PRESIDENT ROCK:

The hour of noon having arrived, the Senate will please come to order. Will the Members be at their desks, and will our guests in the gallery please rise. Our prayer this afternoon by the Reverend Mark Searby, College Park Christian Church, Normal, Illinois. Reverend.

(Prayer given by the Reverend Mark Searby)

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Thank you, Reverend. Reading of the Journal, Madam Secretary.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Senate Journals of Thursday, May 25; Friday, May 26; Tuesday, May 30; Wednesday, May 31st; June -- Tuesday, June 6; Wednesday, June 7; Thursday, June 8, 1989.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH:

Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I move that the Journals just read by the Secretary be approved, unless some Senator has additions or corrections to offer.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

You've heard the motion as placed by Senator Smith. Is there any discussion? If not, all in favor, indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The motion carries, and it is so ordered. Committee Reports.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Senator Hall, Chairman of the Committee on Appropriations II, reports House Bills numbered 593, 859, 863, 864 and 1211 Do Pass, and House Bills numbered 592 and 860 Do Pass, as Amended.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

House Bills 1st Reading, Madam Secretary.

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SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 1578 offered by Senator Vadalabene.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

SECRETARY HAWKER:

A Message from the House by Mr. O'Brien, Clerk.

Mr. President - I am directed to inform the Senate that the House of Representatives has adopted the following joint resolution, in the adoption of which I am instructed to ask the concurrence of the Senate, to wit.

House Joint Resolution 18.

I have like messages on House Joint Resolution 50 and House Joint Resolution 58.

They were all three adopted by the House June 14, 1989.

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They were all substantive.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Executive. Resolutions.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Senate Resolution 425 offered by Senators Hawkinson and Luft.

Senate Resolution 426 offered by Senator Kelly.

Senate Resolution 427 offered by Senator Topinka.

And Senate Resolution 428 offered by Senator Berman.

They're all congratulatory.

Senate Joint Resolution 78 offered by Senators Friedland and Schaffer.

It is also congratulatory.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Consent Calendar. Senator Davidson, for what purpose do you arise, sir?

SENATOR DAVIDSON:

Mr. President and -- purpose to discharge committee. I mean, excuse me, Senate Joint Resolution from Exec. I've talked to Senator Joyce and Senator Karpiel, and you, and Senator Weaver -- I mean, excuse me, Senator Philip. Has to do with Senate Joint Resolution 67, which is a resolution which we need to send to Congress, dealing with the Farm Bill in 1990. And with that, I'd like to discharge Exec Committee, and move for the adoption of Senate Joint Resolution 67.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

All right. Senator Davidson has moved to discharge the Committee on Executive from further consideration of Senate Joint Resolution 67, and asks that it be immediately considered. All in favor of the motion, indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The motion carries. Now before us is Senate Joint Resolution 67. Senator Davidson.

SENATOR DAVIDSON:

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Mr. President, this is a joint resolution that we have by Federal Law to get to Congress, dealing with the 1990 Farm Bill. This is a joint effort among all the different farm groups, the Department of Conservation, and Illinois Department of Agriculture, and I move the adoption of Senate Joint Resolution 67.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

All right. Senator Davidson has moved the adoption of Senate Joint Resolution 67. Is there any discussion? If not, all in favor, indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The resolution is adopted. Senator Geo-Karis, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

Mr. President, I wanted to suspend the -- we got Senate Resolution 171, and I do have an amendment that I promised to put on, and it was on the Agreed Bill List in Executive. So I wonder if I could suspend the rules, and put the amendment on that -- Senate Resolution 171.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Well, we're not on the Order of Secretary's Desk. We'll get there.

SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

Okay. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

We'll get there. We're gonna -- we're gonna try to get through 2nd Reading today. ...(machine cutoff)... Ladies and Gentlemen, if I can call your attention to the Calendar, we'll begin on Page 50 -- 5-0, where we left off yesterday. That's House Bill 2201. I would just remind the Members that we have on the Calendar three hundred and twenty-eight House Bills on 2nd Reading. And we will be working through the afternoon till approximately five-thirty or six o'clock, and then come back at

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nine o'clock tomorrow morning and work until noon, in an attempt to move as many - if not all - of these House bills. All right. 2201. Senator D'Arco. 2205. Senator Marovitz. On the Order of House Bills 2nd Reading is House Bill 2205. Read the bill, Madam Secretary, please.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 2205.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Senator Marovitz offers Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Senator Marovitz, on Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

Thank you very much, Mr. President and Members of the Senate. Amendment No. 1 tries to address a problem that -- after passing mandatory auto insurance in this State, to guarantee rate protection to those who are insured under our new law, and that the rates will not be excessive. So that is what Amendment No. 1 is calculated to do. Next year automobile liability coverage for Illinois citizens becomes mandatory for the first time, and unless we act on insurance reform, we'll be the only State in the nation to require insurance without any State oversight of rates where there's mandatory coverage. If consumers are gonna be forced to buy insurance, then the State really should be obligated to insure that coverage is available at a rate that's fair and reflective of annual loss and premium experience. This flex rating amendment would require the companies to come in and justify increases or decreases of over ten percent before the Department of Insurance. It makes the Office of Director of Insurance elective, and

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establishes certain qualifications and powers, and I would ask for adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

All right. Senator Marovitz has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 2205. Discussion? Senator Schuneman.

SENATOR SCHUNEMAN:

Thank you, Mr. President. An inquiry of the Chair, Mr. President. Has this amendment been distributed?

PRESIDENT ROCK:

The -- the Chair is not in a position to answer that. I -- yesterday, as you know, we had all kinds of amendments put upon our desks. I just don't know. I would certainly inquire of the sponsor. Has the amendment been distributed, Senator Marovitz?

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

Well, the amendment was filed yesterday, and I -- if -- if -- as a courtesy to -- to my colleague, I would be happy to take this out of the record for the moment while we distribute it, as long as we have an agreement that we can get back to it. I would have no problem in doing that as a courtesy.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

That would be fine. Let's take it out of the record, Madam Secretary, and make sure that everybody receives a copy of this amendment. We will get -- with leave of the Body, we will get back to it when the sponsor indicates he has made the proper distribution. 2209. Senator Watson. Oh, there you are. Okay. On the Order of House Bills 2nd Reading, middle of Page 50, is House Bill 2209. Read the bill, Madam Secretary.

All right. Senate Philip's moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 2217. Discussion? If not, all in favor, indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment's adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Senator Philip offers Amendment No. 2.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Senator Philip.

SENATOR PHILIP:

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I'll -- I'll withdraw Amendment No. 2, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

All right. Further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No further amendments.

3rd Reading. 2219. Senator Zito. On the Order of House Bills 2nd Reading is House Bill 2219. Read the bill, please.

And since these authorities only meet -- well, I'll just say, in my area, once or twice a month, we're talking about seventy-five or a hundred and fifty dollars a month, but there's some feeling there should be some need for some compensation. Local option, though.

We believe this is a little more carefully drafted, in that it -- it only applies to pagers, and not other communications devices such as CBs or car telephones. Also, it carefully provides exceptions for those who come onto school properties as invitees or licensees, meaning those who come on to school property for business-related purposes or as social guests, such as those attending school functions. I'd be happy to answer any questions, and would otherwise move its adoption.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

All right. Senator Barkhausen has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 2 to House Bill 2450. Discussion? Senator Marovitz.

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

Thank you very much, Mr. President. I would question the Chair as to whether this amendment is in order. This amendment was embodied in Senate Bill 1331, which is still in the hands of the Judiciary Committee. There are -- we have already passed out several paging bills, and there are several more on the Calendar now. And I would question whether this amendment is in order.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

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amendment -- is germane to the subject matter - or the proposal is. All right. Senator -- any further discussion on adoption of Amendment No. 2? Senator Berman.

SENATOR BERMAN:

Well, Mr. President, you mentioned before we had something like seven hundred House Bills. Let me just suggest that there are already two pager bills on 3rd Reading which went through the Elementary and Secondary Education Committee. The last thing this Body needs is another pager bill, and for that reason I stand in opposition to this amendment.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

This is the draft that the administration most recently came to us with, and that is the only reason that I'm offering it. I think it's a little better drafted than some of the other bills, and therefore I ask for its adoption.

SENATOR ROCK:

Will the Gentleman explain the amendment?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Hudson.

SENATOR HUDSON:

Senator Rock, at this point I will defer to Senator Keats, who will explain the amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Keats.

SENATOR KEATS:

I think this is called the judicial equity amendment, that makes sure that the Cook County judiciary is treated the exact same way as the judiciary in the rest of the State, and it just seemed a fairness proposal, and we thought we would perhaps have another opportunity on it.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

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Senator Rock.

SENATOR ROCK:

Well, that I think is the whole point. You paint yourself a very pretty picture, but the fact is you are treating the judiciary in Cook County totally different than they are treated in the other twenty districts, and I don't think that is quite right. I would rise in strong opposition to this amendment, and ask, one, if it's germane, and two, if it's dilatory, and three, it's a cruddy amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All of the above. Yeah. Senator Keats, do you want to comment in that order, please?

SENATOR KEATS:

First, it ain't a cruddy amendment. Secondly, we can show that it does represent the way that the rest of the State is handled. Twenty districts have three hundred and eighty judges in one form; one has three hundred and sixty in a different. And on germaneness, this bill specifically amends the Supreme Court Act and deals with how it's operated and how it's run. It's very clear and very specific that it deals with the exact same area of the operations of the court.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Further discussion? Senator Brookins. We'll get back to you in a minute.

SENATOR BROOKINS:

Thank you, Mr. President. I rise in support of this

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amendment. What happened in the House is that it did not get a fair hearing. It did not go to -- in ultimates where that they would either vote it up or down, and we feel that this is a way that it would at least get a fair hearing, and I stand in support of this amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Further discussion? Senator Collins.

SENATOR COLLINS:

Yes. I have a question, although Senator Rock is not the sponsor, but I guess the question really is directed to Senator Rock, because I -- I don't think we would be here on this bill had there been some real efforts to work out this problem back home, and, Senator Rock, I just want to know whether or not you would be involved in spearheading -- and I guess Senator Madigan -- Representative Madigan too, the question should be asked in bringing about some solutions to the real problem of increasing minority judges, and that's what this is all about. I understand that there had been some promises to do this, but that people were not serious enough after the election was over and there was no real efforts to -- to try to resolve this problem. We wouldn't be in this position if that was not a most certainty. The community is demanding that we do something about it.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Well, before we go any further, the Chair has been informed by the Parliamentarian -- Senator Rock.

SENATOR ROCK:

Well, I just want to address that, because I happen to be one who sits on the Cook County Central Committee, and I was privy to and part of that agreement to have, in fact, encouraged more minorities both to stand for elective office, and to, in fact, be appointed as associates, and you and I both know that of that last list of associates that was approved by the full circuit, the

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minorities dominated that list. So to say that there has not been an effort is simply inaccurate. This, in my judgment, this amendment, as offered by our constitutional expert, Senator Keats, is in fact unconstitutional, and if, indeed, you wish to work toward a reasonable solution, I'm prepared to do that, but this -- this amendment simply does not accomplish what you are attempting to accomplish, and furthermore, in my judgment, it's not germane to a new Act.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. The Chair is prepared to -- to rule that it is, in fact, not germane. Senator Keats.

SENATOR KEATS:

Go ahead and finish. I'm just making sure I get called.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. The original bill, in fact, does create a new Act. The amendment is amending...(machine cutoff)...deals with the judicial structure, and therefore, it is the Chair's ruling that it is in fact non-germane. Senator Keats.

SENATOR KEATS:

First, I would appeal the ruling of the Chair. But I want to explain. There's a certain fundamental fairness issue that I would remind my beloved President. This is a new Act, and it deals with the Judiciary. Now we all know that the fools -- that the rules can be played with, but the simple fact is it's a new Act and it deals with productivity of the judiciary. There is no way in the world anyone can allege even the most wild-eyed interpretation of the rules that this thing is not germane. This is as germane as the tie on your -- on your neck, and to rule it such, it's just grossly unreasonable, and I would ask to override the Chair, and would allow others to say the same.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Senator Keats has challenged the Chair. He wishes

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to appeal the ruling. Is there discussion? Senator Geo-Karis.

SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

Well, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, this amendment is the answer to the so-called merit selection of judges, which is absolutely not merit selection, when a few people can decide who's going to be judge and who isn't. And I think that it's a very fair amendment, because it divides the Cook County into fifteen subdistricts where you don't have a bed-sheet ballot, and I think that it's a very good amendment, and I concur and support Senator Keats in moving to overrule the Chair.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Further discussion? Senator Rock.

SENATOR ROCK:

I will assume from that monologue that the Lady is willing to amend Lake County into this provision.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Geo-Karis.

SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

Mr. President, you forget, we don't have bed-sheet ballots in our county, so we don't need it.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Senator Keats, do you wish to have the thirty-six ruling or the forty-one? Senator Keats. The question is, on the -- the question is, shall the ruling of the -- of the Chair be sustained. All those in favor of sustaining the ruling will vote Aye. Those opposed to sustaining the ruling will vote Nay. The voting is open. It takes 36 to overrule. Those -- have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, the Ayes are 24, the Nays are 35. I'd appreciate your supporting me on this amendment, If you really believe that a number one valedictorian student ought to get special consideration and stay in Illinois and continue to make our economy and our schools the best in the United States, I ask you to join me on this amendment.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

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House Bill 2816.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

3rd Reading. Earlier today when we began, we began with Senator Marovitz's bill on Page -- Page 50. Was it 2205? Was -- was that the one, Senator Marovitz? And leave was granted to return to it, because there was a request for the amendment or amendments to be distributed. Leave was granted for us to return to this order of business, and therefore, with leave, we will go back to 2205 on Page 50, House Bills 2nd Reading. Senator Severns, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR SEVERNS:

I rise on a point of personal privilege. It -- it's my honor today to have in the gallery some friends from Caterpillar Company in Decatur joining us today in the Senate. I would like the Senate to join me in welcoming them.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. If our guests in the gallery will please rise and be welcomed. Sitting next to them also is a group of ladies from the Scott County Extension Service from my district, who are with us. Senator DeAngelis, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

Thank you, Mr. President. A question of the Chair.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

I'm thinking of the answer. Go right ahead.

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

Can you please explain why we're going back to this? I didn't

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quite hear the explanation.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Because we were -- because Senator Rock was presiding. Senator Marovitz -- we began with this order of business this morning. He presented his bill on the Order of 2nd Reading. There was a request from the other side, it's my understanding, because the amendments were not distributed. Senator Schuneman requested the bill be taken out of the record. There was -- leave was granted for us to go back to it, and therefore, we are here. Senator DeAngelis.

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

A very notable explanation.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Well, thank you kindly. All right. House Bills 2nd Reading is House Bill 2205, Madam Secretary.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 2205.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Senator Marovitz offers Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Marovitz.

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

Thank you very much, Mr. President and Members of the Senate. Once again, going back to Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 2205 dealing with the fact that we passed mandatory auto insurance last year, and it will become a law for the first time in Illinois. As a consequence, unless we, as lawmakers, act on insurance reform this year, Illinois will be the only State in the nation to

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require insurance without any State oversight of rates, when that mandatory insurance law takes effect. If consumers are going to be forced to buy insurance, then we, as lawmakers and the State, should be obligated to insure that those consumers have coverage available at a rate that is both fair and reflective of actual loss and of premium experience. This bill provides rate protection to insure that those rates are fair and not excessive. It contains essentially the same rating bill that was proposed last year and passed by this Body. Companies would come in and have to justify their increases of over ten percent. And if they can come in and justify to the Director of Insurance that they need a rate increase, they'll get it. It's just that simple. Under current law, insurance companies have to file their rates with the Department of Insurance for informational purposes only. I think this is a very important bill. A couple facts - statewide and nationally, auto insurance premiums have increased seventy-nine percent since 1982. That's three times faster than the consumer price index, which only increased twenty-six percent. Auto -- now many people will say, "Well, medical -- medical costs have increased, too." That's true. Medical costs have increased, but auto insurance premiums have increased thirty-six percent faster than medical costs, which have - as you know - increased tremendously. In 1986, seventeen of the twenty-three states with strict auto insurance rate regulation - seventeen of the twenty-three states with strict auto insurance regulation - have lower average premiums than Illinois. I think this is a very important piece of legislation. It just says if you need an increase, justify it, and you'll get it. That's all. We're not denying anybody an increase. But why shouldn't you have to go in, open your books, and show us that you need it, and then you'll get it. This is -- this is a -- a fair bill rate protection for people who are now going to have to buy auto insurance via the

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Mandatory Auto Insurance Law that we passed, and will soon go into effect, and I -- I urge your support of this amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Discussion? Senator Schuneman. Senator Schuneman.

SENATOR SCHUNEMAN:

Thank you, Mr. President. First of all, I appreciate the sponsor taking this out of the record earlier, so that we could have an opportunity to look at the amendment. There seems to be some confusion, however. Could I ask the Secretary what amendment is on her desk? And if it's the same one that was distributed?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

It's LRB860484800JSJWAM04.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Schuneman.

SENATOR SCHUNEMAN:

Well, that's not the amendment that was distributed. The one that we have is 02. So, it appears that the amendment that was distributed is not the one that's under discussion. I don't know what the differences are, but obviously there's some difference.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Marovitz.

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

Well, let me just say this. After -- after discussing with you, Senator Schuneman, I know that about two hours ago you -- you did have a copy of the correct amendment. I think it was the correct amendment. This is the same flex amendment that's been before this Body. The Insurance Committee. Passed the Senate. It's no different than -- than -- than has been proposed in this Body before.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Further -- Senator Schuneman.

SENATOR SCHUNEMAN:

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Well, I'm holding in my hand the amendment that I had when I spoke to you. So, you know, this has come up since that time. I -- I was not aware, frankly, that a different amendment had been distributed. But does your amendment call for the election of the Insurance Director? You didn't mention that in your explanation.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Marovitz.

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

You are correct. I did not mention that in my explanation, because it does not call for that.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Schuneman.

SENATOR SCHUNEMAN:

Well, the amendment that's circulated calls for an elected insurance commissioner. So I don't know how we get out of this bind, Mr. President, but, obviously, it's not correct.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Marovitz.

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

Once again, I'll be glad to take it out of the record, if we have agreement that we can get back to it before the end of the call. Is that sufficient, if we can get to it before the end of the call when it is distributed?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Schuneman.

SENATOR SCHUNEMAN:

Whatever's right, Mr. President. We simply want -- I think it's proper that the amendment that is going to be adopted be the amendment that's distributed, and you'd agree with that, I'm sure.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Leave is granted of the Chair to do whatever is right. I -- I heard it very clearly. All right. All right. If we'll turn over

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now to -- we're going to start over, apparently. On Page 38 -- Page 38, House Bills 2nd Reading. House Bills 2nd Reading, Page 38. Senator Marovitz. House Bill 4. On the Order of House Bills 2nd Reading is House Bill 4. Mr. Secretary, read the bill, please.

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

House Bill 4.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Any amendments from the Floor?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

3rd Reading. House Bill 32. Senator Maitland. On the Order of House Bills 2nd Reading is House Bill 32. Mr. Secretary, read the bill.

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

House Bill 32.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. The Committee on Higher Education offers one amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Maitland.

SENATOR MAITLAND:

Thank you very much, Mr. President and Members of the Senate. Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 32 puts it in the same posture as Senate Bill 27 was, that left this Chamber, and allows for a one -- one-time one-thousand-dollar contribution, and I would move for the adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Maitland has moved the adoption of Committee Amendment

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No. 1 to House Bill 32. Is there discussion? If not, those in favor will indicate by saying Aye. Opposed, Nay. The Ayes have it. Committee Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Further committee amendments?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

No further committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Any amendments from the Floor?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

3rd Reading. House Bill 34. Senator Jones. House Bills 2nd Reading, House Bill 34, Mr. Secretary.

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

House Bill 34.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Any amendments from the Floor?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Jones.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Jones.

SENATOR JONES:

Yeah. Thank you, Mr. President. Amendment No. 1 is merely a technical amendment, and I move its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Jones has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 34. Is there discussion? If not, those in favor will indicate by saying Aye. Opposed, Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Further amendments?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

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No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

3rd Reading. House Bill 34 <sic>. Senator Topinka. House Bills 2nd Reading, House Bill 43, Mr. Secretary.

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

House Bill 43.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Any amendments from the Floor?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

3rd Reading. House Bills 2nd Reading is House Bill 63. Senator D'Arco. House Bill 63, Mr. Secretary. Read the bill.

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

House Bill 63.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Any amendments from the Floor?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

3rd Reading. House Bill 64. Senator Kustra. House Bills 2nd Reading, House Bill 6-4, Mr. Secretary.

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

House Bill 64.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Any amendments from the Floor?

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ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator DeAngelis.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator DeAngelis. Senator DeAngelis.

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

Yes. I'm -- I'm being intimidated, Mr. President, but I'll handle this.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Your time's running.

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

Okay. Amendment No. 1 requires that the State Board pay to any school district which is at the maximum amount of all of its funds with both the permissible rate and by referendum. In other words, somebody who is not only taxed to the max, but also passed every possible referendum. It allows them to have -- receive a sum of three hundred and fifty dollars per pupil in average daily attendance. There's only one school district in the State of Illinois that qualifies for this. It happens to be, surprisingly enough, in my area. And let me point out to you that their tax rate at this time is seven dollars and eighty-nine cents for that district. And they have passed every referendum that's possible under law, and every fund, and they still do not have enough money to operate their schools.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Is there discussion? Discussion? Discussion? Oh, Senator Berman.

SENATOR BERMAN:

Thank you, Mr. President. A few questions of the sponsor.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

The sponsor indicates he will yield. Senator Berman.

SENATOR BERMAN:

How many students are there in average daily attendance in

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that -- in this school district?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator DeAngelis.

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

I think there's somewhere around two thousand.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Berman.

SENATOR BERMAN:

What is the total expenditure per pupil in that school district?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator DeAngelis.

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

Considerably less than the City of Chicago.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Berman.

SENATOR BERMAN:

Do you know how much it is?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator DeAngelis.

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

I don't -- I don't know specifically a dollar amount. It's somewhere around, I'd say, about twenty-eight hundred dollars.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Berman.

SENATOR BERMAN:

Thank you, Mr. President. I, respectfully, and with all deference to the excellent sponsor of the amendment, rise in opposition, and I just suggest that all of us listen carefully, because here is an excellent Senator, who's trying to do a great job for one school district. The trouble is that this amendment will cost all of us seven hundred thousand dollars to take care of

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Senator DeAngelis' school district, and next year there may be a few others that are going to come in and come under the fine terms of this amendment. And what it says is, "If you're already at the max, we're going to give you three hundred and fifty dollars per pupil additional State Aid." And you know where that State Aid is coming from - every other school district in the State. And I just don't think this is the way we ought to devise school aid. I stand in strong opposition to this bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator DeAngelis, to close.

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

Well, thank you, Mr. President. You know, Senator Berman, you've been the guru of education, and had this Body - including myself - acted more wisely we would not have to come forward with this. These people have done everything to help themselves that the law allows - that the law allows. They're the only school district in the State of Illinois that's done this. Now if we want to turn around - and I think that's one of reasons why we got kind of confused about education - if we want to turn around and tell those people who put maximum effort that we're going to turn our backs on them, then I think we're doing ourselves a great disfavor. There's one school district in the State of Illinois. Yes. But you know what - tomorrow it might be somebody else's school district that has this. And I would recommend that this is a small step - and if you're really that concerned about how much you're taking away, Senator Berman, it comes out to about twenty cents per student from all the other school districts.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

All right. Senator DeAngelis moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 64. All in favor, vote Aye. Opposed, Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wished? Have all voted who wished? Have all voted who wished? Have all voted who wished? Have all voted who

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wished? Take the record. On that question, there are 17 Yeas, 31 Nays, none voting Present, and Amendment No. -- No. 1 to House Bill 64 fails. Any further amendments?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

3rd Reading. House Bill 69. Senator Kelly. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

House Bill 69.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. The Committee on Public Health, Welfare and Corrections offers one amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY:

Thank you, Mr. President and Members of the Senate. The amendment -- committee amendment, which now becomes the bill, takes this from being a bill of rights for the developmentally disabled to a service form of law. This should have removed all the opposition by the Department, but due to some other reasons, it has not. But it -- it takes care of the -- the -- the dollar amount problem that the Department felt that the bill of rights would have required. There are a number other changes that are being -- being also made here, and if you have any questions with the rest - it makes this into a more acceptable bill, and I think would eliminate most of the opposition.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Kelly moves the adoption of Amendment No. -- No. 1. Any discussion? If not, those in favor, say Aye. Opposed, Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Any further committee amendments?

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ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

No further committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Any Floor amendments?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

3rd Reading. House Bill 74. Senator Fawell. Read the bill,
Mr. Secretary.

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

House Bill 74.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Any Floor amendments?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Fawell.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Fawell.

SENATOR FAWELL:

Thank you very much. This is the amendment that we talked about in committee that I agreed to put on. It -- it changes it from -- the wording now says that the person -- the student must be convicted of a -- of a cannabis violation in order not to receive his permit or to have his driver's license taken away till the age of eighteen. It also says that in -- once a person reaches the age of eighteen, he or she may apply to the Secretary of State for a restricted driving permit, and after a period of one year the Secretary of State may, at his discretion, issue a permit -- issue the person a regular driver's license --

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

All right. Any discussion?

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SENATOR FAWELL:

-- I'll answer any questions, or ask your support.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Fawell moves the adoption of Floor Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 74. All in favor, say Aye. Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Any further amendments?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

3rd Reading. House Bill 75. Senator Zito. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

House Bill 75.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Any Floor amendments?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

3rd Reading. House Bill 77. Senator Schaffer. Senator Schaffer. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

House Bill 77.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. The Committee on Transportation offers one amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Schaffer.

SENATOR SCHAFFER:

Mr. President, I believe there's a Floor amendment also filed. I would like to Table the committee amendment, and go with the

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Floor amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Schaffer moves to Table Committee Amendment No. 1. All in favor, say Aye. Opposed. The Ayes have it. Amendment -- Committee Amendment No. 1 is Tabled. Any further amendments?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

Amendment No. 2 offered by Senator Schaffer.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Schaffer.

SENATOR SCHAFFER:

Mr. President and Members of the Senate, this amendment simply provides that a school district -- and would request the highway authority to control the highway in front of the school for a no-passing zone when they believe a hazardous situation is in existence. And the appropriate highway authority - if it's a State highway, it'd be IDOT; if it's a township road, it'd be the Township Highway Commission; a county road, the County Highway Highway Commission; et cetera - would conduct a study, and if they determine it was hazardous, the school district and the appropriate authority would share in the cost of striping and signing a no-passing area. I believe it's a compromise everybody can live with.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Demuzio.

SENATOR DEMUZIO:

Well, I -- I just have a brief question. This looks like a vehicle bill to me. Can't they do this already, now?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Schaffer.

SENATOR SCHAFFER:

It's not a vehicle bill, although I understand where you're coming from. They can, but there's no formal procedure. And

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IDOT, frankly, is a little reluctant to do it, and the thought is that if the school districts share in the cost, and we have a formalized mechanism to do it that, in fact, we'll be able -- the school districts will be able to get the truly hazardous ones done, but not the frivolous ones.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Demuzio.

SENATOR DEMUZIO:

Oh! I -- I got it now. It's another mandate without any money. Thank you very much.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Hawkinson.

SENATOR HAWKINSON:

Thank you, Mr. President. Will the sponsor yield for a question?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

He indicates he will.

SENATOR HAWKINSON:

Senator, my only concern is -- is a liability question. Are we - and I haven't seen the language of your amendment - but are we, in any way, setting up IDOT or the schools for possible liability or a suit by someone alleging that this should have been declared a hazardous -- should have found this to be a hazardous intersection, when, in fact, a study determines that it's not?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Schaffer.

SENATOR SCHAFFER:

As a matter of fact, we're not talking about intersections, we're talking about no-passing zones. I do not believe this bill expands liability in any way. The -- if there's any liability, it's there now, and this bill won't diminish it or add to it.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

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Senator Thomas Dunn.

SENATOR T. DUNN:

Thank you, Mr. President. A question of the sponsor.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

He indicates he will yield.

SENATOR T. DUNN:

What about summer hours or summertime?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Schaffer.

SENATOR SCHAFFER:

Frankly, that's one of the things that IDOT or the appropriate highway authority has to consider - whether this is a part-time hazard, a full-time hazard. Frankly, in some of the school zones, even though the school's out of session, there are usually probably playgrounds and the buildings are used the year round. We thought this was a reasonable compromise to help the school districts get those truly hazardous situations striped without unduly -- getting areas striped where there was no need.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Further discussion? If not, Senator Schaffer moves -- oh, I'm sorry. Senator Dunn.

SENATOR T. DUNN:

Thank you. A follow-up question. What would be the distance covered by this in front of a school?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Schaffer.

SENATOR SCHAFFER:

It's my understanding that the...(inaudible)...rules and regulations set up a minimum district and set standards. Obviously, I would -- I'm sure, depend on the configuration of the school, the location of the crossing spots where kids cross the school, and it might be a block in one area, it might be three

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blocks in another, but it would have to be done by the experts on a item-by-item or project-by-project...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Schaffer moves the adoption of Amendment No. 2. All those in favor, say Aye. Opposed, Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 2 is adopted. Any further amendments?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

3rd Reading. House Bill 83. Senator Collins. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

So you might say we've -- we have also turned this into a buy Illinois Bill. We feel that with the emphasis on Illinois economy and so forth, if we're going to go this route, perhaps it's a good idea to -- to

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include Illinois in the purchase of -- of these goods. So, that's basically what it -- what it does.

Senator Collins.

SENATOR COLLINS:

Thank you, Mr. President and Members of the Senate. I rise in very strong opposition to this amendment. This amendment really will kill this bill. First of all, it's just not practical. The cost overrun on the various types of projects would be just prohibited if we restrict the projects to the purchase of those goods from Illinois, when in many instances, they're not even made in Illinois. I -- I just think that we ought to oppose this amendment, because it's most certainly is designed to kill this bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Jacobs.

SENATOR JACOBS:

Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the -- of the Senate. Senator Hudson, this is an excellent concept, and maybe it should be brought back next year in a separate bill. Senator Barkhausen moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 470. All in favor, say Aye. Opposed, Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Any further amendments?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

Amendment No. 2, I believe -- is that your amendment, Senator Barkhausen? Amendment No. 2?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Amendment No. 2. Do you have any further amendments, Senator Barkhausen?

SENATOR BARKHAUSEN:

Just Amendment No. 2, Mr. President. Amendment No. 2, Mr. President and Members, provides that one who is subject to a domestic violence order -- it makes it clear that that individual -- that spouse cannot have access to school records of the child as long as that order is in effect, and I would move its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Barkhausen moves the adoption of Amendment No. 2 to House Bill 470. All in favor, say Aye. Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 2 is adopted. Any further amendments?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

Thank you very much, Mr. President and Members of the Senate. This amendment just changes the formula for the number of toilet facilities per men and women, and makes it clear that this does not include sky-box capacity.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Marovitz moves the adoption of -- Senator Topinka.

SENATOR TOPINKA:

Yes, if I may ask the sponsor a question, please.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

He indicates he will yield.

SENATOR TOPINKA:

When this bill came up in the Senate Health and Human Services Committee, I believe you made mention that you intended to gut this bill out and amend it so that it, indeed, would pick up whatever proposals were now on line, being discussed - or possibly even agreed to, as things go on around here - involving the building of a new stadium on the west side. You know, is that true, or where -- where -- could you elaborate, please?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Marovitz.

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

That is not true at all. This is not going to be -- have -- this bill will have nothing to do with the stadium on the west

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side. This just has to do with -- it could affect any new stadiums, but this -- a stadium proposal will have -- will not be on this bill, I can assure you.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator -- does that satisfy everybody? Senator Donahue.

SENATOR DONAHUE:

Mr. President, a question of the sponsor.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

He indicates he will yield.

SENATOR DONAHUE:

You said that this bill was the vehicle for the "Bull Stadium" quote, in Public Health Committee, Senator Marovitz. You said that, and you said it to me.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Marovitz.

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

No, I didn't. I didn't say -- well, I'm sorry. I beg to differ with you. What I did say in committee was this bill might be used as a vehicle referring to washroom facilities which may be used in a new stadium. This is not the vehicle. This will never be the vehicle. This will never be amended to be the vehicle, and I don't even know if a vehicle will be coming down the pike. But if it -- if it is, I'm sure we'll all know about it at the same time. This could reflect -- this could refer to or involve a subsequent stadium that's built in the State of Illinois in -- in -- in regards to washroom facilities and washroom facilities only.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Savickas. Oh! I'm sorry --

SENATOR SAVICKAS:

Well, I would beg to differ with the Senator. That was our understanding in committee, that this would be a vehicle bill for

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that proposal. Otherwise, it never would have got out of committee. It was a vehicle bill for that proposal, so it was let out of committee. I don't care.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Donahue.

SENATOR DONAHUE:

Well, thank you. I -- I -- you're absolutely wrong, Senator Marovitz. You did say that, and in order -- because of that, I would ask for a roll call on this amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Karpel.

SENATOR KARPIEL:

Well, thank you, Mr. President. I just want to reiterate what Senator Donahue has been saying. This was the understanding in committee, that this was going to be a vehicle bill for a stadium. If it's not a vehicle bill, I just want to say that the bill is silly enough, this amendment is obviously sillier and designed to get this bill into a conference committee. And I would suggest that it is, in fact, a vehicle, and I would urge your No vote.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Netsch.

SENATOR NETSCH:

Well, I -- I think that -- thank you, Mr. President. That lays the groundwork for a question I was going to ask Senator Marovitz. I'm not clear, what does the bill say about bathrooms in stadia? And -- and secondly, when did we start legislating that at the State level to begin with?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

Senator Marovitz.

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

Well, first of all, if ever there's going to be any State dollars involved in any stadium at all, I think we have the right

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to guarantee that women - and that's particularly what this bill does - will have sufficient bathroom facilities if there's ever a -- a stadium built. And that's exactly what this does, to guarantee that there'll be sufficient bathroom facilities for men and for women. But if my colleagues on the other side of the aisle would like this to be a vehicle for a new stadium, maybe we ought to pull it out of the record for the moment --

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

That's a good idea.

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

-- that's a good idea. We'll pull it out of the record for the moment until the -- until that proposal comes down the pike.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR D'ARCO)

All right. Pull it out of the record. 525. House Bill 525. Senator Jones. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

SENATOR SEVERNS:

SENATOR J.J. JOYCE:

Thank you, Mr. President. This changes the distribution in the -- in the fee. It's a worked-out amendment on the Fertilizer Control Fund. I'd ask for the adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any discussion? The question is, shall Amendment No. 1 be adopted -- Amendment No. 2 be adopted? All those in favor, signify by saying Aye. Opposed. Amendment No. 2's adopted. Any further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Amendment No. 3 offered by Senator Joyce.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Joyce, Amendment No. 3.

SENATOR J.J. JOYCE:

Thank you, Mr. President. This amendment was requested at the Cooperative Extension Service. It solves a problem which exists in the distribution -- distributionment of funds to operate the Cooperative Extension offices in multicounty units. This amendment -- amendment will offer a more equitable guideline for equal distribution in multicounty units.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any discussion? The question, shall Amendment No. 3 be adopted. All those in favor, signify by saying Aye. Opposed. Amendment No. 3's adopted. Any further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

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3rd Reading. 1453. Senator Netsch. Read the bill.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 1453.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Senator DeAngelis offers Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator DeAngelis.

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

Thank you, Mr. President. This is a rather difficult amendment to introduce. However, out of fairness, it ought to be done. And that is this amendment prohibits the barring of any corporation from contracting with any unit of State or local government if one of its employees, without any authority, responsibility or participation on the part of the corporation, is adjudicated guilty of bid-rigging -- so it's unfair to punish an employer when an employee does something of a criminal nature. So I urge the adoption of Floor Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any discussion? Senator Netsch.

SENATOR NETSCH:

Thank you, Mr President. The amendment is being offered to my bill, and I'm aware of the fact that it is being offered, and I said I had -- no really firm objection to it. I just wanted to call attention to a couple of things. One is, I think the basic premise that if a corporation is totally innocent of any wrongdoing involving bid-rigging or any other illegal activity, and the action is, in fact, done by an employee sort of floating on his or her own, I think it certainly is fair that the

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corporation not be punished forever from being permitted to engage in any bids on any further public business or enter into any such arrangements. I think that it true. My only concerns were twofold. One, is that the amendment does not specifically say that that employee should no longer be working for the employer. Although I think that probably is the implication, it is not there in so many words. The one other thing that gives me pause a little bit, is that I think there have been some corporations in the past, both in this State and elsewhere, that have had a kind of multiple employees engaging in illegal activities, and at some point, you begin to wonder whether the corporation really is all that innocent. So I think it's -- it's a matter of just raising those concerns that I think it's important to do, but the underlying premise that a corporation should not be permanently barred for the illegal activity of an -- an employee when it is, in fact, really innocent, I think is a perfectly legitimate point of view.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Welch.

SENATOR WELCH:

I have a question of the sponsor.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Indicates he'll yield.

SENATOR WELCH:

Does this amendment include all corporate officers -- the corporate officers involved in some crime? Does that allow the corporation to later become involved in the State contracts in bidding?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator DeAngelis.

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

Senator Welch, could you just repeat that one more time?

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PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Welch.

SENATOR WELCH:

Well, I -- I heard Senator Netsch talking about employees. What about corporate officers, vice presidents of a corporation, for instance, who were involved in -- in some type of criminal activity, who were found guilty. Is that corporation then allowed to be involved in bidding and State contracts after that occurs, under your amendment?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator DeAngelis.

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

Well, it doesn't say that they can't. It says employee or agent, and I would assume that if it were an officer -- they would not be barred. I mean -- if the -- if the -- if the officer is an employee.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Welch.

SENATOR WELCH:

Can -- can you tell me...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

DeAngelis -- I'm sorry.

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

Well, maybe I can enlighten you a little further on this. If that person authorized it, then they would be barred. This only pertains to an employee who was not authorized by anybody in the company to do it. If that person's an officer and they authorized it, they're dead in the water - they're going to get barred.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Welch.

SENATOR WELCH:

Well, could I ask you what the origin of this amendment is?

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Did this come from a particular company or lobbyist, or where did this amendment come from?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator DeAngelis.

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

Yes, it did. It came from representatives for waste management, which has been convicted in some other states of bid-rigging by some of its other subsidiaries. However, there was an incident that occurred in my district, where we had to seek an exemption on a State project of vital importance because one of the employees, back in the days when Jack Walker was here, was involved in something. So -- I mean, we had a situation in our area where this happened.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Welch.

SENATOR WELCH:

Well, waste management has had some problems, and this amendment is to make sure that they can continue to do business, have State contracts, and -- and bid on State contracts as well. What's the rationale for having a corporation that -- had someone, albeit in a different state, be convicted, but yet still be engaged in dealing with the State of Illinois? Shouldn't there be some limitation on how many years they have to be prohibited from dealing with the State before they're allowed to deal in Illinois?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator DeAngelis.

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

Well, I know -- I know that waste management is a -- a comfortable target for almost everybody, but I don't know how you can, in fairness, find a corporation guilty of doing something that it had absolutely no knowledge of. I mean this is -- clearly indicates that -- that the company had no knowledge of the

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authorized request that the commander performed. I mean -- My God, we live under a system of laws, and if you're going to turn around and make everybody guilty for the action of an employee, I think the circle would be far greater than waste management.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Welch.

SENATOR WELCH:

That's why I posed the question as to officers. My understanding was that there may be some officers of the corporation involved. Now the corporation does act through its officers, and in that circumstance, certainly the corporation should be responsible, and certainly they should be held accountable. A corporation isn't a living body. It only exists through its officers and board of directors.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator DeAngelis, to close.

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

Yeah, well, I -- I think there's enough questions on it that maybe, if we adopt this, that we ought to put it into conference, because to answer Senator Netsch's question about the employees not being there -- but let me warn you about one other thing, though. We have banks where they have more officers than they have employees, and it's -- there isn't a day that doesn't go by that some bank doesn't have one of its officers commit a crime, and to turn around and prohibit them from dealing with the State Treasurer and so forth -- I mean, I'm happy to do it, but -- but it ought to be a little more tightly written, and I'll be happy to do that at that time. If not, we'll hold the bill. Or Senator Netsch can hold the bill. It's her bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Netsch. Senator Netsch.

SENATOR NETSCH:

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Thank you. If I might. Go ahead and put this amendment on, so we have the language out. The more I'm looking at it, the more I think it is not as artfully done as it ought, in several respects, including the one that Senator Welch raised, and mine. It's my bill. I can bring it back. We're going to get a better amendment. But go ahead and proceed, for the moment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

The question is, shall Amendment No. 1 be adopted? All in favor, signify by saying Aye. Opposed. Amendment No. 1's adopted. Any further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

3rd Reading. On top of Page 47 appears House Bill 1463. Senator Barkhausen. Read the bill.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 1463.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. The Committee on Judiciary offers Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Barkhausen, Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR BARKHAUSEN:

Mr. President and Members, Amendment No. 1 restores some preexisting language in the bill that had been inadvertently deleted, and I ask for its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

The question is, shall Amendment No. 1 be adopted. All in favor, signify by saying Aye. Opposed. Amendment No. 1's adopted. Any further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Committee Amendment No. 2.

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PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Barkhausen, Amendment No. 2.

SENATOR BARKHAUSEN:

Amendment No. 2 is some technical language suggested by the Department of State Police, which is offering this bill, and I ask for its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

The Gentleman moves the adoption of Amendment No. 2. All in favor, signify by saying Aye. Opposed. Amendment No. 2's adopted. Any further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No further committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

3rd Reading. 1479. Senator Kelly. Read the bill.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 1479.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

3rd Reading. 1486. Senator Holmberg. Read the bill.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 1486.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

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PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

3rd Reading. 1508. Senator Kelly. Read the bill.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 1508.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Senators Topinka and Fawell offer Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Topinka.

SENATOR TOPINKA:

Yes. Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. Amendment No. 1 basically asks the Department of Mental Health to come up with a funding formula -- equitable funding formula for community mental health.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any discussion? Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL:

You passed 1505.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Yeah. You've got an amendment. I'll get back to it. Thanks.

SENATOR HALL:

All right.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Kelly. Kelly, on the amendment.

SENATOR KELLY:

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Thank you, Mr. President. This amendment -- and I know that the sponsor is very sincere and even points out that it might be advantageous to the suburban district that I -- I represent. But this bill is under negotiations, and if the Senator could -- could withhold it, we'll try to address that issue and especially if it helps my area, I certainly would be favorable to having that concept in. In fact, I -- that's why I would ask her to withdraw the amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Topinka.

SENATOR TOPINKA:

If the -- if -- if the issue is under negotiations, then why are you moving the bill in general? I mean, it -- this is something that the Department of Public - I'm sorry - the Department of Mental Health has been discussing with me for three years now, and have promised that they would do. This is the only way I can get them into negotiations to look at this issue. It is totally permissive, but it does kind of urge them on in this direction. And, indeed, it would have a benefit to suburban areas.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Hawkinson.

SENATOR HAWKINSON:

Question for the sponsor of the amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Indicates she'll yield.

SENATOR HAWKINSON:

Senator, is this the same as a Senate Bill that we debated earlier on the formula for community mental health funds?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Topinka.

SENATOR TOPINKA:

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Yes, it is.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Fawell.

SENATOR FAWELL:

I would like to speak in favor of this amendment. All it does is ask the Department to start looking at some kind of a formula, so that there can be a more equitable way of -- of doing this. I have talked to the Department myself about this. On the original bill that -- when we presented our -- version of the formula, -- there were some figures that were given - and I wish the staff member would listen to me - there were some figures that were given, and when I asked where in the world those figures ever came from, no one could tell me. Absolutely no one. The Department said that no one had spoken to them, and where in the world those figures ever came from, we will -- I will -- guess I will never know. But this bill basically says, at least take a look at it. Do it. I mean -- and -- and I -- I think it's about time the Department started -- instead of just giving to the...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Kelly.

SENATOR FAWELL:

...squeaky wheel, do something.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Good. Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY:

Well, thank you, Mr. President. I once again would renew my request of the sponsor to hold this amendment. Apparently, she wants to go forward with it. We are negotiating, and I certainly would like to -- like to work with her on this concept. And if it even gets defeated, I would still like to work with her on it. But we want to move the bill along, but at the same time, this amendment doesn't belong on there. As was pointed out, this was

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already -- this issue was already defeated, and I would -- would ask for your opposition.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Topinka, to close.

SENATOR TOPINKA:

Well, to -- to the sponsor of of the bill. You know, considering that you are negotiating, this, I think, would be a very legitimate piece of that negotiations. We are not asking that the Department do anything but look at the issue. What was discussed here when we defeated the bill -- and -- or when it was a bill, in terms of numerical figures on any potential formula, no one even knows where those figures came from, because there is no formula --

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Good.

SENATOR TOPINKA:

We are asking them to look at a formula. So there are no figures for something that does not exist. And I would ask the -- the good sponsor of this very good legislation to include this in his negotiations, because it is the only option we have to have this issue looked at this year, and it is something that is very imperative.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

The question is, shall Amendment No. 1 be adopted. All in favor, signify by saying Aye. Opposed. Amendment No. 1's defeated. Sure. All in favor, vote Aye. All opposed, vote Nay. Voting is open. Joyce, give me a No. All those in favor, vote Aye. All opposed, vote Nay. We want No. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Clerk will take the record. On this -- question, there are 24 Ayes, 29 Nays. The amendment's defeated. I was right the first time. Any further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

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No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

3rd Reading. I skipped 1505 inadvertently. Please read House Bill 1505. Senator Holmberg. Read the bill.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 1505.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Senator Hall offers Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Hall, Amendment No. 1. 1505.

SENATOR HALL:

Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. This amendment is by Senator Watson and I, and it amends the School Code. It exempts some teachers' certification application from the required subject matter test, if no test in the applicant's major field is offered. The legislation's in response to a constituent who is now in Senator Watson's area, who is not able to take a test in her major field of study - psychology - because SBE does not offer tests in that field. SBE states that the demand for teachers in psychology does not warrant offering a test. They do not offer tests in various areas, for this same reason. Now, this young lady has a job waiting on her, and because she cannot take the test -- and that's why that we...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any discussion?

SENATOR HALL:

...And this is SBE's language.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

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The question is, shall amendment -- Senator Holmberg. The question is, shall Amendment No. 1 be adopted. All those in favor, signify by saying Aye. Opposed. Amendment No. 1's adopted. Any further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

3rd Reading. 1514. Senator Dunn. Read the bill.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Wait. Out of the record. 1523. Senator Maitland. Maitland. Out of the record. 1530. Senator Marovitz. Out of the record. 1553. Senator Jones. Out of the record. 1555. Senator Holmberg. Read the bill.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 1555.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Senator Watson offers Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Watson.

SENATOR WATSON:

Yes. Thank you, Mr. President. This particular piece of legislation was heard in the Elementary and Secondary Education Committee. And it provides that the collective bargaining unit for the school districts will select five individuals who then will serve on the Educational Service Center Boards. I just had a problem with this. I just felt that -- that the collective

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bargaining agent shouldn't necessarily have to be the one to make the decision. If we've got people and teachers who are interested in serving on these boards that aren't necessarily members of the -- of the local union, then I don't -- I'm sure they're going to be excluded from any possible participation if they aren't members of the union. This amendment just simply says that three members will be selected, and I do think that -- that teachers should be involved in this, and I -- I certainly encourage that. Three teachers will be selected, and not necessarily by the collective bargaining agent.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

On that question -- Senator Holmberg, on Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR HOLMBERG:

I -- I rise against Senator Watson's amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Excuse me ma'am. Please, proceed ma'am.

SENATOR HOLMBERG:

I rise against Senator Watson's amendment. This bill was heard in committee. The committee suggested an amendment. Originally it read "a majority of -- of the board shall consist of teachers." It was Senator Newhouse's suggestion. We amended it to five. That was the committee agreement. That's the way it was passed out. That's the way this Body -- I would recommend that this Body accept it. As to Senator Watson's arguments that teachers who are not part of a collective bargaining unit could not participate, in the language of the bill they only make nominations to the board or to the -- to the ESR chairman, and that person may choose which teachers he or she would like to have on the board. Also, that person is not limited to those who come from the collective bargaining unit. If you carefully read the language that -- that person would have complete say-so on which people are appointed to the board. The only thing that the

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agreed-on committee amendment says is that there will be five teachers, and I would recommend to the Body that it remain that way.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Watson, to close.

SENATOR WATSON:

Well, thank you. There would be five teachers nominated by those local bargaining representatives, and I dare to say that anyone who isn't a member of that particular local bargaining process won't be nominated. So I think anyone who's not a member will be excluded from participation, and I really think that's -- that's too bad. Because there are some good teachers out there that aren't necessarily members of the union, who probably would like to participate, and would like to be selected, but I think that because of the language here, they would be excluded completely. I move for its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

The question is, shall Amendment No. 1 be adopted. All those in favor, signify by saying Aye. All opposed, say No. The Noes have it. Amendment No. 1's -- lost. Any further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

3rd Reading. 1557. Senator Schaffer. Schaffer. 1559. Senator Hall. Read the bill.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 1559. House Bill 1559.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

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No Floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

3rd Reading. 1571. Senator Kelly. Read the bill.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 1571.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. The Committee on Public Health, Welfare and Corrections offers Committee Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Kelly, Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR KELLY:

Thank you, Mr. President and Members of the Senate. This is another amongst the Mental Health package, and we would also like to move this bill along for further negotiations. Senator Schaffer and I have been meeting with the Department of Mental Health and Public Health, and we're very close to whittling down almost all of the controversial aspects of this bill. And I would ask for your approval of this amendment, which is somewhat lengthy, but at the same time it's an issue that we're going to resolve. When it gets on 3rd Reading, we'll get it recalled.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

The Gentleman moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1. Any discussion? The question is, shall Amendment No. 1 be adopted. All in favor, signify by saying Aye. Opposed. Amendment No. 1's adopted. Any further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No further committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

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3rd Reading. 1591. Senator Luft. Read the bill.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 1591.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

3rd Reading. Top of Page 48 appears 1621. Senator Rock.
Read the bill.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 1621.

(Secretary begins to read title of bill)

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

No, wait a minute. I don't see him on the Floor. Take it out
of the record. 1648. Senator Hall. Read the bill.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 1648.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

3rd Reading. 1653. Senator Hall. Read the bill.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 1653.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

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PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

3rd Reading. 1661. Senator Woodyard. Read the bill.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 1661.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. The Committee on Public Health, Welfare and Corrections offers Committee Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Woodyard.

SENATOR WOODYARD:

Thank you, Mr. President and Members of the Senate. This amendment actually has two provisions that are agreed to by Department of Public Health. In one area, it deletes any reference to art supplies that are within the bill itself, and in the other provision, it removes mobile parks from any liability for not providing some kind of a little pamphlet to dwellers of mobile homes.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any discussion? The question is, shall Amendment No. 1 be adopted. All in favor, signify by saying Aye. Opposed. Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Any further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No further committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Senator Woodyard offers Amendment No. 2.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

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Senator Woodyard. He -- he explained them both - Amendments 1 and 2. What's Amendment No. 2 do?

SENATOR WOODYARD:

Mr. President, it was my opinion that there was one amendment filed, and then I thought that was withdrawn. And there was a composite amendment that I just explained that would become Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Well, we're gonna have to bring it back out of the record, because we're not mind readers up here. So, 1661 will remain on the Calendar as unamended until we find out which amendments are the right ones, and we'll get back to it today. So, you want to come over here and get your amendments straightened out? 1667. Senator O'Daniel. O'Daniel. Out of the record. 1686. Senator Maitland. Out of the record. 1692. Senator Woodyard. 1692. You got an amendment on that one, too. Read the bill.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 1692.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

3rd Reading. My mistake. Senator Woodyard.

SENATOR WOODYARD:

Mr. President, I had intended to leave that bill on 2nd Reading.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

All right. We'll leave it on 2nd Reading. No problem.

SENATOR WOODYARD:

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If that's...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Put 1692 back on 2nd Reading. 1695. Senator Kustra. Out of the record. 1719. Senator Luft. Is Luft back there? I can't see through you, Howie. Out of the record. 1721. Luft. Out of the record. 1724. Senator Welch. Read the bill.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 1724.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

3rd Reading. 1737. Out of the record. 1782. O'Daniel. Read the bill.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 1782.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. The Committee on Transportation offers Committee Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator O'Daniel, Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR O'DANIEL:

Thank you, Mr. President and Members of the Senate. Amendment No. 1 says that beginning in -- in Fiscal Year 1990, increases by ten percent the size of the allocation a participant in the Downstate Public Transportation Act may receive from the Downstate Public Transportation Fund. It authorizes the State to overmatch any federal grant to the local mass transit district. I'd move for its adoption.

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PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any discussion? The question is, shall Amendment No. 1 be adopted. All those in favor, signify by saying Aye. Opposed. Amendment No. 1's adopted. Any further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No further committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Senator O'Daniel offers Amendment No. 2.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator O'Daniel, Amendment No. 2.

SENATOR O'DANIEL:

Thank you, Mr. President and Members of the Senate. Amendment No. 2 is just a technical amendment. It corrects some language in Committee Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

The Gentleman moves the adoption of the technical Amendment No. 2. All in favor, signify by saying Aye. Opposed. Amendment No. 2's adopted. Any further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Senator O'Daniel offers Amendment No. 3.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator O'Daniel, Amendment No. 3.

SENATOR O'DANIEL:

Thank you, Mr. President and Members of the Senate. This amendment reduces the number of Section 18 qualifiers that would be eligible for additional DOT grants. The amendment is sought by the Department of Transportation, and would bar three Section 18 qualifiers from receiving two operating grants apiece for their operating expenses. I'd move for its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

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Any discussion? The question is, shall Amendment No. 3 be adopted. All those in favor, signify by saying Aye. Opposed. Amendment No. 3's adopted. Any further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

3rd Reading. 1847. Senator Schaffer. Out of the record. 1860. Senator Barkhausen. Out of the record. Let's get back to 1661. Read the bill. Senator Woodyard.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 1661.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. The Committee on Public Health, Welfare and Corrections offers Committee Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Woodyard, Committee Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR WOODYARD:

Thank you, Mr. President and I do apologize to the Body for the confusion on this. When -- when 1661 was originally drafted, it was actually the rewrite of the Structural Pest Control Act. There was not agreement in that Act between Public Health and the various associations involved, so the committee amendment in the Senate actually became the bill, that basically are some cleanup things that Department of Public Health requested, involving brochures and pamphlets for mobile home parks. It does some things with swimming pools and spas. I know of no opposition to Committee Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any discussion? Question is, shall Committee Amendment No. 1 be adopted. All in favor, signify by saying Aye. Opposed. Committee Amendment No. 1's adopted. Any further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

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Amendment No. 2 offered by Senator -- pardon me -- no further committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Senator Woodyard offers Amendment No. 2.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Woodyard.

SENATOR WOODYARD:

Yes, Mr. President. There was a provision in that Committee Amendment that JCAR had some problems with, and this would exempt these art supplies from -- from being listed. It deletes any reference to them. Also, I would like to read into the record in the adoption - and I mentioned the mobile home pamphlets for legislative intent - this particular short statement, "Changes the requirement of mobile home park owners to provide mobile home owners with Department of Public Health's pamphlet on tie-downs. Mobile home park owners will be required to make these pamphlets available. This legislation is not intended to create a liability for mobile home park owners, but to make sure that information on the installation of tie-down equipment is available to mobile -- mobile home owners." And I would move for the adoption of Amendment No. 2.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any discussion? Question is, shall Amendment No. 2 be adopted. All those in favor, signify by saying Aye. Opposed. Amendment No. 2's adopted. Any further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

3rd Reading. On top of Page 49 appears House Bill 1876. Senator Watson. Read the bill.

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SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 1876.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Senator Watson offers Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Watson, Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR WATSON:

Yes. Thank you, Mr. President. This will be a first of several amendments. This is the same legislation we had yesterday dealing with the AIDS problem that we're having. And the first amendment we have here is more or less cleanup language. It specifies that a positive test result must be confirmed by a second more reliable test. I move for its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any discussion? The question is, shall Amendment No. 1 be adopted. All in favor, signify by saying Aye. Opposed. Amendment No. 1's adopted. Any further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Amendment No. 2 offered by Senator Watson.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Watson.

SENATOR WATSON:

Thank you, Mr. President. Amendment No. 2 simply says that the Department of Corrections shall test a prisoner either sixteen or fifteen days prior to release, and then would notify the spouse if, in fact, an infection is available, and there would be counseling for that individual. This is a -- as a result. This is coming forth, really, from the Department of Corrections.

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PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any discussion? The question is, shall Amendment No. 2 be adopted. All those in favor, signify by saying Aye. Opposed. Amendment No. 2's adopted. Any further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Amendment No. 3 offered by Senator Watson.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Watson.

SENATOR WATSON:

Yes. This would require the Department of Public Health to request monthly from the Federal Government reports on the HIV infection in Illinois. I move for its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any discussion? The question is, shall Amendment No. 3 be adopted. All in favor, signify by saying Aye. Opposed. Amendment No. 3's adopted. Any further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Amendment No. 4 offered by Senator Watson.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Watson.

SENATOR WATSON:

Thank you, Mr. President. Amendment No. 4 would require the Department of Alcohol and Substance Abuse to provide HIV testing for everyone accepting treatment at a drug abuse center, unless that person refuses the test. If that person refuses the test, then counseling must be given.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any discussion? The question is, shall Amendment No. 4 be adopted. All those in favor, signify by saying Aye. Opposed. Amendment No. 4 is adopted. Any further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Amendment No. 5 offered by Senator Watson.

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PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Watson.

SENATOR WATSON:

Yes. Thank you. Amendment No. 5. In certain abuse cases, the Department of Children and Family Services would be required to petition the court to issue an order authorizing disclosure to the Department any -- or any other appropriate person, the results of an HIV test previously performed. And it would issue an order directing the perpetrator to submit to HIV testing, and authorizing disclosure of that test results.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any discussion? The question is, shall Amendment No. 5 be adopted. All in favor, signify by saying Aye. Opposed. Amendment No. 5's adopted. Any further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Amendment No. 6 offered by Senator Watson.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Watson.

SENATOR WATSON:

This would require insurance companies which -- which requires applicants for policies to be tested for HIV, and would maintain a data base and information in regard to those tests, and make those tests available to the Department of Public Health. There would be a confidentiality provision still -- would require, and it would also say that the physicians would -- must notify -- be notified by an insurance company or health service corporation of an applicant's positive test results. I move for its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Any discussion? Senator Hawkinson.

SENATOR HAWKINSON:

Will the sponsor yield for a question?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

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Indicates he will.

SENATOR HAWKINSON:

What applicants for what insurance policies will have to be tested for HIV?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Watson.

SENATOR WATSON:

An applicant for an insurance policy, in which that policy would require that individual to be tested. The results then must be notified or sent to the Department of Public Health.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Big brother. Senator Hawkinson.

SENATOR HAWKINSON:

Are these life insurance policies? Health insurance policies? Any company can require applicants - any and all applicants - to be tested?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Watson.

SENATOR WATSON:

This is not allowing them to. This is simply -- if they do require it, it must be reported - the results - the positive result to the Department.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Hawkinson.

SENATOR HAWKINSON:

Does this, in any way, authorize insurance companies to require HIV testing?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Watson.

SENATOR WATSON:

No.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

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Senator Hawkinson. On the issue? Senator Schuneman.

SENATOR SCHUNEMAN:

Thank you, Mr. President. My good friend, what are you doing here?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

He's not responding. Senator Watson, what are you doing here?

SENATOR WATSON:

Well, any insurance company, Senator, that requires an applicant to be tested for HIV, those test results if, in fact, are positive, then should be -- the Department of Public Health should be notified of those results.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LECHOWICZ)

Senator Schuneman.

SENATOR SCHUNEMAN:

Well, I think I'll stand in opposition to this amendment. Senator Marovitz has been down this road several times. And while I understand what it is you're trying to do, the -- generally the tests that insurance companies perform -- the physical tests are -- confidentially -- confidentiality is a strictly regulated matter, and I really think that before we adopt an amendment like this, we ought to have a little more study of what we're doing. So I think at this time, I'd have to stand in opposition to the amendment.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

All right. The question is the adoption of Amendment No. 6.
Senator Watson.

SENATOR WATSON:

Yes. Can I just close, sir?

PRESIDENT ROCK:

You certainly may. Senator Watson, to close.

SENATOR WATSON:

Okay. Thank you. Well, one of the -- the main concerns that

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we have with the AIDS problem is really -- there's only two things we can do at this point. We can educate the people, and we can identify. And we have certain restraints right now that protect the confidentiality of that individual who has been tested for HIV, within the rules of -- of the Department of Public Health. All we're saying here is an insurance company -- if you find someone who's been tested and has been tested positive for HIV, then, in fact, that -- that person's name should be made available to the Department. And that's just to try to protect, and, in fact, if nothing else, to work with that individual who has the infection, and counsel with that individual, and give him some -- some support. And that's really basically what -- all we're after here - identification and hopefully protection then of the unknowing public. I move for its adoption.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

The question is, the adoption of Amendment No. 6 to House Bill 1876. Those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed will vote Nay. And the voting is open. All voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? All voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 19 Ayes, 25 Nays. The amendment fails. Further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Amendment No. 7 offered by Senator Watson.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Senator Watson, on Amendment No. 7.

SENATOR WATSON:

Okay. This shouldn't be as controversial. This would require the Department of Public Health to report monthly the number of AIDS cases in various population categories. It's just simply a matter of making the -- the public aware.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Discussion? Senator Jacobs.

SENATOR JACOBS:

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Just a ruling from the Chair. With the defeat of Amendment 6, does Amendment 7 track?

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Appears it does. Further discussion on Amendment No. 7? If not, all in favor, indicate by saying -- I'm sorry. Senator Marovitz.

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

How this amendment differ from the last one?

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Senator Watson.

SENATOR WATSON:

This has nothing to do with insurance and reporting that information to the Department of Public Health. This just simply asks the Department of Public Health to -- to publish statistics.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Further discussion? If not, all in favor, indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment's adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No further amendments.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

3rd Reading. 1878. Senator Watson. Read the bill, please, Madam Secretary.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 1878.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Senator Watson offers Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

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Senator Watson.

SENATOR WATSON:

Yes. Thank you, Mr. President. The first amendment was brought to me by the Illinois Medical Society, and it just clarifies some concerns that they had about notifying a spouse. I move for its adoption.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Senator Watson has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 1878. Any discussion? If not, all in favor will indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment's adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Amendment No. 2 offered by Senator Watson.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Senator Watson.

SENATOR WATSON:

I'd like to withdraw Amendment No. 2.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Amendment No. 3 <sic> offered by Senator Watson.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

2.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Pardon me.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Senator Watson, on Amendment No. 2.

SENATOR WATSON:

Thank you, Mr. President. This amendment would require the Department of Corrections to test prisoners as they come into the system, and as they go out. I move for its adoption.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

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All right. Senator Watson has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 2 to House Bill 1878. Discussion? Senator Marovitz.

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

Well, a couple questions, Senator. What's the fiscal impact of this? You're requiring the Department of Corrections to test all prisoners released for HIV. Is that correct?

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Senator Watson.

SENATOR WATSON:

The -- I'm sorry. You were asking about inmates going out -- what -- what that would be? Roughly around three -- three hundred to six hundred thousand dollars. That was the amendment we adopted on the previous bill. This particular bill says that they will test when they come in and will test when they go out. The fiscal impact on this one is somewhere in the neighborhood of six dollars a test, times twenty-two thousand inmates.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Senator Marovitz.

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

Now, wait a minute. You're going to test all -- every inmate that comes into the correctional system in Illinois? Every inmate that comes into the correctional system is going to be tested. Now when we talk about the fiscal impact, let me ask you a question. When somebody tests positive, what are you going to do with that person? You're going to put them in a -- in a cell with two or three other people? What are you going to do with them? We're talking about fiscal impact here. Let's get it right out in the open.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Senator Watson.

SENATOR WATSON:

They would be segregated, Senator. They would be -- we would

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protect the other inmates from this individual.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Senator Marovitz.

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

That's -- that's fine. They're going to be segregated. Now, that means there's going to be an additional cost. You can't just say the cost's going to be six dollars for the test. You're going to have to set up completely separate segregated prison wings for people who test positive. Now, let's talk about the costs of setting up those separate prison wings. We're here trying to talk about our prison population, the overcrowding of county jails, the need for more prisons. Now, we're going to set up separate prison wings for people who test positive. Let's find out what the fiscal impact is. And you can't talk about the fiscal impact by saying it's six dollars a test. That's got nothing -- that's -- that's small potatoes next to what we're talking about here.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Further discussion? Senator DeAngelis.

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

Yeah. Thank you, Mr. President. Question of the sponsor.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Indicates he'll yield. Senator DeAngelis. Senator Watson. Senator Watson, a question. Indicates he'll yield, Senator DeAngelis.

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

Senator Watson, I'm - as you know - in favor of about ninety-five percent of what you're attempting to do here. I do have a concern about this. First of all, on the bill that I passed, the Department can currently test if they wish to. The reason that I really am opposed to mandate it, is that what you do is you make everybody who passes it fair game for the other people in the prison. And I think you might be a little better off

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leaving some doubt, because -- because if you -- if you turn around and segregate, then those who aren't in there are, in fact, safe. And prisons are tough enough to manage, as they are right now, without creating a bigger problem by allowing those who wish to engage in some activities know that they won't be at risk, if they do. I think we have to leave a little doubt. If the Department wants to test everyone, let them do it. And -- but nobody will know who is safe and who is not safe.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Further discussion? Senator Netsch.

SENATOR NETSCH:

Thank you, Mr. President. Two points - one, I would like to just address the -- the question of fiscal impact, because I -- I think that is not inconsequential. I have a copy of the fiscal note that the Department of Corrections filed in the House to the -- a similar provision on, I think it was House Bill 744, and if this is not correct, you tell me why it is not correct, Senator Watson. Their estimate is between -- their estimate of the cost is between 13.1 million and 53.7 million dollars. If that is not - and I think it has to do not just with the cost of the testing, but also with the cost of the segregation, which would require a whole lot of physical accommodations that simply do not exist right now - if that is not correct, I would like you to explain to me why it is not correct. The second point, and this is really a question, also - am I correct that the Department of Corrections does not support this particular version of testing? They do have a testing program which is within their own guidelines. My understanding is that they do not want this degree of mandated testing. Is that correct?

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Senator Watson.

SENATOR WATSON:

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Well, thank you. You asked so many questions there, I'm not sure what -- but the last question, in regard to the Department's support of this amendment, you're quite correct. They do not support this amendment. They do random testing now, and that's done by -- through a grant from the Federal Government. The fiscal impact, as you could tell, you said 13.1 million to fifty some million. Obviously, they're not sure either with that wide of range, but there is naturally going to be a considerable impact when you start segregating prisoners. There's no doubt about that.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

All right. Further discussion. Senator Alexander.

SENATOR ALEXANDER:

Thank you, Mr. President. I'm a prisoner sentenced by the court to do five years. I am a prisoner, if your bill goes through, that is discovered to have AIDS. You are saying that now I should be segregated. Does your bill call for segregation - one. Two, if I am segregated, are you not appending or adding to the increased penalty that the court did not provide for me on the judgment of conviction at the time I was sentenced?

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Senator Watson.

SENATOR WATSON:

Well, the answer to the first question is yes. It does require segregation. And I'm not necessarily thinking we're adding to any penalty here; we're adding protection.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Senator Alexander.

SENATOR ALEXANDER:

The fact that I would be isolated - segregated - which sometimes is a sentence of the court in conclusion <sic> with a sentence, is segregating me, and putting an extra burden on me

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with regards to my sentencing, which is not the judgment of the court.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Senator Watson.

SENATOR WATSON:

Well, it's segregation within the -- within the facility. It's not a form of punishment. We're not talking about isolating these people. We're just saying segregate them.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

All right. Further discussion? Senator Schaffer.

SENATOR SCHAFFER:

I am -- sometimes am amazed on this issue - the ebb and flow of some of the thought patterns. What about the person who gets sent to one of our prisons for five years that doesn't, you know, have AIDS? They got sent there for stealing a car, and got five years in the slammer, and is attacked and gets AIDS. That's a death penalty. Don't we have a right to protect those people? I think if they've been sentenced, they should do their time. That person for stealing that car should do five years, but I don't want to give them the death sentence. I think we have an obligation to protect those people. And the only way I know to protect them is to identify the AIDS carriers - and it's a high -- a much higher percentage in prison than it is out on the streets - and see that the AIDS carriers get appropriate medical care, and those that don't have it, are protected. I don't want to see our prisons turn into a hotbed of spreading AIDS, and then turn 'em back on the streets to spread it in the general population. I don't think we can stick our head in the sand. I know the Department doesn't like this. It's a problem they'd like to ignore. Can we ignore it?

PRESIDENT ROCK:

All right. Further discussion? Senator Watson, you wish to

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close?

SENATOR WATSON:

Yes. Thank you. Well, I appreciate the previous remarks. It was well said. I think really, as I said before, the only two things we can do is identify and educate, and this is a process by which we're trying to identify. We're testing a high-risk population. We talk about premarital testing, and how low risk it is. This is a high-risk group. Statistics have proven that. One thing that hasn't been mentioned here that I hear from the people in my area, because I have three prisons in -- in my immediate area - two within my district and one just outside of it - and it is the employees, the protection of the employees from -- from the people who possibly could be infected with the HIV virus. It's not only the inmates we're concerned with, but the employees. And I think identification is an important part of that process, and that's why this amendment should be adopted. I move for its adoption.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

All right. Senator Watson has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 2 to House Bill 1878. Those in favor will vote Aye. Opposed will vote Nay, and the voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, there are 44 Ayes, 12 Nays, 1 voting Present. Amendment No. 2 is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Amendment No. 3 offered by Senator Watson.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Senator Watson, on Amendment No. 3.

SENATOR WATSON:

I'd like to withdraw the rest of the amendments.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Withdraw. Madam Secretary, any further amendments?

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SECRETARY HAWKER:

No further amendments.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

3rd Reading. 1888. Senator Zito. Read the bill, Madam Secretary, please.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 1888.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Senator Zito offers Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Senator Zito, on Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR ZITO:

Thank you, Mr. President and Members of the Senate. Floor Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 1888 is issued or given to me by the Department, and basically, what it will do is further clarify House Bill 1888. 1888 is the bill, as some of you will remember, that prohibits and makes it unlawful for any restaurant to list particular food products that are not actually served. I'd be happy to answer any questions, but would move for the adoption.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

All right. Senator Zito has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 1888. Discussion? Senator Jacobs.

SENATOR JACOBS:

Thank you, Mr. President. For those of you who haven't really looked at this amendment, this is one of the better amendments, and one of the better bills that I have seen down here. You know, you get tired of going into restaurants and getting turkey loaf when you order turkey. And I think this is a good amendment, and

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ask for your support.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Further discussion? Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY:

Well, I -- thank you, Mr. President. I -- I've got an opposite view on this. I think Senator Zito is very well-intentioned on what's he trying to do. And he's really trying to attack those restaurants that are -- I don't know whether I'd use the word "affluent," but the ones that are overcharging for a product which is not a true product. My concern is that there are little restaurateurs around the State, many of them right in Springfield. And I guess maybe it's a good thing this came up on Thursday, because the Wayne's Red Coach Inn up on North Grand Avenue offers a lobster -- a double lobster tail - and I think it's something like under ten dollars - every Thursday night. And you want to tell me that - and that there's a lot of senior citizens that go in there - that we're going to tell them that they're going to have to amend their -- their menu to call it a shellfish dinner? Now, I want them to have this. I think if it applied to Cook County, especially to some of those -- a lot of those restaurants up in Cook County in Chicago that overcharge for an inferior product, I'd be for it. But I -- I think it's a bad amendment, and I oppose it.

This bill is designed for things like if you go into a restaurant and order crab legs, very often you don't get crab legs; you get those -- those kind of composite - whatever-they-are things - mock crab legs, and this way we have truth-in-menuing or something.

Senator Zito's moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 1888. Discussion? If not, all in favor, indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment's adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No further amendments.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

3rd Reading. 1890. Senator Luft. On the Order of House Bills 2nd Reading is House Bill 1890. Read the bill.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 1890.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

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PRESIDENT ROCK:

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

3rd Reading. 1899. Senator Berman. On the Order of House Bills 2nd Reading is House Bill 1899. Read the bill.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

Thank you very much, Mr. President and Members of the Senate. This amendment authorizes the issuance of forty million dollars of bonds for the purpose of environmental quality work.

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Specifically, it would allow the park district to issue bonds up to an amount which would not exceed a quarter of one percent of the assessed valuation of all taxable property, for a work which would protect the public and employees from -- from environmental hazards. That's what the amendment does.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Senator Marovitz has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 2160. Discussion? If not, all in favor, indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment's adopted. Are there further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Amendment No. 2 offered by Senator Fawell.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Senator Fawell.

SENATOR FAWELL:

Thank you very much. Basically what this amendment does is it stops the tax on the tax for anybody who -- any park district that has a fee.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Senator Fawell has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 2 to House Bill 2160. Discussion? If not, all in favor, indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment's adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No further amendments.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

3rd Reading. 2174. Senator Zito. Read the bill, Madam Secretary. You don't want that one. 2183. Senator Topinka. Read -- read the bill, Madam Secretary, please.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 2196.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. The Committee on Insurance, Pensions and Licensed Activities offers Committee Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Senator Zito, on Committee Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR ZITO:

Thank you, Mr. President and Members. I have -- 1-9-6 is the -- there's two amendments. I'm trying to figure out which one is which. Amendment 1-9 -- the last three digits -- 1-9-6 would require that in a -- in a group-to-group consolidation, the premium for the new policy is based on the -- on the old one. I'd be happy to answer any questions. Would move -- would move for its adoption.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

All right. That's Amendment No. 2 the Chair informs me. What's Amendment No. 1?

SENATOR ZITO:

Okay. Well, consider that for the explanation of Amendment No. 2. Amendment No. 1 would delete the exemption from unfair discrimination provisions for the group-to-group consolidations, and I would move for its adoption.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

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All right. Senator Zito's moved the adoption of Committee Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 2196. Discussion? If not, all in favor, indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment's adopted. Are there further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

Committee Amendment No. 2.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Senator Zito, on Committee Amendment No. 2.

SENATOR ZITO:

Well, the explanation I gave earlier. I move -- would move for its adoption.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Senator Zito moves the adoption of Committee Amendment No. 2 to House Bill 2196. Discussion? If not, all in favor, indicate by saying Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The amendment's adopted. Are there further amendments?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No further amendments.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

3rd Reading. 2201. Senator D'Arco. Read the bill, Madam Secretary, please.

SECRETARY HAWKER:

House Bill 2201.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd Reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY HAWKER:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

3rd Reading. All right, Ladies and Gentlemen - as I'm sure you're aware - this is the deadline for consideration by committee

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of appropriation bills. The chairman has informed the Chair that there are a couple of agencies yet remaining to be heard. In an effort to afford everybody the opportunity to listen to those agencies who is a member of Appropriations I, I think it behooves us to quit now and allow those folks to go to committee, so that they don't have to be there all night. Senator Carroll.

SENATOR CARROLL:

Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. The Senate Appropriations I Committee will reconvene in five minutes after adjournment in Room 212. We'd ask everybody to be there as quickly as possible. There are still probably about a half a dozen bills in there, and we will expedite the hearing. Assuming we have the bodies present, we should be able to move fairly quickly. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

All right. Senator Hudson.

SENATOR HUDSON:

Thank you, Mr. President. A request of the Body, if I might, or of the Chair, or whatever's appropriate - relevant to the sponsorship of a Senate bill here. A change of sponsorship.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

Sure. State your point.

SENATOR HUDSON:

The point is that House Bill 2758, of which I -- Hudson is now -- the sponsor would be changed to read Keats - Hudson.

PRESIDENT ROCK:

All right. The Gentleman seeks leave to show Senator Keats as the chief sponsor of House Bill 2758. Without objection, leave is granted. All right, Ladies and Gentlemen, we will convene at nine o'clock tomorrow morning. The Secretary informs me there are a number of Members who have indicated they have bills they wish to recall for purposes of an amendment. We will do that and finish

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up what we can on 2nd Reading, and will be -- we will conclude our business no later than noon tomorrow. So we'll be here from nine until noon, but we do have a number of bills yet to be moved. All right. If there's no further business to come before the Senate, Senate Appropriations I will meet at 4:15 in Room 212. The Senate will stand adjourned until Friday, June 16th.
