put Senator Jones on as a hyphenated joint sponsor on Senate Bill...House Bill 406.

PRESIDENT:

All right, the lady seeks leave to add Senator Jones as the hyphenated cosponsor on House Bill 406. Without objection, leave is granted. Further business to come before the Senate. Any announcements? Further announcements? Further

business? If not, pursuant to the adjournment resolution, Senator Demuzio moves that the Senate stand adjourned until next Tuesday. Next Tuesday, June 16, at the hour of noon. Next Tuesday. Have a good weekend everybody. Senate stands adjourned.
